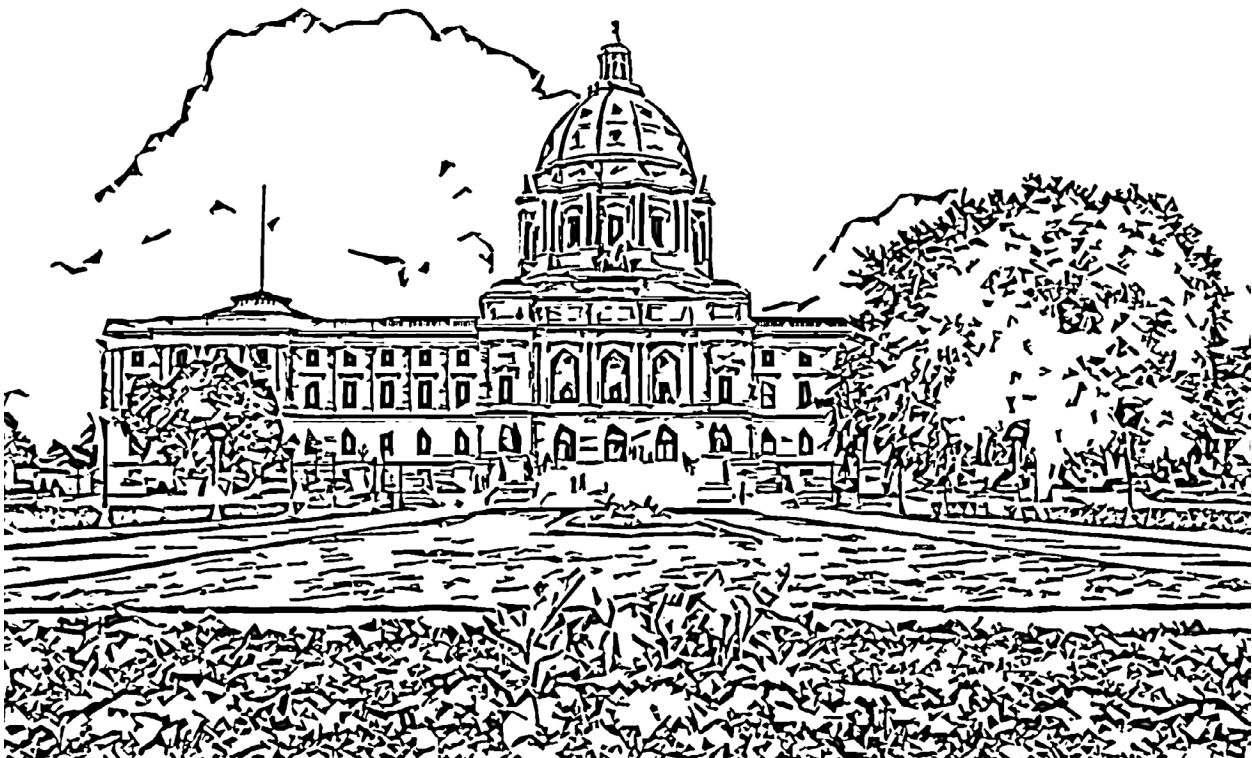

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The *State Register* also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

Notice of Updated Statutory Damages Cap Under Minnesota Statutes Section 332C.05

Minnesota Statutes section 332C.05(b)(2) allows parties enforcing chapter 332 to seek, among other remedies provided by law, additional damages “as the court may allow, but not exceeding \$1,000 per violation.”

Under section 332C.05(d), this dollar limit changes on July 1 of each even-numbered year by an amount equal to the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, using the CPI for December 2024 as the reference base index. Section 332C.05(f) requires the Attorney General to calculate and publish the revised amount in the *State Register* no later than September 1 of each even-numbered year.

Using the CPI for December 2024 as the base index for \$1,000.00, the updated dollar limit under section 332C.05(b)(2), effective July 1, 2026, is \$1,058.13.

Public Notice Regarding Changes to Payment Rates and Methodologies, and Services under the Medical Assistance Program

This notice is published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, title 42, part 447, section 205 (42 CFR § 447.205), which requires publication of a notice when there is any significant proposed change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for Medicaid services.

Effective January 1, 2027, nursing facilities will not be permitted to change their single-bed election, and a phase-out of the single bed incentive will begin. Effective January 1, 2027, the value of existing single-bed incentives in the nursing facility rates will be decreased annually by 20 percent of the original value and will be fully removed from all rates effective January 1, 2031. New single bed incentives issued on and after January 1, 2027, will be issued at the same reduced rate. The issuance of new single-bed incentive rate adjustments will cease on June 30, 2030. Rate adjustments for placing beds in or out of layaway will not be issued for bed status changes occurring on and after January 1, 2027. This change is expected to have a net fiscal impact of \$(981,000) in FY 2027 and \$(3,359,000) in FY 2028. *Laws of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 9, article 1, sections 8 and 21.*

Effective January 1, 2027, the border city rate add-on, applicable to the nonprofit facilities located at 2400 St Francis Drive in the city of Breckenridge and 1405 7th Street South in Moorhead, will be the difference of the median total payment rate for the lowest case mix classification in effect of the nonprofit facilities located in Fargo North Dakota and contiguous cities in North Dakota, minus the eligible nursing facility’s total payment rate for the lowest case mix classification in effect. This change is not expected to have a net fiscal impact. *Laws of Minnesota 2026, Chapter 95, article 4, section 32.*

Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) Workers' Compensation Division Notice of Updates to the Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) Minnesota Implementation Guide

Notice is hereby given that the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) is updating the Minnesota Implementation guide event table corresponding to the Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) published by the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions (IAIABC).

Statutory authority: The authority to update the Minnesota implementation guide is in Minnesota Statutes, section 176.231, subd. 5 (d). Under this law, the adopted versions of the Claims Release Standard and Minnesota implementation guide are not rules under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, but they have the force and effect of law as of the effective date, which will be October 1, 2026.

Description of the Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) and Minnesota implementation guide:

DLI adopted the IAIABC Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) and an updated version of the Minnesota implementation guide, effective February 9, 2023. Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) is still the current IAIABC standard for electronic data interchange (EDI).

The Minnesota implementation guide is the Minnesota-specific documentation that technically implements the Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format); it explains how Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) is used in Minnesota's workers' compensation system for its first report of injury (FROI) and subsequent report of injury (SROI) electronic reporting structure. The adopted Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) and Minnesota implementation guide are used in conjunction with all applicable Minnesota workers' compensation statutes and rules.

Updates to the Minnesota implementation guide.

Effective for dates of injury on or after October 1, 2026, Minnesota Statutes, section 176.221, subdivision 1, is amended to expand the timeframe from 60 days to 90 days for an employer or insurer to change their liability determination with a SROI 04 - full denial transaction after accepting liability. DLI is updating Appendix C, MN Event Table, of the Minnesota implementation guide to account for the statutory change.

On August 31, 2026, a draft update to Appendix C for the Claims Release Standard 3.1 (XML format) will be published on DLI's webpage at <https://www.dli.mn.gov/business/workers-compensation/work-comp-electronic-data-interchange-edi-and-efroi-web-portal>. The draft Appendix C shows the proposed changes needed to update MN Event Table to account for the statutory change to section 176.221, subdivision 1, as well as other clarifications listed in the change log.

Public Notice of Draft Exceptional Event Demonstration for 2024 Annual PM_{2.5} NAAQS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) has determined that an Exceptional Events demonstration must be submitted to meet Minnesota's requirements under section 319(b) of the Clean Air Act (CAA). The proposed Exceptional Event demonstration is now available for public comment.

Background. On February 7, 2024, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) finalized a newly revised annual National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for particulate matter smaller than 2.5 microns (PM_{2.5}) at 9.0 ug/m³. After EPA finalizes a new or revised NAAQS it must designate all areas in the country as either meeting (attainment) or not meeting (nonattainment) those standards. Three years of monitoring data are used to calculate a "design value" that determines annual PM_{2.5} NAAQS attainment designation status. On January 16, 2025, the MPCA submitted to EPA the state's recommendation of attainment for all Minnesota counties, based on design values using 2021-2023 monitoring data, meeting the CAA deadline for states to recommend designations. The EPA has not yet made (non)attainment designations. The EPA may therefore designate states based on design values using 2023-2025 monitoring data. Section 319(b) of the CAA requires states submit an "exceptional event demonstration" to exclude data that has "regulatory significance" that has been shown to be not reasonably controllable or preventable and is a natural event. The MPCA is therefore submitting an exceptional events demonstration for 2025 wildfire smoke events.

The MPCA is submitting this exceptional event demonstration for public comment before submitting it to the EPA. The MPCA welcomes the public comments on this report until September 30, 2026. This report contains the required elements of a demonstration required by the Exception Events Rule (codified in 40 C.F.R. §§ 50.1, 50.14, and 51.930), which governs the exclusions of these event-affected air quality data.

Purpose of the Exceptional Event Demonstration. The purpose of an exceptional events demonstration is to exclude monitoring data from design values if the data is impacted by an air quality event that is not reasonably controllable or preventable, is a natural event, and has regulatory significance, such as in determining whether a state is meeting the NAAQS. Minnesota has seen wildfire impacts on air quality over the past several summers. The summer of 2025 had more than 20 days of wildfire smoke that impacted the health of Minnesotans, as well as impacted the NAAQS design values for PM_{2.5}. The wildfire smoke contributed to the air monitoring design value at the Apple Valley, MN air monitor that exceeded the annual NAAQS of 9.0 ug/m³. Findings show air quality would have met the PM_{2.5} NAAQS if not for the wildfires. Excluding the data recorded from July 12, 2025, a day highly impacted by wildfires, from the calculation to determine the PM_{2.5} annual design value will put Minnesota in attainment for the purposes of designations by EPA.

After September 30, 2026, the MPCA will consider public comments and anticipates submitting the Exceptional Event Demonstration including public comments to the Region 5 Office of the EPA.

State Grants & Loans

Requirements: There are no statutes or rules requiring contracts to be advertised for any specific length of time, but the Office of State Procurement strongly recommends meeting the following requirements: \$0 - \$5000 does not need to be advertised; \$5,000 - \$25,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least seven calendar days; \$25,000 - \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least 14 calendar days; and anything above \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a minimum of at least 21 calendar days.
