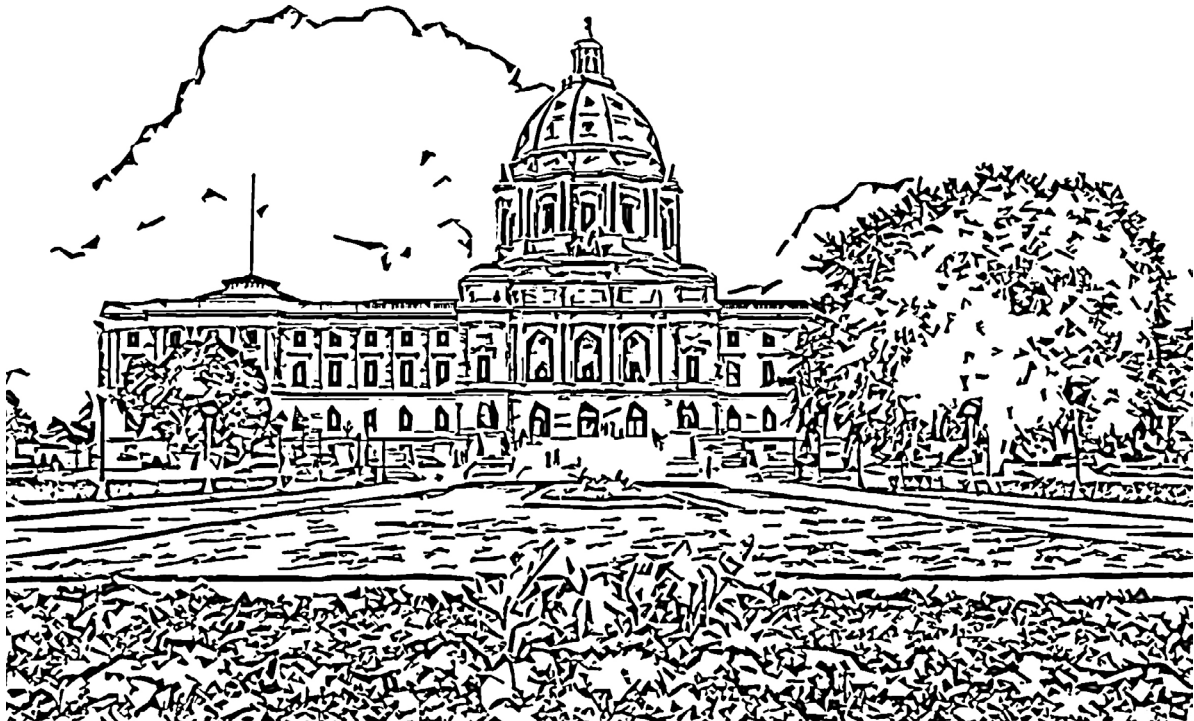

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Proposed Rules

Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Minnesota Board of Marriage and Family Therapy Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without a Public Hearing

Proposed Permanent Rules Modifying Licensure Qualifications and Procedures, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 5300.0100 to 5300.0355, and repeal of parts 5300.0100, subpart 7, 5300.0150, 5300.0160, subpart 1, 5300.0175, 5300.0180, 5300.0190, 5300.0230, 5300.0240, subparts 2 and 7, 5300.0320, subpart 8, and 5300.0330, subparts 3 and 4; Revisor’s ID Number RD-4834

Introduction. The Minnesota Board of Marriage and Family Therapy intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Court of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You may submit written comments and/or a written request that a hearing be held on the proposed rules until **4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2026**.

Subject of Rules. The proposed rule revisions are necessary to reflect changes to LAMFT (Licensed Associate Marriage and Family Therapist) and LMFT (Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist) licensure processes, including the state jurisprudence exam requirement, and to expand allowable post-degree supervision options for applicants, streamline the application, licensure, and examination processes, and update continuing education and ethical practice requirements.

Statutory Authority. The statutory authority to adopt these rules is Minn. Stat. Secs. 148B.31 and 214.06, which

authorize the Board to adopt rules necessary to administer and enforce Minn. Stat. Secs. 148B.06 to 148B.392 (the Marriage and Family Therapy Practice Act), and to set forth procedures and information required for renewal. Because the Board is not relying on statutory authority recently granted or expanded, Minn. Stat. Sec. 14.125 does not apply.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The statement of need and reasonableness (SONAR) contains a summary of the justification for the proposed rules, a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules, and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. You may review or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person. You may also view the SONAR at: <https://mn.gov/boards/marriage-and-family/>.

Public Comment. You have until **4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2026**, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules.

Your comment must be in writing and received by the due date. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change you propose. Any comments that you have about the legality of the proposed rules must be made during this comment period. All evidence that you present should relate to the proposed rules. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the agency encourages you to participate.

Submit written comments to the agency contact person listed above.

All comments or responses received are public data and will be available for review on the Agency's website at <https://mn.gov/boards/marriage-and-family/>.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the agency hold a public hearing on the rules. You must make your request for a public hearing in writing by **4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2026**. You must include your name and address in your written request for hearing. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the agency will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number of persons withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to bring about the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If the agency is required to hold a public hearing, it will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Modifications. The agency may modify the proposed rules as a result of public comment. It must support modifications by data and views submitted during the public comment process. The adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules unless the agency follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the *State Register*, the agency will publish a notice of adoption in the *State Register*. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the *State Register*, the agency must publish a copy of the changes in the *State Register*.

Adoption and Review of Rules. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The agency will submit the rules and supporting documents to the Court of Administrative Hearings for a legal review. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want to receive notice of this, to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Department of Commerce Notice of Minnesota Consumer Credit Code and Regulated Loan Act Adjustment of Dollar Amounts

Dollar amounts indexed in the Regulated Loan Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 56, and the Minnesota Consumer Credit Code, *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 47.59, will increase effective July 1, 2026. *Minnesota Statutes*, Sections 47.59, subdivision 3(i), and 56.131, subdivision 4, provide for periodic adjustment in dollar amounts, effective on July 1 of even-numbered years, based on a percentage change in the Implicit Price Deflator for the Gross Domestic Product.

Statute establishes that the percentage change in the reference base index be 10% or more in order to adjust the dollar amounts. The portion of the percentage change in the index in excess of a multiple of ten percent is to be

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disregarded, and the dollar amounts shall change only in multiples of ten percent. Information provided by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis indicates a percentage change from the revised reference base to be 10% calculated to the nearest whole percentage point as required. The index for December 2011 is the reference base index for adjustments. The index was revised nationally to 2009 = 100. The index was again revised nationally to 2012 = 100. The rebased index for December 2011 is 91.985, increasing to 130.651 in December 2025, for a change of 42%.

Department of Commerce Notice of Restrictions on Deficiency Judgments, Minnesota Property Exemption and Minnesota Homestead Exemption Adjustment of Dollar Amounts

The amount of a deficiency judgment found in Minnesota Statutes, Section 325G.22, property exempt from creditor collection action in Minnesota Statutes, Section 550.37, and the homestead exemption in Minnesota Statutes, Section 510.02 will increase effective July 1, 2026. These statutes require that the dollar amounts be adjusted in even numbered years based on a percentage change in the Implicit Price Deflator for the Gross Domestic Product.

Statute establishes that the percentage of change from the reference base index be 10% or more in order to adjust the

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dollar amounts (*See Minnesota Statutes, Section 550.37, subd. 4a*). The portion of the percentage change in the index in excess of a multiple of ten percent is to be disregarded, and dollar amounts shall change only in multiples of ten percent. Information obtained from the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis, indicates the percentage change from the revised reference base to be 42% calculated to the nearest whole percentage point as required. The index for December 2011 is the reference base index for adjustments. The index was revised nationally to 2009 = 100. The index was again revised nationally to 2012 = 100. The rebased index for December 2011 is 91.985, increasing to 130.651 in December 2025, for a change of 42%.

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Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) Notice of Public Hearing by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development with Respect to a Proposed Project and the Provision of Funds from the Minnesota Job Creation Fund Program under Minnesota Statutes 116J.8748

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (“DEED”) will conduct a public hearing on Wednesday, May 13, 2026, at 1:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible at 180 East Fifth Street, 12th Floor, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101 on one (1) proposal to provide funding through the Minnesota Job Creation Fund Program (“JCF”) pursuant to authority granted under *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.8748 and *Minnesota Rules* Chapter 4301. This hearing is conducted in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.994, Subd. 5.

Description of Project and Proposed JCF Funding:

rms Company (NAICS 332721) is looking to expand in Coon Rapids (Anoka County), Minnesota. rms Company is a contract manufacturer to the medical device industry and is a trusted supplier to many of the world’s largest medical device manufacturers. The proposed project would expand the current facility by 20,000 square feet for machinery and equipment. The total project cost is \$10,400,000 with \$6,752,472.22 being eligible for the capital investment rebate for site improvements and new construction, which would be rebated up to 5%. Costs ineligible for rebate include machinery and equipment, as well as any costs associated with a loan from the City of Coon Rapids. rsm Company expects to create 75 jobs within the first two (2) years at an average cash wage of \$26.60 per hour. The state is considering further participation with \$600,000 via the Minnesota Investment Fund, which would be forgivable if certain job and investment goals are met. The City of Coon Rapids is considering a forgivable loan in the amount of \$100,000 for new construction. The project may be eligible for a job creation award of up to \$470,000 and a capital investment rebate of up to \$330,000 depending on final project specifications, for a total of \$800,000 from the Minnesota Job Creation Fund.

Request for Proposals for Minnesota Solar on Public Buildings Program

The Minnesota Department of Commerce seeks proposals for the Minnesota Solar on Public Buildings Program.

In 2023 the Minnesota Legislature established the Solar on Public Buildings (SPB) Grant Program (*Minn. Stat. § 216C.377*). The purpose of this program is to provide grants to stimulate the installation of solar energy systems on or adjacent to public buildings. The Department of Commerce will administer \$650,000 in grants to local governments in Xcel Energy electric service territory. This is the fifth round of funding requests.

Eligible applicants for this grant are local units of government owning and operating public buildings. This includes a county, city, town, or other local government jurisdiction, federally recognized Indian Tribes in Minnesota, excluding school districts eligible to receive financial assistance under the Solar for Schools program (*Minn.
