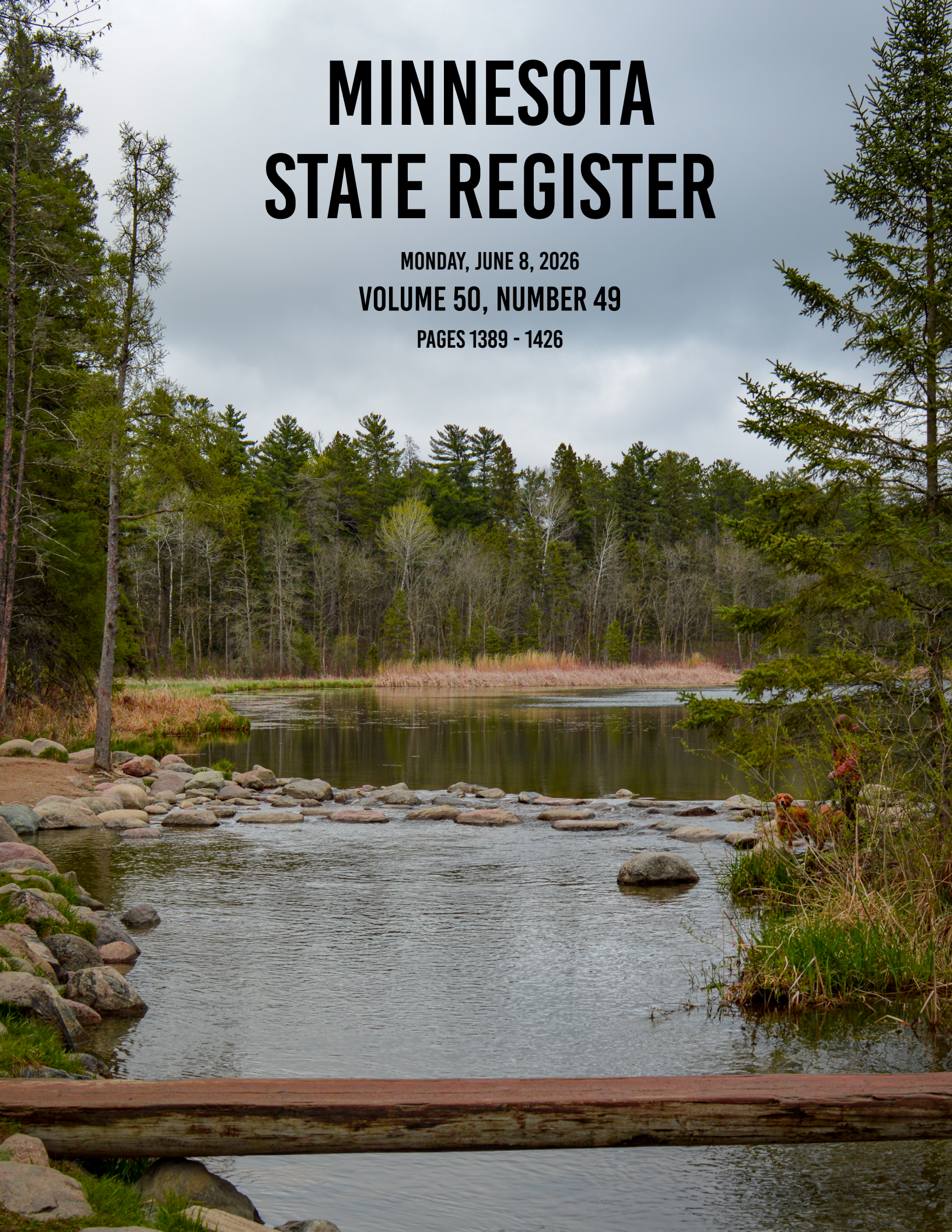

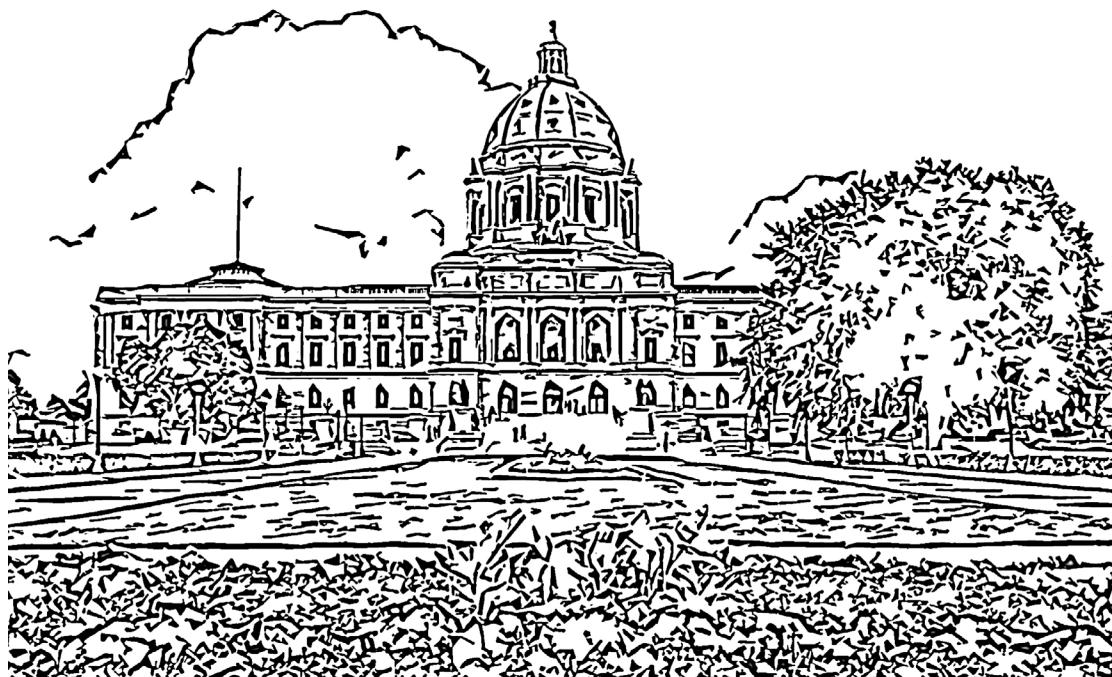

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Minnesota Environmental Quality Board Adopted Exempt Permanent Rules Relating to Scoping Documents for Environmental Review

Adopted Exempt Permanent Rules Relating to the Environmental Review program, governing scoping of mandatory Environmental Impact Statements, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 4410, Revisor’s ID Number R-4978, CAH Docket Number 21-9008-41465

In 2025, the Legislature required the Minnesota Environmental Quality Board (EQB) to adopt amendments to rules governing the environmental review program in Minn. R., ch. 4410. (Minn. Laws 2025, 1st Spec. Sess., Chapter 1, Article 6, Sec. 5 (a)).

The legislation authorized the EQB to use the Good Cause Exempt rulemaking process under Minn. Stat. § 14.388, subdivision 1, clause (3) to make these changes. (Minn. Laws 2025, 1st Spec. Sess., Chapter 1, Article 6, Sec. 5 (b)).

The Legislature required the EQB to amend Minnesota Rules, part 4410.2100, the rule governing the scoping process for an environmental impact statement (EIS) in cases where an EIS is mandatory. The Legislature required amendment of the rule “to provide that an environmental assessment worksheet does not need to be prepared for a project that falls within a mandatory environmental impact statement category under Minnesota Rules, part 4410.4400, or other applicable law.”

The Legislature also required the EQB to amend Minn. Rules, part 4410.2100 “to provide that a scoping process undertaken under Minnesota Rules, part 4410.2100, for a project that falls within a mandatory environmental impact statement category must be completed no later than 280 days after publication of the notice of availability of a scoping document in the EQB Monitor.”

The EQB has complied with all notice and procedural requirements in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, Minnesota

Rules, chapter 1400, and other applicable law, that are applicable to Good Cause Exempt rules under Minn. Stat. § 14.388.

The EQB adopted the above-named rules, in the form submitted to the Court of Administrative Hearings (CAH) on May 5, 2026 and approved by the CAH on May 11, 2026, on May 12, 2026. A copy of the rules appears below.

4410.0200 DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS.

Subp. 24. **Environmental assessment worksheet.** “Environmental assessment worksheet” means a brief document which is designed to set out the basic facts necessary to determine whether an EIS is required for a proposed project ~~or to~~ and may initiate the scoping process for an EIS.

Subp. 77a. **Scoping document.** “Scoping document” means a brief document containing information about a proposed project that is necessary for the EIS scoping process under part 4410.2100. A scoping document can be an EAW or a different document containing the information necessary for the scoping process.

4410.1000 PROJECTS REQUIRING EAW.

Subpart 1. **Purpose of EAW.** The EAW is a brief document prepared in worksheet format which is designed to rapidly assess the environmental effects which may be associated with a proposed project. The EAW ~~serves primarily to:~~

- A. ~~aid~~ aids in the determination of whether an EIS is needed for a proposed project; and
- B. may serve as a basis to begin the scoping process for an EIS.

Subp. 2. **Mandatory EAW categories.** An EAW shall be prepared for any project that meets or exceeds the thresholds of any of the EAW categories listed in part 4410.4300 ~~or any of the EIS categories listed in part 4410.4400.~~

4410.2100 EIS SCOPING PROCESS.

Subp. 2. ~~EAW as~~ **Scoping document.**

A. All projects requiring an EIS must have ~~an EAW~~ a scoping document filed with the RGU. ~~The An EAW shall be the basis for the~~ may serve as a scoping process document.

B. For projects ~~which that~~ fall within a mandatory EIS category or where an EIS is mandated by other applicable law, an EAW or a scoping document may serve as the basis of the scoping process. If a voluntary EIS is planned, ~~the~~ an EAW will must be used ~~solely~~ as a scoping document. ~~For such projects,~~ The RGU shall prepare and circulate with the EAW or scoping document, when allowed, a draft scoping decision document that addresses the contents specified by subpart 6 to the extent that information is already available. The purpose of the draft scoping decision document is to facilitate the delineation of issues and analyses to be contained in the EIS. The information in a draft scoping decision document shall be considered as preliminary and subject to revision based on the entire record of the scoping process.

Exempt Rules

C. If the need for an EIS has not been determined, the EAW will have two functions:

A: (1) to identify the need for preparing an EIS pursuant to part 4410.1700; and

B: (2) to initiate discussion concerning the scope of the EIS if an EIS is ordered pursuant to part 4410.1700.

Subp. 3. **Scoping period.** If the EIS is being prepared pursuant to part 4410.2000, subpart 2 or 3, item B, the following schedule applies:

A. The 30-day scoping period will begin when the notice of the availability of the EAW or scoping document is published in accord with part 4410.1500, items A ~~and B~~ to C. This notice and press release shall include the time, place, and date of the scoping meeting.

B. The RGU shall provide the opportunity for at least one scoping meeting during the scoping period. This meeting shall be held not less than 15 days after publication of the notice of availability of the EAW or scoping document. All meetings shall be open to the public.

C. A final scoping decision shall be issued within 15 days after the close of the 30-day scoping period and, for an EIS being prepared under part 4410.2000, subpart 2, no later than 280 days after publication of the notice of availability of a scoping document in the EQB Monitor.

Subp. 5. **Procedure for scoping.** Written comments suggesting issues for scoping or commenting on the EAW scoping document must be filed with the RGU during the scoping period. Interested persons may attend the scoping meeting to exercise their right to comment.

Governmental units and other persons shall be responsible for participating in the scoping process within the time limits and in the manner prescribed in parts 4410.0200 to 4410.6500.

4410.2800 DETERMINATION OF ADEQUACY.

Subp. 1a. **Decision by EQB; information needs.** If the EQB will be determining the adequacy of the EIS, the RGU shall submit to the EQB the following information within five days of the filing of the final EIS:

A. evidence of compliance with distribution requirements for the scoping EAW document, draft EIS, and final EIS;

Subp. 4. **Variance.** Construction may begin on a project if the proposer applies for and is granted a variance from subparts 1 and 2. A variance for certain governmental approvals to be granted prior to completion of the environmental review process may also be requested. A variance may be requested at any time after the commencement of the 30-day review period following the filing of an EAW or a scoping document, when allowed under part 4410.2100, subpart 2. The proposer shall submit an application for a variance to the EQB together with:

4410.6200 DETERMINING EIS COST.

Subpart 1. **EIS cost inclusions.** In determining the reasonable cost of preparing, reviewing, and distributing the EIS, the following items shall be included:

4410.6500 PAYING EIS COST.

Subpart 1. **Schedule of payments.** The proposer shall make all cash payments to the RGU according to the following schedule:

A. The proposer shall pay the RGU for the full cost estimated by the RGU to be necessary for the scoping of the EIS not later than the date of submission by the proposer of the completed data portions of the scoping EAW document or within five days of issuance of a positive declaration. The RGU shall not proceed with the scoping process until this payment is made. Upon issuance of the scoping decision, the RGU shall provide the proposer with a written accounting of the scoping expenditures. If the payment made by the proposer exceeds the expenditures, the balance shall be credited against the cash payments required from the proposer for preparation of the draft EIS. If the RGU's reasonable expenditures for scoping exceed the cash payment received, the proposer shall pay the balance before the RGU commences preparation of the draft EIS.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2026 Elk Season

Notice is hereby given that the above-entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13(b). The statutory authority for the content of the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 84.027, subdivision 13(a)(1), (b); 97A.045, subdivision 11; 97A.433, subdivisions 1, 2; 97A.535; 97B.515, subdivision 2; and 97B.516.

Expedited Emergency Rules

The following conditions do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459: Elk population surveys are conducted annually, weather permitting. The data are used to maintain sustainable elk populations in keeping with the agency's elk management plan and statutory population limits. The data also inform season dates, open areas, hunter orientation requirements, and license quotas.

The emergency rule is also necessitated by the continuing effort to monitor elk for existing and emerging cervid diseases as required by the 2016-2019 Interim Strategic Plan for Elk. The requirement that harvested elk be presented for biological sampling is necessary for detecting and controlling transmissible wildlife diseases such as bovine tuberculosis, chronic wasting disease, and other diseases.

6232.4300 SEASONS 2026 SEASON DATES AND OPEN AREAS QUOTAS FOR TAKING ELK.

[For text of subpart 1, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 1a. **Season dates.** Licensed hunters may take elk during the following 2026 seasons:

- A. season A either sex: September 12 to 20;
- B. season B antlerless: September 12 to 20;
- C. season C either sex: September 12 to 20;
- D. season D antlerless: September 12 to 20;
- E. season E either sex: September 12 to 20;
- F. season F antlerless: September 12 to 20; and
- G. season G antlerless: September 26 to October 4.

Subp. 2. Open areas.

A. A license for the Grygla Elk ~~zones~~ Zone is valid for taking elk within the ~~Primary Grygla elk zone~~ prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 1, ~~and the Secondary Grygla Elk Zone as described in part 6232.4600, subpart 2.~~

C. A license for the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone is valid for taking elk in the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 4.

Subp. 3. **Quotas.** The number of available licenses for the 2026 elk-hunting season is two in the Grygla Elk Zone, three in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone, and seven in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone, distributed as follows:

- A. season A: up to one license in the Grygla Elk Zone valid for either-sex elk;
- B. season B: up to one license in the Grygla Elk Zone valid for antlerless elk;
- C. season C: up to one license in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for either-sex elk;

- D. season D: up to two licenses in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for antlerless elk;
- E. season E: up to one license in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for either-sex elk;
- F. season F: up to two licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for antlerless elk; and
- G. season G: up to four licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for antlerless elk.

6232.4400 GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR TAKING ELK.

Subp. 7. **Orientation required.** A successful applicant may only obtain an elk license by attending an orientation session at the Thief Lake Wildlife Management Area headquarters a location designated by the commissioner of natural resources.

Subp. 8. **Registration.** Within 24 hours of taking an elk, a person must present the elk for mandatory biological sampling and register the elk in person at an elk-registration station designated by the commissioner of natural resources.

6232.4500 ELK LICENSE APPLICATION PROCEDURE.

Subpart 1. **General provisions.** The provisions in this part apply to the elk license application process.

A. If the number of applications for any zone and season exceeds the quota, a random selection will be conducted to determine the successful applicants.

D. The application deadline is ~~the Friday nearest July 15~~ Tuesday, July 7, 2026.

Twenty percent of the total available licenses for the year will be allocated to this group of applicants. At least five total licenses must be offered across all zones for this drawing procedure to be valid.

B. The second, discretionary, selection process for qualified landowner applicants may occur for up to 20 percent of licenses available in any zone where there are at least five licenses offered.

C. The third selection process will be a random drawing from a pool consisting of general drawing applicants, plus any ten-year history applicants or qualified landowner applicants who were not drawn during the previous selection processes. This drawing process will be used to distribute any available and remaining licenses that are offered in the Grygla, Kittson County Central, and Kittson County Northeast Elk Zones.

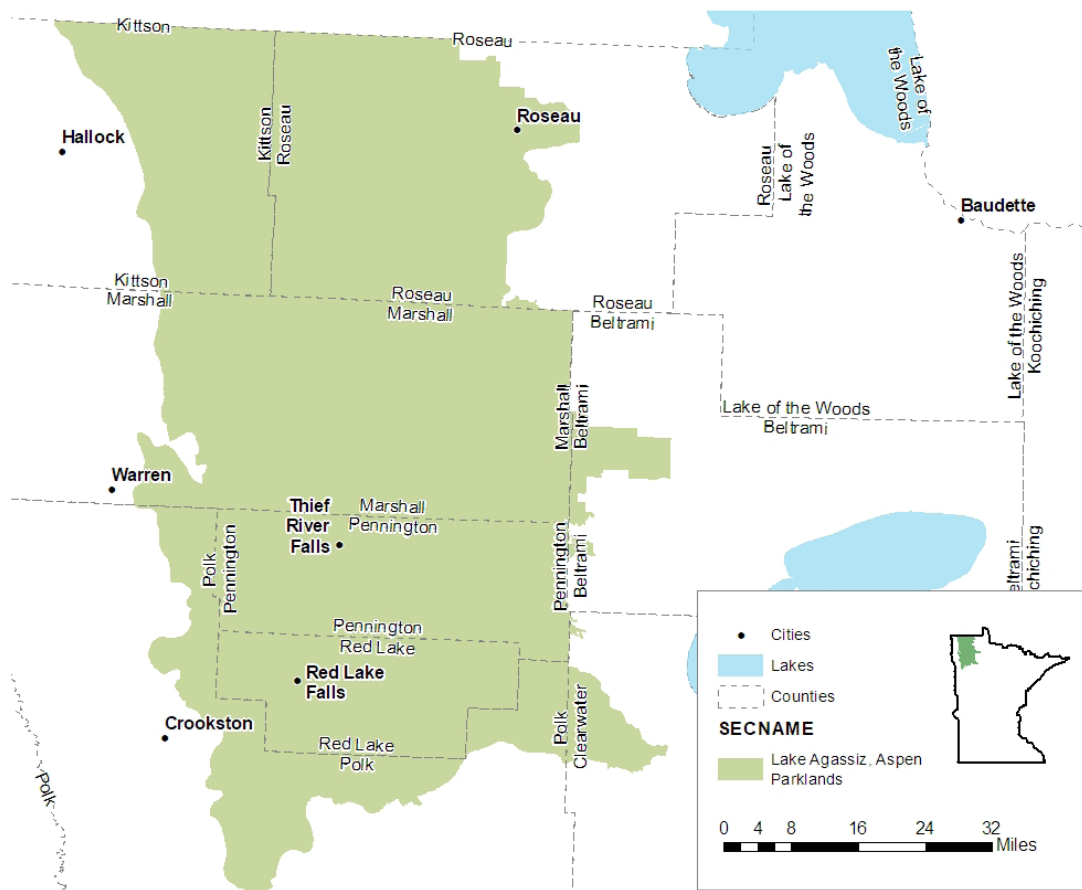

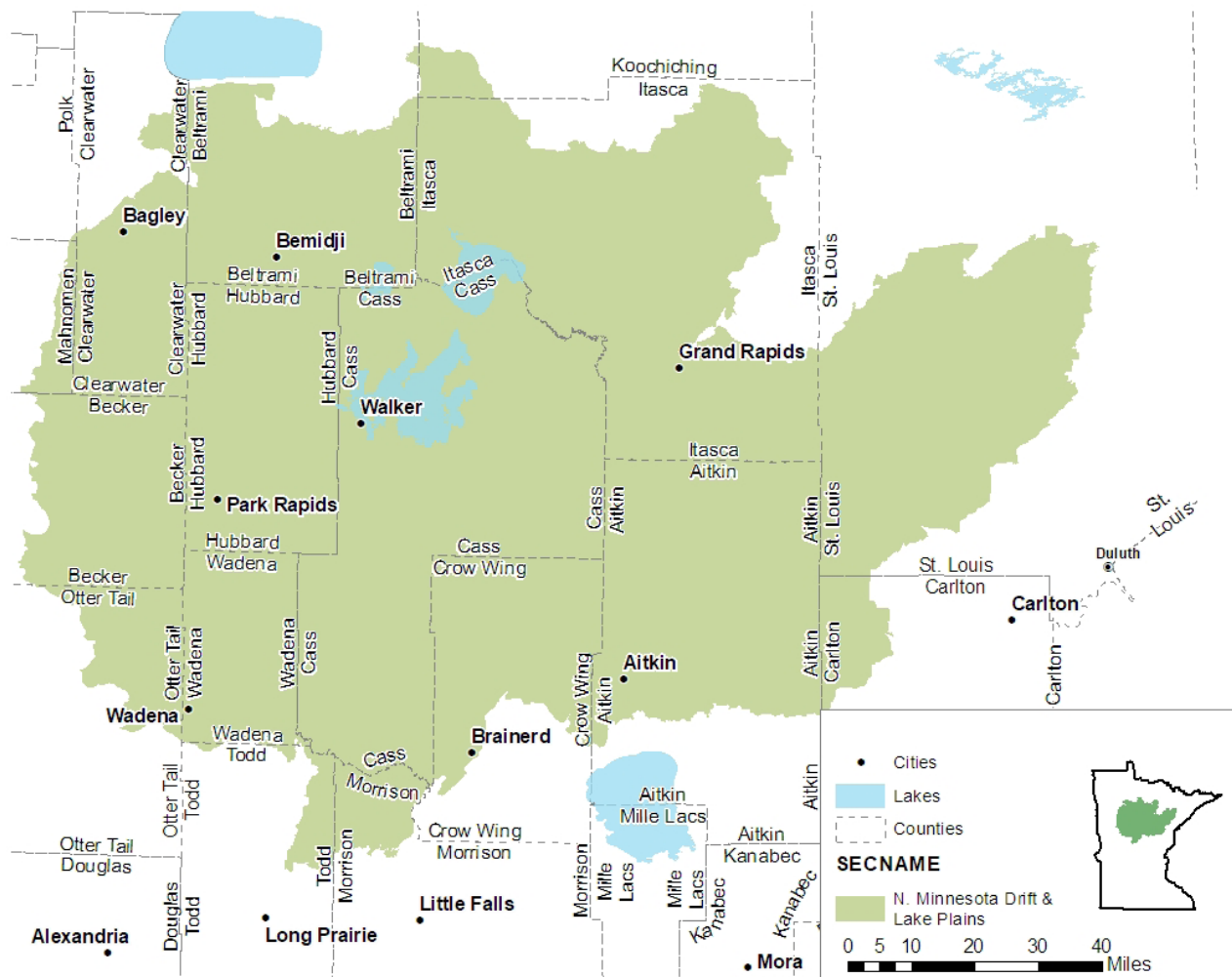

- The Paleozoic Plateau Section Forest Resource Management Plan supersedes the Blufflands Rochester Plateau Subsection Forest Resource Management Plan.

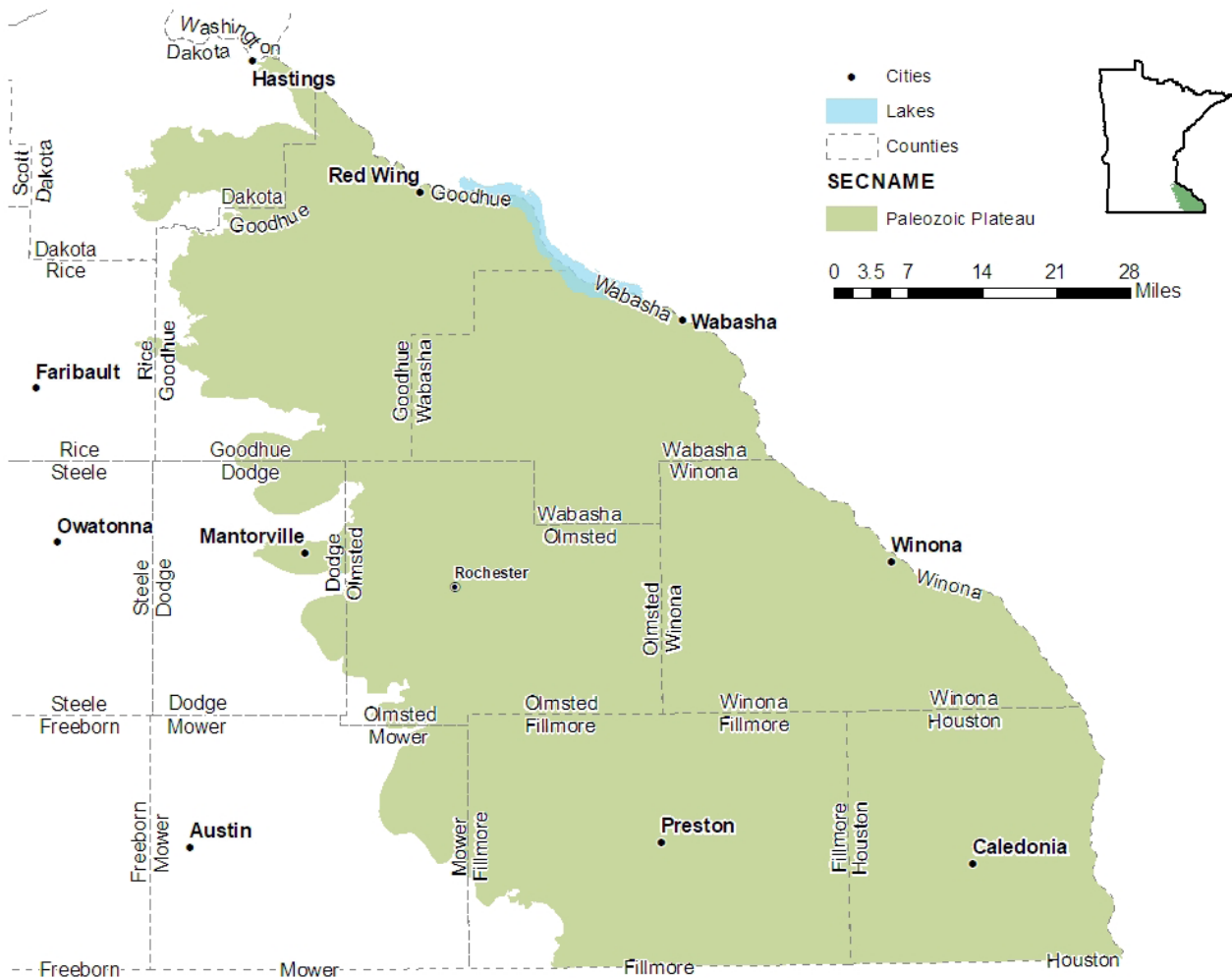

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Commissioner's Order – Approving the Unit Forest Resource Plan for the Western Superior Uplands Ecological Section

Date: May 14, 2026

Statutory authority: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 89.012

Supersedes:

- Commissioner's Order approving the Mille Lacs Uplands Subsection Forest Resource Management Plan (effective May 3, 2007)

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS:

Minnesota Statutes, Section 89.012 requires the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to adopt a unit forest resource plan “consistent with the forest resources management policy and plan” for each geographical administrative unit that is an appropriate unit of the state forest system for forest resources planning; and

The unit forest resource plan must identify specific management goals and objectives for the forest resource planning unit, including “protection, development, and production of forest resources in the administrative unit.” Unit plans are to be, “integrated with other uses not managed under the multiple use, sustained yield principals and policies when those uses have been authorized and approved according to law” (Minn. Stat. § 89.012); and

The unit forest resource plan cannot be implemented until approved by the commissioner by written order published in the State Register (Minn. Stat. § 89.012); and

The commissioner has determined ecological section to be an appropriate ecological and geographic administrative unit for forest resource planning within the meaning of Minn. Stat. § 89.012; and

The Minnesota DNR solicited and received written comments and submissions regarding the proposed vegetation management of state-managed forest lands within the Western Superior Uplands and Southern Superior Uplands ecological sections and considered those comments in completing the forest resource unit plan for the Western Superior Uplands and Southern Superior Uplands ecological sections; and

All notice and procedural requirements in *Minnesota Statutes* and other applicable rules and law have been complied with; and

The DNR has completed preparation of a unit forest resource plan titled the “Western Superior Uplands Section Forest Resource Management Plan” for state-managed forest lands in portions of Aitkin, Benton, Carlton, Chisago, Crow Wing, Isanti, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Sherburne, St. Louis, and Washington Counties, and all of Kanabec and Pine Counties, in accordance with the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 89.012; and

The Western Superior Uplands Section Forest Resource Management Plan is both needed and reasonable.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to authority vested in me by law, including *Minnesota Statutes*, section 89.012, that:

1. The Western Superior Uplands Section Forest Resource Management Plan is approved as a unit forest resource plan under Minn. Stat. § 89.012 for implementation on state-managed forest lands in the Western Superior

Uplands ecological section spanning portions of Aitkin, Benton, Carlton, Chisago, Crow Wing, Isanti, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Sherburne, St. Louis, and Washington Counties, and all of Kanabec and Pine Counties, in east-central Minnesota (see *Exhibit A*, attached hereto and incorporated herein).

2. The Western Superior Uplands Section Forest Resource Management Plan supersedes the Mille Lacs Uplands Subsection Forest Resource Management Plan.

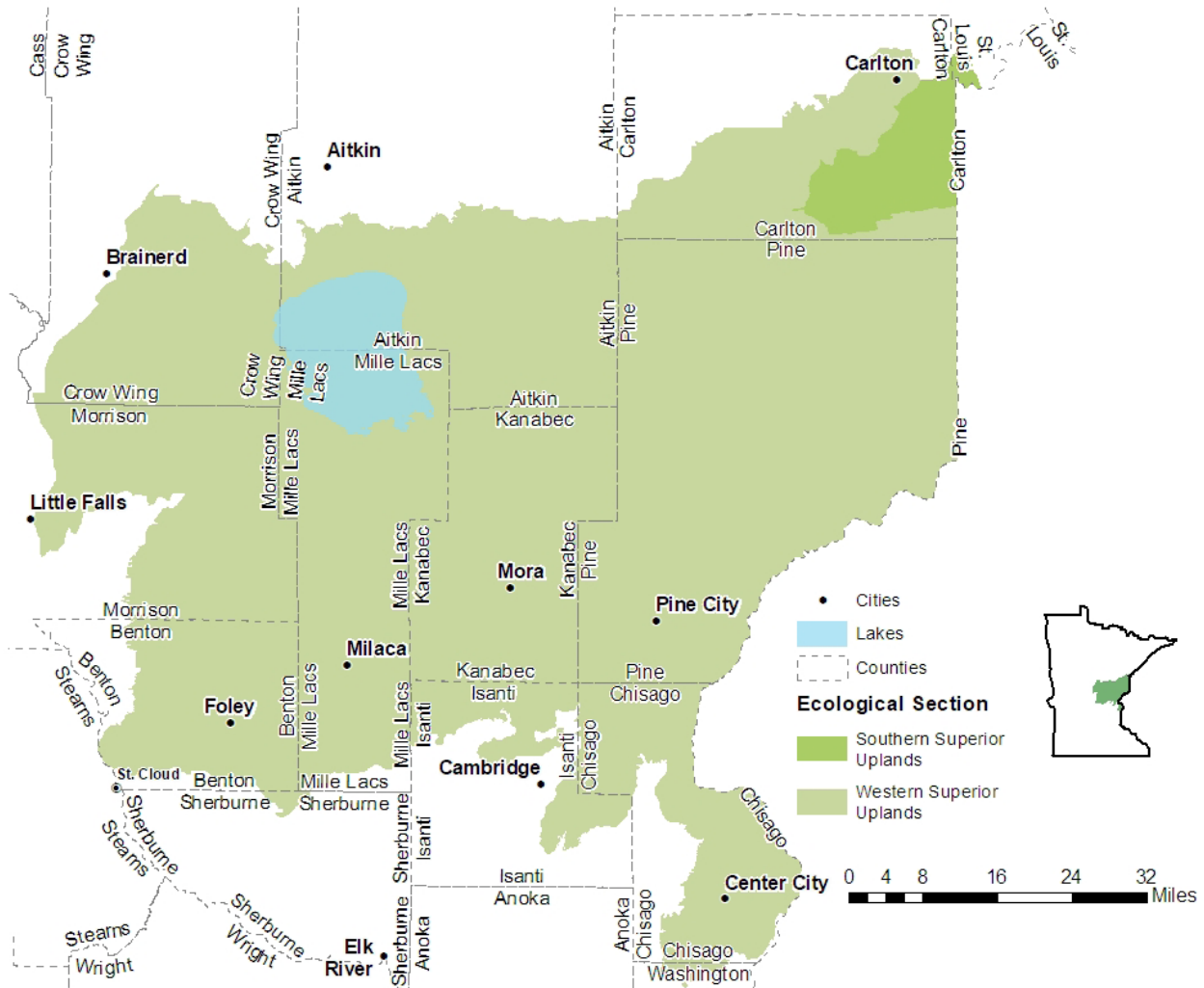

Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT)

Revision 1 to the 11th Edition of the Minnesota Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices – Order No. 101556

Minnesota Statutes § 169.06, subd. 1, requires the Commissioner of Transportation to adopt a manual and specifications for a uniform system of traffic control devices for use on Minnesota streets and highways. The National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), approved by the Federal Highway Administration under 23 CFR 655.603, is the national standard for traffic control devices, and State MUTCDs must remain in substantial conformance with it.

Having previously adopted the 11th Edition of the Minnesota Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MN MUTCD), the Commissioner now exercises this authority to adopt Revision 1, which has been developed to maintain substantial conformance with the National MUTCD.

Revision 1 incorporates:

- Applicable national updates from the 11th Edition of the National MUTCD with Revision 1 incorporated;
- Minnesota-specific corrections; and
- Additional changes approved by a multi-agency committee.
