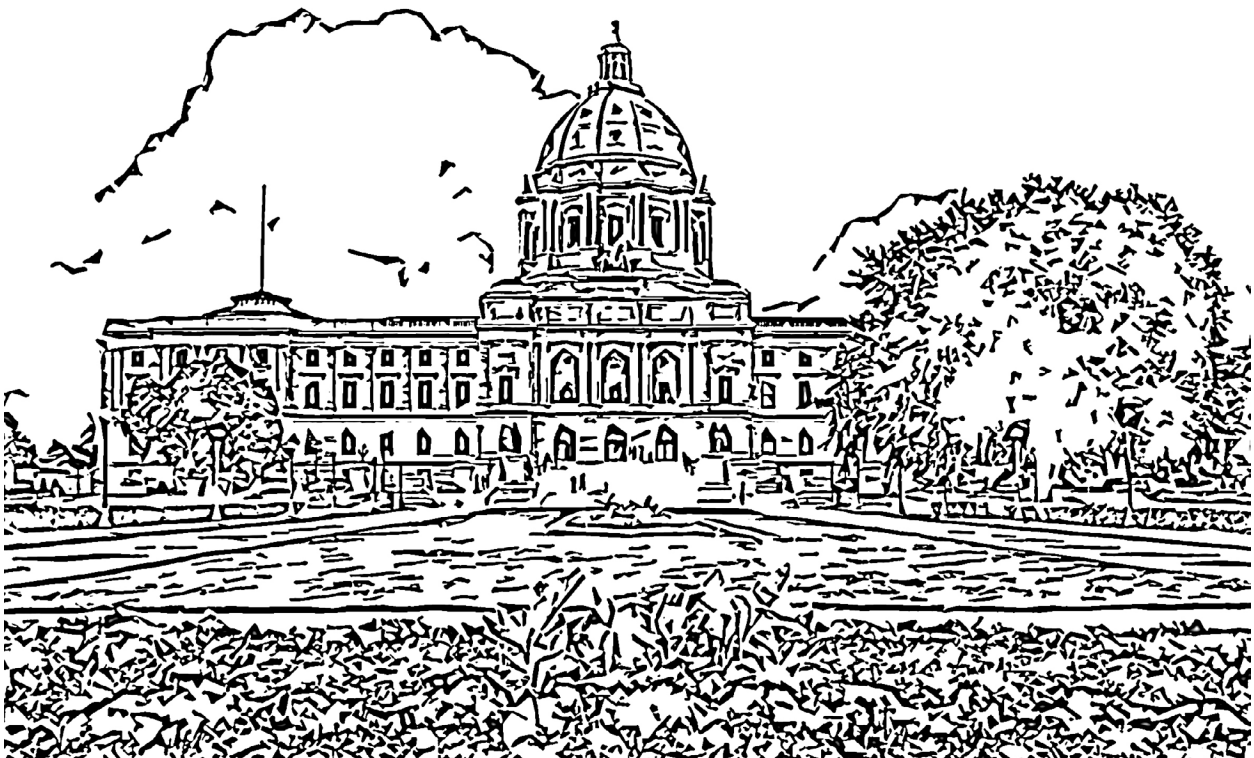

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

The rules proposed and published at State Register, Volume 50, Number 18, pages 449-451, November 3, 2025 (50 SR 449), are adopted as proposed.

Expedited Rules

The Minnesota Legislature allows for some agencies to use an expedited rulemaking process. Expedited rulemaking allows state agencies to adopt, amend or repeal rules faster than the standard process, generally without a public hearing. The agency must publish notice of the proposed rule in the *State Register* and must mail the notice by United States mail or electronic mail to persons who have registered with the agency to receive mailed notices (*Minnesota Statutes* §14.389). There must be a 30-day comment period after the notice is published in the *State Register*.

Before publication of the final rule in the *State Register*, the agency must submit the rule to an administrative law judge in the Court of Administrative Hearings. The administrative law judge shall within 14 days approve or disapprove the rule as to its legality and its form to the extent the form relates to legality. If the final rule is approved by the administrative law judge, it can then be published in the *State Register*. The rule is effective upon publication in the *State Register* (*Minnesota Statutes* §14.389).

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Division of Resource Management and Assistance Adopted Expedited Permanent Rules Relating to Waste Management Capital Assistance Program; Order Adopting Rules

Adoption of Rules Relating to the Solid Waste Capital Assistance Program, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 9210; Revisor's ID Number 4815, CAH Docket Number 25-9003-41308

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Expedited Rules

1. The Pollution Control Agency has complied with all notice and procedural requirements in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, Minnesota Rules, chapter 1400, and other applicable law.
2. The Court of Administrative Hearings received 1 written comment on the rules.
3. By Laws of Minnesota 2023, chapter 60, article 3, sections 9 to 13, the Minnesota Legislature requires the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency to make the following rule changes:
 - Increases the total amount of grant assistance for a project from \$2,000,000 to \$5,000,000.
 - Expands the applicable types of projects funded by the program to develop feasible and prudent alternatives to disposal, including reuse, recycling, composting source-separated compostable materials or yard waste, and resource recovery.
 - Expands application requirements for funding by the program.
4. The use of the expedited rulemaking process for these rules is authorized by Laws of Minnesota 2024, chapter 116, article 2, section 1, subsection 32. According to Minnesota Statutes, section 116.07, subdivisions 2 and 4, these changes incorporate specific changes stated in applicable statutes that require no interpretation of law.
5. Minnesota 2024, chapter 116, article 2, section 1, subsection 32, directs the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency, using the expedited rulemaking process in Minnesota Statutes, section 14.389, amend the rules related to the capital assistance program in Minnesota Rules, parts 9210.0100 to 9210.0180, to conform with and implement the changes made in Minnesota Statutes, sections 115A.03 and 115A.49 to 115A.54 by Laws 2023, chapter 60, article 3, sections 6 and 9 to 13.
6. The amendments to Chapter 9210.0130, Subpart 2 define changes the definition of eligible project to align with Minnesota Session Law.
7. The amendments to Chapter 9210.0130, Subpart 4 clarify existing standards for ineligible costs to the program.
8. The amendments to Chapter 9210.0131, 9210.0140, and 9210.150 define application standards to align with Minnesota Session Law.
9. The amendments to Chapter 9210.0170 reauthorize program limitations, including maximum grant award to specific types of projects, to align with Minnesota Session Law.
10. The rules are needed and reasonable.

The above-named rules, in the form published in the State Register on November 24, 2025, are adopted under my authority in Statutes, section Minnesota Rules, part 1400.2410, and the Administrative Procedure Act, Minnesota Statutes, section 14.389.

If more than five comments in opposition to the application are received during the comment period, or the OEMS denies the application, the applicant may immediately request a contested case hearing or may try to resolve the objections of the public and/or the OEMS within 30 days, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 144E.11, subdivision 5(a)(b). If the applicant is unable to resolve the objections within 30 days, or if the applicant initially requests a contested case hearing, one will be scheduled and notice of the hearing given pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 144E.11, subdivision 5(c)-(e).

Request for Comments for Possible Amendments to Rules Relating to Residential Lead Abatement, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 4761; Revisor's ID Number R-4993

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Health requests comments on its possible rule amendments governing residential lead abatement. MDH is considering rule amendments that lower the dust-lead hazard standards from 10 micrograms per square foot ($\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$) for floors and 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window sills to any reportable level for both floors and window sills. MDH is also considering rule amendments that lower the dust-lead clearance levels from 10 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for floors, 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window sills, and 400 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window troughs to dust-lead action levels of five $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for floors, 40 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window sills, and 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window troughs. Additional amendments could include newly required language in lead abatement reports and references to more recent American Society for Testing and Materials documents. These changes are consistent with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) final rule 89 FR 89456,

effective January 13, 2025 (<https://www.federalregister.gov/documents/2024/11/12/2024-25070/reconsideration-of-the-dust-lead-hazard-standards-and-dust-lead-post-abatement-clearance-levels>).

As time allows, the Department may consider other amendments that come up but only as time permits. States that administer residential lead abatement programs funded by EPA must update their rules within two years of the effective date of the final EPA DLHS and DLCL rules.

Persons Affected. The amendments to the rules would likely affect lead-based paint activities, accredited training programs, engineering services, lead or dust sampling technicians, other lead abatement professionals who must be certified to conduct lead-based paint activities, or rehabilitations or maintenance activities conducted in properties affected by the residential lead abatement rules (i.e., for all residences, including residences also used for a commercial purpose, child care facilities, playgrounds, and schools.). Testing laboratories that are recognized by EPA's National Lead Laboratory Accreditation Program may also be affected. Finally, this change would also impact tenants, property owners, and managers of residential buildings and dwellings.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9508, subdivisions 1 and 2, authorize the Department to adopt rules for regulated lead work standards and for lead in paint, dust, drinking water, and soil in a manner that protects public health and the environment for all residences, including residences also used for a commercial purpose, childcare facilities, playgrounds, and schools.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until 4:30 p.m. on June 22, 2026. The Department will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Department does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible amendments.

If the cost of compliance will exceed \$25,000 for a business or small city within the first year of the rules taking effect or if you have any feedback regarding the cumulative effect of complying with these rules with other federal and state regulations, as required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131(8), MDH is interested in those comments as well.

This public comment opportunity is associated with the development of possible rules amendments. Comments received in response to this notice will not be included in the formal rulemaking record submitted to the Administrative Law Judge if and when a proceeding to adopt rules is started. The Department is required to submit to the judge only those written comments received in response to the rules after they are proposed. If you submit comments during the development of the rules and you want to ensure that the Administrative Law Judge reviews the comments, you must resubmit the comments after the rules are formally proposed.

Rules Drafts. The Department has not yet drafted the possible rule amendments.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Notice of Proposed Changes Affecting Recreational Trails within the Zumbro Bottoms Management Unit of the Richard J. Dorer Memorial Hardwood State Forest

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is considering changes to designated recreational trails within the Zumbro Bottoms Management Unit of the Richard J. Dorer Memorial Hardwood State Forest in Wabasha County.

The proposed changes include new designations where alignments are sustainable and historically used and undesignation of certain unused or unsustainable existing trail segments.

The Richard J. Dorer Memorial Hardwood State Forest is classified as “limited.” A limited classification means motor vehicles, including off-highway vehicles, may operate only on forest roads and trails designated open to their use. The DNR does not propose to change the forest classification. The Zumbro Bottoms Management Unit does not include any designated off-highway vehicle trails.

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.19, subdivision 2 governs designations of forest trails and changes to existing designations.

The DNR will hold a public meeting to provide information and receive public comments on the proposed changes. The meeting is scheduled for June 25, 2026, from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM at the Wabasha-Kellogg Public School, 2113 Hiawatha Drive NE, Wabasha, MN 55981.

Requirements: There are no statutes or rules requiring contracts to be advertised for any specific length of time, but the Office of State Procurement strongly recommends meeting the following requirements: \$0 - \$5000 does not need to be advertised; \$5,000 - \$25,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least seven calendar days; \$25,000 - \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least 14 calendar days; and anything above \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a minimum of at least 21 calendar days.
