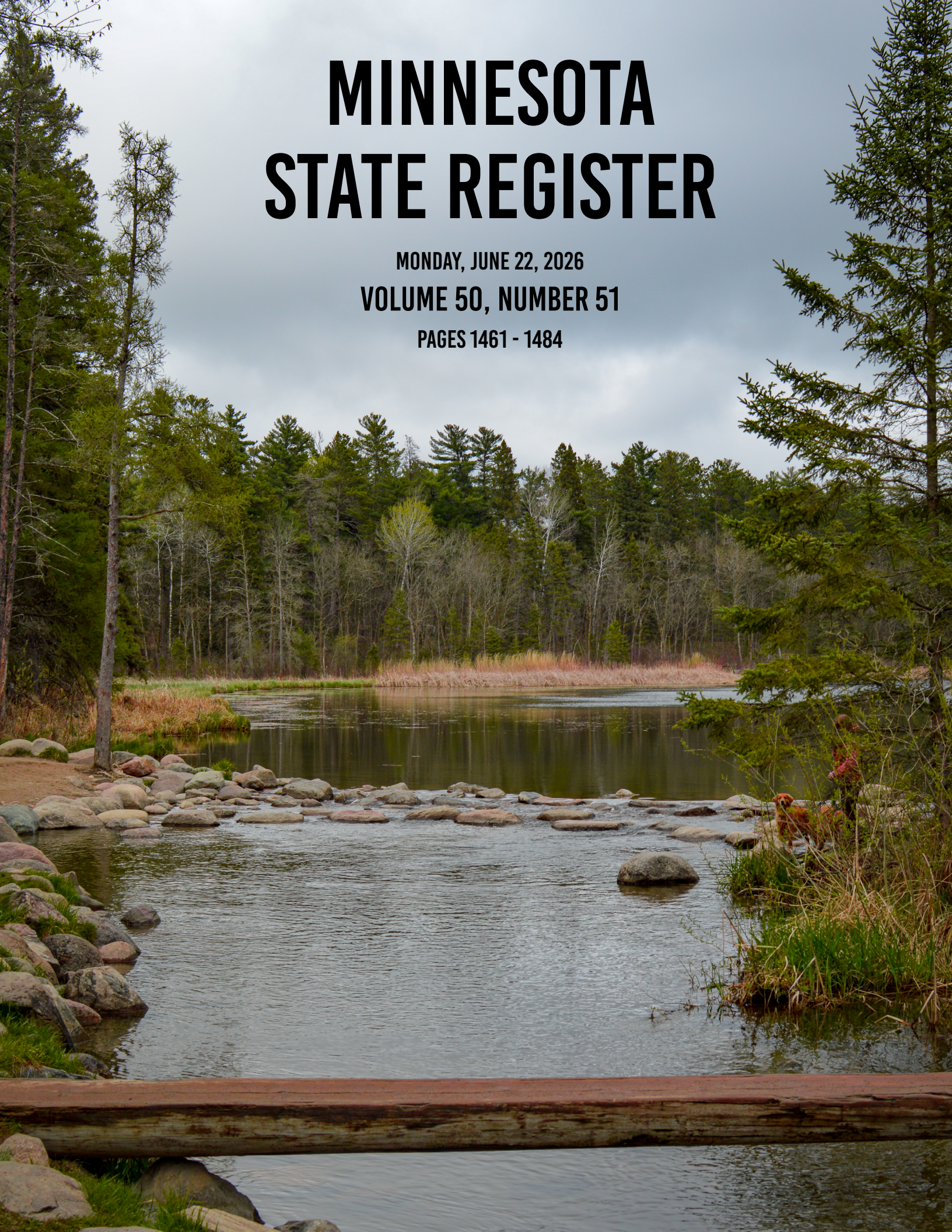

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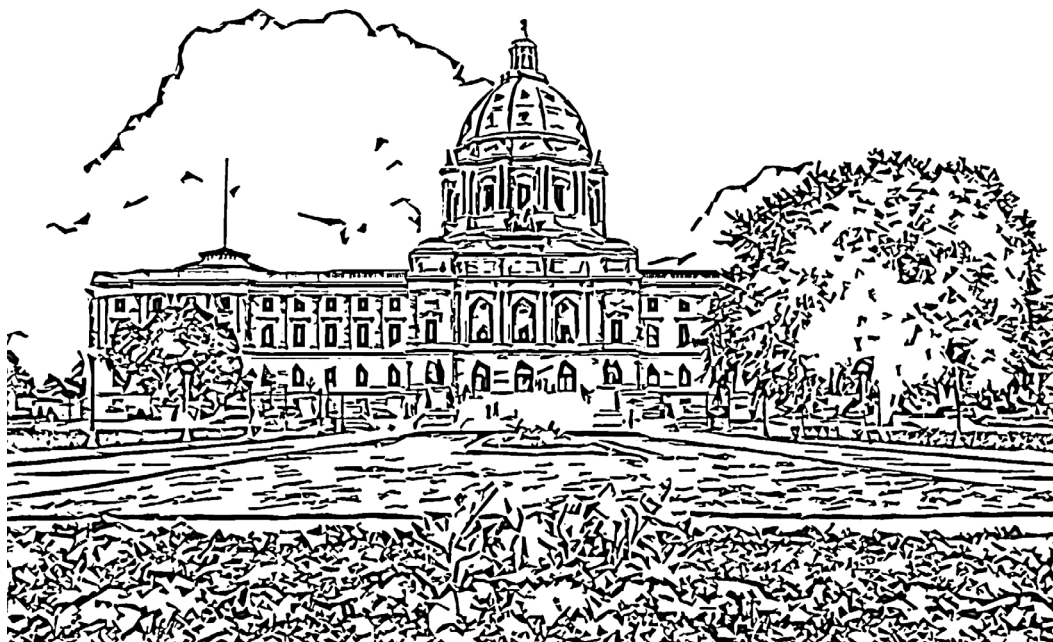

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Lawful Gambling; Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without a Public Hearing

Proposed Rules and Rule Amendments Relating to Organization Fund Loss Applications, CEO Education, Merchandise Prizes, and Interpretation of Minn. Stat. § 340.166. *Minnesota Rules*, 7861.0235, 7861.0260, subps. 2 and 4, 7861.0320, subp. 9, 7861.0330, subp. 3 and 7861.0340, subp. 3; Revisor’s ID Number R-04966.

Introduction. The Minnesota Gambling Control Board intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Court of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You may submit written comments and/or a written request that a hearing be held on the proposed rules until **4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 7, 2026**.

Subject of Rules. The subjects of these proposed rules include: 1) Profit Carryover Adjustment Requests in instances of organizational fund loss 2) CEO Education, 3) the GCB Interpretation of Minn. Stat. § 349.166 and 4) Cash Substitutions for Merchandise Prizes.

Statutory Authority. The GCB’s statutory authority to adopt the rules is stated in *Minnesota Statutes* section 349.151, subdivision 13, which provides: “the [Gambling Control Board] may adopt, amend, or repeal rules under Chapter 14, when necessary or proper in discharging the [Gambling Control Board]’s powers and duties.”

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Further, the GCB's enumerated powers and duties include "mak[ing] rules authorized by [Chapter 349]". *Minnesota Statutes*, section 349.151, subdivision 4(a)(5).

Delegated Authority. On September 15, 2025, the Minnesota Gambling Control Board executed its Resolution to Propose Rules relevant to the present rulemaking. In this Resolution, the Board stated:

"Laura Wade, the Executive Director of the Minnesota Gambling Control Board, is authorized and directed to sign and to give the Board's Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules with any modifications approved by the Board."

Publication of proposed rules. A copy of the proposed rules is to be published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed. The proposed rules may be viewed at: <https://mn.gov/gcb/regulations/rules.jsp>

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The statement of need and reasonableness (SONAR) contains a summary of the justification for the proposed rules, a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules, and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. You may review or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person. The SONAR may also be viewed at: <https://mn.gov/gcb/regulations/rules.jsp>.

Public Comment. You have until **4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 7, 2026** to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules.

Your comment must be in writing and received by the due date. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change you propose. Any comments that you have about the legality of the proposed rules must be made during this comment period. All evidence that you present should relate to the proposed rules. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the agency encourages you to participate.

Submit written comments via the *Court of Administrative Hearings Rulemaking eComments website* (<https://mn.gov/oah/forms-and-filing/ecommments/>), by U.S. Mail delivered to the Court of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, P.O. Box 64620, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55164-0620, or by fax (651) 539-0310.

All comments or responses received are public data and will be available for review on the eComments website.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the agency hold a public hearing on the rules. You must make your request for a public hearing in writing by **4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 7, 2026**. You must include your name and address in your written request for hearing. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the agency will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number of persons withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to bring about the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If the agency is required to hold a public hearing, it will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Modifications. The agency may modify the proposed rules as a result of public comment. It must support modifications by data and views submitted during the public comment process. The adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules unless the agency follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the *State Register*, the agency will publish a notice of adoption in the *State Register*. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the *State*

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Register, the agency must publish a copy of the changes in the *State Register*.

Adoption and Review of Rules. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The agency will submit the rules and supporting documents to the Court of Administrative Hearings for a legal review. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want to receive notice of this, to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A, requires each lobbyist to register with the State Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. 7861.0235 CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER.

Subpart 1. **Training of chief executive officer.** The chief executive officer of an organization conducting lawful gambling must receive educational training in laws and rules governing lawful gambling within 90 days of taking office unless the chief executive officer is subject to the gambling manager seminar requirement specified under part 7861.0220, subpart 2, item A. The chief executive officer must receive continuing education training in laws and rules governing lawful gambling at least once during each calendar year. The curriculum for training required by this subpart must be administered by board staff or by a third party approved by the board to provide the training.

Subp. 2. **Curriculum.** The curriculum must cover elements of lawful gambling law and rules that the board determines are necessary for a chief executive officer to know and understand in order to successfully manage gambling operations for an organization.

7861.0260 CONDUCT OF LAWFUL GAMBLING.

Subp. 2. Posting of information and house rules.

A. A licensed organization must prominently post the following information at each permitted premises in an area visible to players before they purchase a chance to participate in lawful gambling:

A: (1) organization name, license number, and premises permit number;

B: (2) notice of problem gambling information that must at a minimum include the toll-free telephone number established by the commissioner of human services;

C: (3) statement that illegal gambling is prohibited; and

D: (4) house rules that include at a minimum the policies governing the conduct of lawful gambling at the premises, including any restrictions in addition to those imposed by Minnesota Statutes, section 349.181, on who may not participate in the conduct of lawful gambling at the premises. The house rules must be adequately lighted, legible, and at least 11 inches by 17 inches; and

E: B. For the conduct of bingo, the information required by this subpart may be contained in the bingo program

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as an alternative to posting the information.

C. In the case of the gambling event awarding a merchandise prize with an option for a winner to choose cash or a cash equivalent, information required by this subpart must be expressly communicated to any participant prior to the sale of any chance and meet the prize requirements of Minnesota Statutes, section 349.173, paragraph (a).

Subp. 4. Prizes awarded; records required.

C. A prize must consist of cash, merchandise, certificates for merchandise, certificates for services, gift certificates, or gift cards with the following exceptions and restrictions:

(1) prizes must not consist of lawful gambling equipment;

~~(2) cash must not be substituted for merchandise prizes, certificates for services, gift certificates, or gift cards which have been won. This does not apply to multiple bingo winners for a merchandise prize that cannot be divided;~~

~~(3)~~ (2) coupons redeemable for bingo hard cards, bingo paper sheets, bingo paper sheet packets, bingo paper packages, and the use of an electronic bingo device may be awarded for bingo;

~~(4)~~ (3) a certificate for merchandise or services must contain:

(a) a complete description, including the value of the merchandise or services to be redeemed by the certificate;

(b) the vendor's name from whom the certificate must be redeemed; and

(c) a statement expressly prohibiting the substitution of cash or another type of merchandise or services for the merchandise or services described on the certificate;

~~(5)~~ (4) for a paddlewheel game played with a table, only cash prizes may be awarded and must be awarded and redeemed through the use of chips; and

~~(6)~~ (5) for a paddlewheel game played without a table, a cash prize amount may not be a variable multiple of the standard price of a paddlewheel ticket.

G. Merchandise prizes must be displayed in full view of the players in the immediate vicinity of the game ~~and must not be redeemed for cash or converted into cash.~~ When the winner of a merchandise prize is determined, the organization must immediately remove the prize from the display and award it to the winner. This requirement does not apply to raffles.

7861.0320 ORGANIZATION OPERATIONS, ACCOUNTS, REPORTS, AND RECORDS.

Subp. 9. **Fund loss report or request for a profit carryover adjustment due to fund loss.** When an organization has a fund loss by questionable means of its inventory or cash, including prizes paid from a game not conducted in compliance with statute and rule, the organization must use the following procedures.

B. The organization must submit one of the following to the board within ~~60~~ 90 days of discovering the loss:

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[For text of subitem (1), see Minnesota Rules]

(2) a request for a profit carryover adjustment due to a fund loss. If the organization does not submit the request within 60 90 days of discovering the loss, the board will not consider the request.

[For text of items C and D, see Minnesota Rules]

E. The board must identify the relevant facts used to determine that the organization failed to meet the procedural requirements of items A to C or that the organization failed to establish adequate internal controls as listed in item D.

E. F. If the board denies a request for a profit carryover adjustment due to a fund loss, the organization must reimburse its gambling account for the amount of the fund loss. The organization must submit proof of reimbursement to the board within 90 days of the board's final determination unless subject to the conditions of item H.

F. G. The board must reconsider a request for a profit carryover adjustment due to a fund loss when an organization presents new information that the organization could not have discovered before the board's initial consideration of the request.

H. Board staff may recommend whether to approve or deny the organization's request for a profit carryover adjustment, assessing the factors identified in item D, before the board approves or denies the request. If board staff recommends that the board deny the request, the staff must refer the request for a hearing to the compliance review group unless the recommendation originates from a failure to meet the requirements of item A or B. The compliance review group and the organization may enter into a consent order agreement regarding a resolution of the profit carryover adjustment. If no agreement is reached, the matter shall proceed before the board as specified in item D. The organization may choose to forego the hearing before the compliance review group in favor of a review of the request before the board.

7861.0330 EXCLUDED BINGO.

Subp. 3. **Licensure.** Organizations registered to conduct a bingo event under this part or to conduct a raffle under Minnesota Statutes, section 349.166, subdivision 1, paragraph (c), are permitted to apply for an organizational lawful gambling license under Minnesota Statutes, section 349.155, within the same calendar year as the lawful gambling event.

7861.0340 EXEMPTED LAWFUL GAMBLING.

Subp. 3. **Licensure.** Organizations registered to conduct an exempted lawful gambling event under this part are permitted to apply for an organizational lawful gambling license under Minnesota Statutes, section 349.155, within the same calendar year as the exempted lawful gambling event.

Expedited Rules

The Minnesota Legislature allows for some agencies to use an expedited rulemaking process. Expedited rulemaking allows state agencies to adopt, amend or repeal rules faster than the standard process, generally without a public hearing. The agency must publish notice of the proposed rule in the *State Register* and must mail the notice by United States mail or electronic mail to persons who have registered with the agency to receive mailed notices (*Minnesota Statutes §14.389*). There must be a 30-day comment period after the notice is published in the *State Register*.

Before publication of the final rule in the *State Register*, the agency must submit the rule to an administrative law judge in the Court of Administrative Hearings. The administrative law judge shall within 14 days approve or disapprove the rule as to its legality and its form to the extent the form relates to legality. If the final rule is approved by the administrative law judge, it can then be published in the *State Register*. The rule is effective upon publication in the *State Register* (*Minnesota Statutes §14.389*).

The rules proposed and published at State Register, Volume 50, Number 22, pages 519-521, December 01, 2025 (50 SR 519), are adopted as proposed.

Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB)

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS for Application to Add a New Commemorative Work on the State Capitol grounds: Gold Star Blue Star Memorial

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) requests comments on whether an application to add a new commemorative work on the Minnesota State Capitol meets **ALL** of the conditions in *Minnesota Rules 2400.2703, Subpart 2*. The memorial would honor Minnesota’s Gold Star and Blue Star families.

Subp. 2. **Conditions for adding new artwork.** The board must consider displaying new commemorative artwork in the Capitol area if the artwork meets all of the following conditions:

- A. there has been documented public support of the artwork;
- B. the artwork has lasting statewide significance for Minnesotans;
- C. the artwork is respectful of the diversity of Minnesotans;
- D. viewing the artwork provides a rich experience to broaden the understanding of Minnesota’s shared history,

- heritage, and culture;
- E. if an individual is the subject of an artwork, the individual must: [...].

Background

On October 7, 2025, CAAPB staff received an application from Cole Trace, Legislative Liaison for the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA), to add a new commemorative work on the State Capitol grounds honoring Minnesota's Gold Star and Blue Star families. CAAPB staff found the application complete on October 10, 2025. Gold Star families are those who lost an immediate family member in the line of duty while serving in the US military. Blue Star families are families that have an immediate family member serving on active duty in the US military.

On June 4, 2026, the CAAP Board authorized its staff to open a 30-day public comment period on the application's fulfillment of the conditions for addition listed above.

The addition request would likely affect the Court of Honor. The Court of Honor, which surrounds the World War II memorial, currently displays a range of bronze commemorative plaques. Statutory Authority

Minnesota Statute, 15B.01, gives the Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board the statutory authority to consider the application to propose addition of new commemorative works.

Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) REQUEST FOR COMMENTS for Application to modify a commemorative work on the State Capitol grounds: World War I Plaque

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) requests comments on whether a new application to modify the World War I plaque on the Minnesota State Capitol grounds meets **ONE OR MORE** of the conditions in *Minnesota Rules 2400.2703 Subpart 6*.

Subp. 6. **Conditions for modification or removal of an existing artwork.** The board must consider requests for the modification or removal of an existing commemorative artwork if one or more of the following conditions apply:

Official Notices

- A. there has been sustained, broad-based, and documented public objection to the artwork;
- B. the artwork conflicts with the guiding principles in subpart 1, item A;
- C. the artwork has faults in construction or requires maintenance such that the Department of Administration is unable to properly care for or store the artwork;
- D. the site for the artwork is no longer safely accessible to the public or is due to be demolished; or
- E. significant changes in the use, character, or design of the site require a re-evaluation of the relationship of the artwork to the site.

Background

On April 1, 2026, CAAPB staff received an application from Michael Maxa, Adjutant at the American Legion, to modify the World War I plaque at the Court of Honor on the Minnesota State Capitol grounds. CAAPB staff found the application complete on April 9, 2026. The Court of Honor, which surrounds the World War II memorial, displays a range of bronze commemorative plaques.

On June 4, 2026, the CAAP Board authorized its staff to open a 30-day public comment period to consider the application's fulfillment of the conditions for modification listed above.

The modification seeks to make the plaque's language more inclusive of US military service personnel from Minnesota who trained for, but never saw, combat during the First World War. 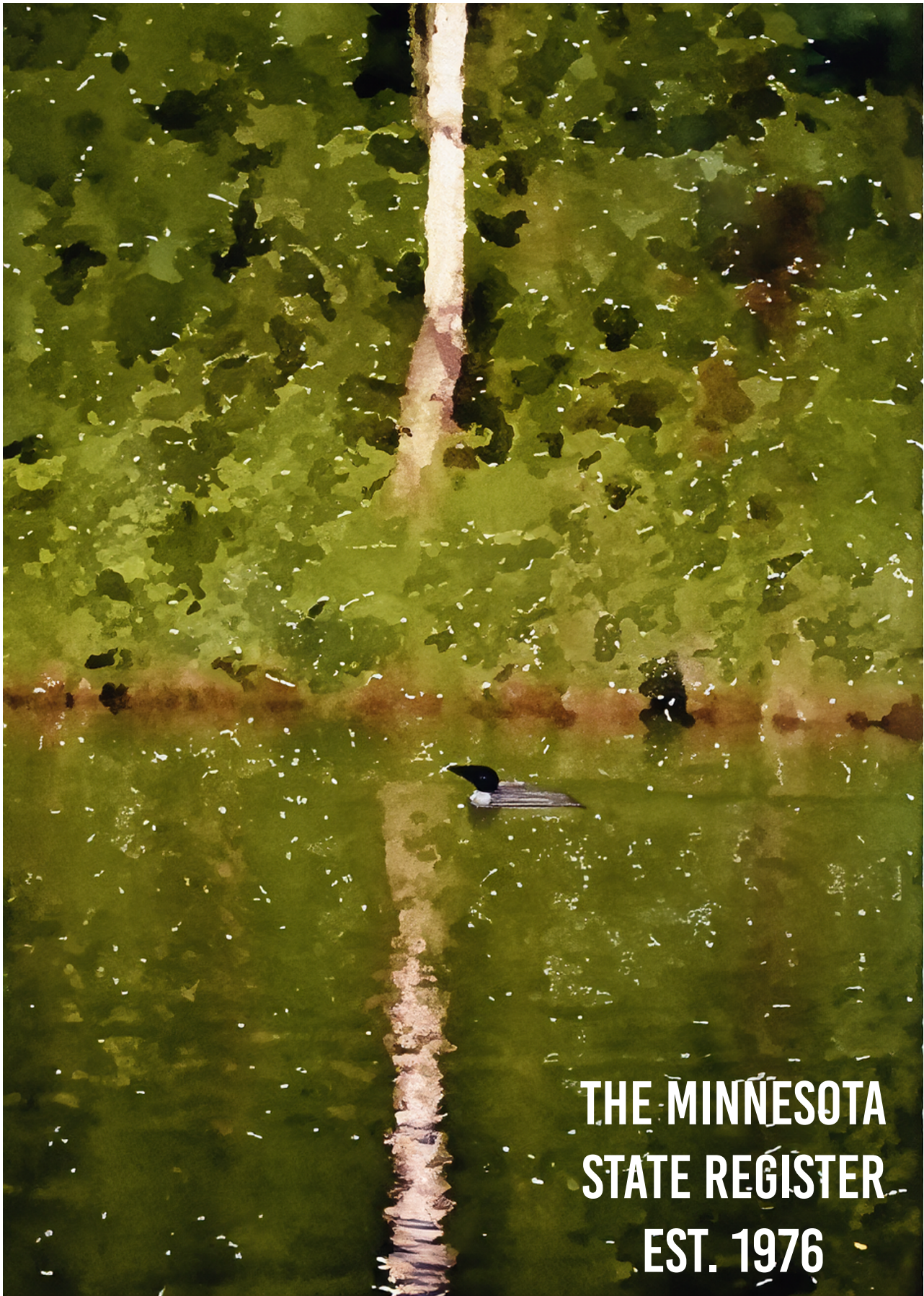
