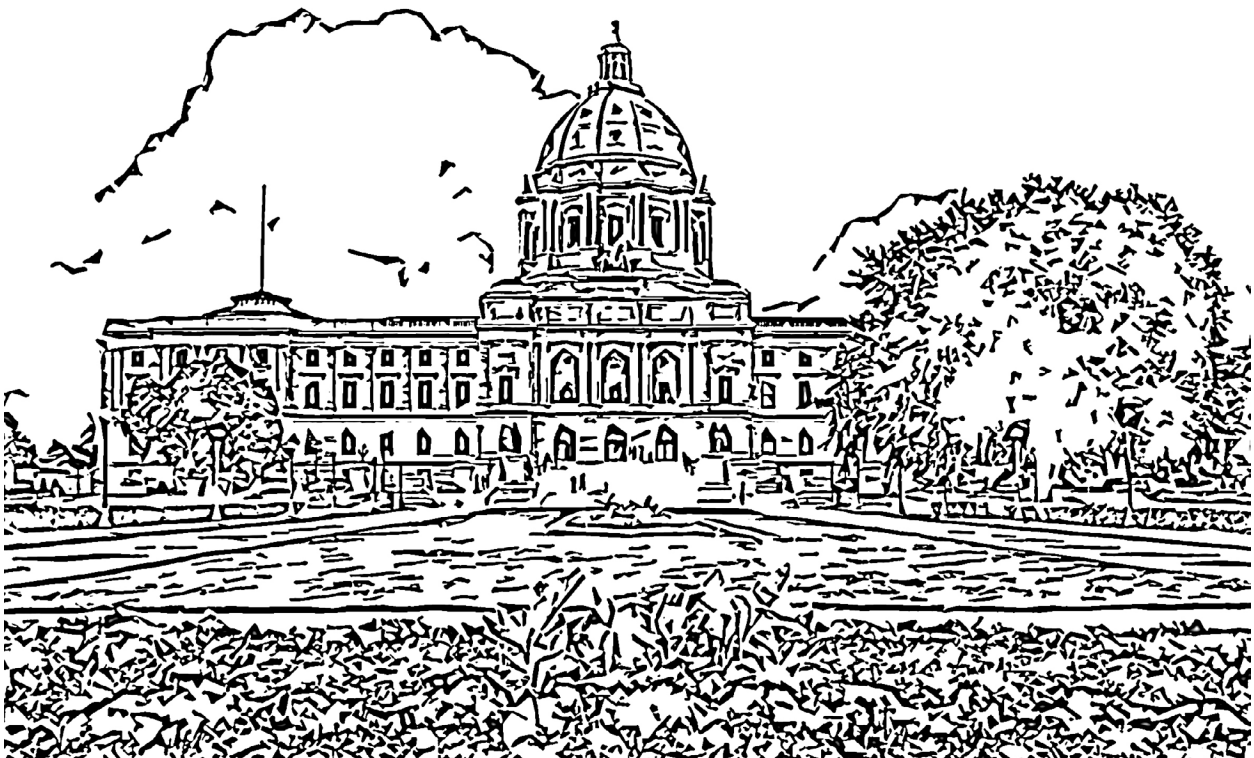

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) Notice of Public Hearing for Application to Add a New Commemorative Work on the State Capitol grounds: Gold Star Blue Star Memorial

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) will host a public hearing on whether an application to add a new commemorative work honoring Gold Star and Blue Star families on the Minnesota State Capitol grounds meets ALL of the conditions in *Minnesota Rules 2400.2703, Subpart 2*.

The public hearing will be held on July 21, 2026, from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m., at Capitol Commons (546 Rice Street, Saint Paul, MN 55103).

Minnesota Rules, Subp. 2. **Conditions for adding new artwork.** The board must consider displaying new commemorative artwork in the Capitol area if the artwork meets all of the following conditions:

- A. there has been documented public support of the artwork;
- B. the artwork has lasting statewide significance for Minnesotans;
- C. the artwork is respectful of the diversity of Minnesotans;
- D. viewing the artwork provides a rich experience to broaden the understanding of Minnesota's shared history, heritage, and culture;
- E. if an individual is the subject of an artwork, the individual must: [...].

Background

On October 7, 2025, CAAPB staff received an application from Cole Trace, Legislative Liaison for the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA), requesting the addition of a new commemorative work on the State Capitol grounds honoring Minnesota's Gold Star and Blue Star families. CAAPB staff found the application complete on October 10, 2025. Gold Star families are those who lost an immediate family member in the line of duty while serving in the US military. Blue Star families are families who have an immediate family member serving in the US military on active duty.

On June 4, 2026, the CAAP Board authorized its staff to hold a public hearing on the application's fulfillment of the conditions for addition listed above.

The addition request would likely affect the Court of Honor. The Court of Honor, which surrounds the World War II memorial, currently displays a range of bronze commemorative plaques. Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) Notice of Public Hearing for Application to Modify a Commemorative Work on the State Capitol grounds: World War I Plaque

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB) will host a public hearing on whether an application to modify the World War I plaque on the Minnesota State Capitol grounds meets **ONE OR MORE** of the conditions for modification outlined in *Minnesota Rules 2400.2703, Subpart 6*.

The public hearing will be held on July 21, 2026, from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m., at Capitol Commons (546 Rice Street, Saint Paul, MN 55103).

Minnesota Rules, Subp. 6. **Conditions for modification or removal of an existing artwork.** The board must consider requests for the modification or removal of an existing commemorative artwork if one or more of the following conditions apply:

- A. there has been sustained, broad-based, and documented public objection to the artwork;
- B. the artwork conflicts with the guiding principles in subpart 1, item A;
- C. the artwork has faults in construction or requires maintenance such that the Department of Administration is unable to properly care for or store the artwork;
- D. the site for the artwork is no longer safely accessible to the public or is due to be demolished; or
- E. significant changes in the use, character, or design of the site require a re-evaluation of the relationship of the artwork to the site.

Background

On April 1, 2026, CAAPB staff received an application from Michael Maxa, Adjutant at the American Legion, to modify the World War I plaque at the Court of Honor on the Minnesota State Capitol grounds. CAAPB staff found the application complete on April 9, 2026. The modification seeks to make the plaque's language more inclusive of US military personnel from Minnesota who trained for, but never saw, combat during the First World War.

On June 4, 2026, the CAAP Board authorized its staff to hold a public hearing on the application's fulfillment of one or more of the conditions for modification listed above.

Request for Proposals for Minnesota State Lottery Sponsorship Agreements

Description of Opportunity

The Minnesota State Lottery (“Lottery”) develops sponsorship agreements throughout the year with organizations, events, and sports teams to create excitement for lottery players, to interest new players and increase the visibility of lottery games. The Lottery encourages and continually seeks new sponsorship agreements to help achieve current Lottery marketing goals.

The Minnesota Lottery finds sponsorship opportunities in two ways. First, the Minnesota Lottery marketing staff locates and approaches potential sponsors to negotiate directly. Second, the Minnesota Lottery accepts incoming potential sponsors through this proposal process. Employing both strategies allows the Minnesota Lottery to find the best sponsorship opportunities, including opportunities that are not already known by staff. Both strategies are evaluated using the same criteria.

If you feel your organization, event, sports team, or other opportunity is a good fit for the Minnesota Lottery to sponsor, we encourage you to prepare and submit a proposal.

Proposal Content

A sponsorship proposal presented to the Lottery should meet the following three criteria:

1. Maximize Lottery Visibility - the event, sports team, or venue sponsorship proposal should draw a large number of attendees (typically 20,000 or more) whose demographics match the Lottery’s target audience. The Lottery is interested in effectively delivering its message of fun and entertainment to Minnesota adults, ages 25-64, with a household income of \$75,000+ and an educational background of some college or higher. The Lottery does not market to those under the age of 18, and events with large numbers of children present are generally not accepted. Attendance numbers, on-site signage availability, sales and engagement opportunities, and media exposure are critical components that will be evaluated in the proposal. List and define all assets, value, and benefits that the Lottery would receive as part of the sponsorship, such as PR inclusions, social media posts, prize support, promotional activities, and signage.
2. Enhance Lottery Image - the event, sports team, or venue should be a reputable, safe, and well-run event and organization that enhances the Lottery’s brand. The Lottery's presence should fit well within the lineup of other sponsors and participants. The Lottery is interested in sponsorships that can promote Lottery products, either via on-site sales from a Lottery booth, from sales-generating promotions with Lottery retailers, or from joint programs with the sponsor's media or other sponsorship partners.
3. Provide Promotional Extensions - the event, sports team, or venue proposal should offer exciting, value-added ways to interact with attendees and have opportunities to motivate attendees, listeners, and viewers to participate in and purchase Lottery games. The proposal must include staffing support, or other considerations to help the Lottery implement any appropriate promotional extension ideas.
