EXECUTIVE SESSION

On the recommendation of the Complaint Resolution Committee, the Minnesota Board of Psychology adopted the following actions:

- 1. A Stipulation and Consent Order that places the license of Karen Knutson, Ph.D., LP in a Conditional status.
- 2. A Stipulation and Consent Order that Reprimands Martha Marvin, M.A., LPP and assesses a Civil Penalty.

PUBLIC SESSION

Board Chair, M. Seibold called the public session of the meeting to order at 9:32 AM, in the Psychology Board Conference Room, at 2829 University Avenue Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota, and a quorum was declared present.

The Board honored the memory of sitting Board member, Scott Terhune, PhD, LP, who passed away on Friday, 24 March 2006.

1. Approval of Minutes.

a. Board Meeting Minutes-March 10, 2006.

J. Peterson moved, seconded by J. Wolf that the minutes of the Board meeting of March 10, 2006 be approved as submitted. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Peterson, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion carried unanimously.

2. Administrative Matters.

a. Waivers and Variances. N. Hart updated the Board on the provisions of Minnesota Rule 7200.6000, Waivers and Variances. Mr. Hart discussed the two conditions that must be demonstrated to justify the granting of a waiver and the three conditions that must be demonstrated to justify the granting of a variance. He provided information on the difference between waivers and variances, eligibility, and criteria.

b. APA Vote Regarding Post-Doctoral Supervised Employment. On February 17, 2006, the American Psychological Association APA Council voted to affirm the doctoral degree as the minimum educational requirement for entry into the practice of psychology and the APA recommended that a minimum requirement for licensure be demonstration of two years of full-time supervised practice. The practice could be completed prior or subsequent to the granting of the degree. Former Minnesota Board of Psychology member and current member-at-large of the Board of Directors of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB), Jack Schaffer, PhD, LP, attended the meeting to provide additional information to the Board of Psychology's discussion of this issue.

Dr. Shaffer gave some background: 48 states require post-doctoral supervised employment for licensure. Alabama never required the post-doctoral year and Washington state changed its law last year to require two years of pre-doctoral training. Since the mission of ASPPB is to support member Boards, the organization will place resources into working with jurisdictions that wish to change their statutes in regard to the new APA policy.

A part of the new APA policy is a recommendation that "for admission to licensure applicants demonstrate that they have completed a sequential, organized, supervised professional experience equivalent to two years of full-time training that can be completed prior or subsequent to the granting of the doctoral degree." Dr. Schaffer suggested that if this Board believes that it would be helpful for ASPPB to develop standards for practica and internships, the Board should make that request of ASPPB.

Dr. Schaffer also reported on two unrelated issues:

- The Council of Accreditation will have a task force look into distance learning.
- ◆ The Board of Practice Affairs is looking at continuing education (CE). APA is considering offering more practice management types of CE, such as marketing (licensee's practices).
- **c. ASPPB's Call for Officers and Award Nominees.** Each year, the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) requests from the member Boards nominations for vacant seats on its Board of Directors and for awards as an ASPPB fellow, the ASPPB State and Provincial Service Award, the Norma P. Simon Award, and the Ming Fisher Award. Minnesota's current representative on the ASPPB Board of Directors as a memberat-large is Jack Schaffer, PhD, LP. Dr. Schaffer is serving a 3-year term.
- J. Peterson moved, seconded by J. Lee that P. Walker-Singleton be nominated for the Ming Fisher Award. The Board agreed by consensus. Board chair, M. Seibold asked J. Romano to write a letter of nomination.
- **d. Board's Representative Speaker at MPA Annual Conference.** In March 2006, BraVada Garrett-Akinsanya, PhD, LP, President of the Minnesota Psychological Association (MPA), requested that the Board consider sending a representative to present at MPA's Annual Conference this spring on any topic that is important to the Board. The Board's Rules Committee Chair, Jack Schaffer, was already scheduled to present to the Conference on the Board's proposed rule changes. The Board discussed officially designating Dr. Schaffer as a Board representative in response to Dr. Akinsanya's request.

J. Romano moved that Dr. Schaffer serve as the Board's representative speaker at the MPA conference. The motion failed for lack of a second. After discussion, the Board determined there was no need to make a special designation of a speaker, since all members approved of the plan for Dr. Schaffer to make his presentation on behalf of the Board.

3. Waivers/Variances.

a. Each of the following licensees was granted approval of a six-month time-limited variance to complete requirements for continuing education (CE), in compliance with MN Rule 7200.3400, subpart 2.

- J. Romano moved, seconded by J. Peterson, that the six month time-limited variance requests to complete continuing education requirements (MN Rule 7200.3400, subpart 2) be approved for the licensees listed above on the basis that the licensees met the burden to prove that adherence to the rule would impose an undue burden on the licensees, that granting the variances will not adversely affect the public welfare, and that the alternatives proposed meet the rationale for the rule. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Petersen, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion carried unanimously.
- **b.** Applicant 06C-153 applied for the EPPP and requested a variance. Applicant met the requirements for a MA with a major in Educational Psychology from the University of Minnesota. Applicant provided sufficient documentation to demonstrate that Applicant earned 1-2 quarter credits in Theories of Measurement. The Application Review Committee moved approval of the request for a variance from MN Rule 7200.1300, Subp.4, B (1) (b), Educational Requirement for Licensure on the basis that the applicant met the burden to prove that adherence to the rule would impose an undue burden on the applicant, that granting the variance will not adversely affect the public welfare, and that the alternative proposed meets the rationale for the rule. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Petersen, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion carried unanimously.
- c. Nathanael M. Larsen, MS, LP applied for conversion from master's to doctoral level LP licensure. He applied on June 14, 2004 and was notified by letter dated July 29, 2004 that he needed to complete a 2000 hour internship in order to convert. Mr. Larsen completed the internship December 1, 2005. He applied for a variance because he completed the internship more than one year after the date of his application as required by rule. The Application Review Committee moved that the Board presume it a hardship to complete the requirement within one year, that granting the variance will not adversely affect the public welfare, and that the alternative proposed meets the rationale for the rule. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Petersen, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion carried unanimously.

- d. Applicant 06C-175 applied for the EPPP and the PRE and requested a variance. Applicant met the requirements for a MS with a major in Counseling Psychology from St. Cloud State University on May 8, 1999. The Application Review Committee moved denial of the variance request on the basis that Applicant did not provide sufficient documentation to demonstrate that Applicant earned three quarter credits in Cognitive-Affective Bases of Behavior. Applicant did not meet the burden to prove that adherence to the rule would impose an undue burden on the applicant, that granting the variance will not adversely affect the public welfare, and that the alternative proposed meets the rationale for the rule. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Petersen, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion was carried unanimously.
- e. Applicant 06C-339 applied for the EPPP and requested a variance. Applicant met the requirements for a PhD with a major in Counseling Psychology from the University of Iowa on July 30, 2004. Applicant's university does not list the internship on the official transcript. Applicant provided sufficient documentation to demonstrate completion of the pre-degree internship. The Application Review Committee moved approval of the request for a variance from MN Rule 7200.1300, Subp.4, B (4), Educational Requirement for Licensure on the basis that the applicant met the burden to prove that adherence to the rule would impose an undue burden on the applicant, that granting the variance will not adversely affect the public welfare, and that the alternative proposed meets the rationale for the rule. Voting "aye": S. Hayes, G. Jensen, J. Lee, J. Petersen, J. Romano, T. Thompson, S. Ward, and J. Wolf. Voting "nay": none. There being eight "ayes" and no "nays", the motion was carried unanimously.

15. Other Business.

a. APA Rule Update.

On March 16, 2006, the Board received a letter from the Honorable Steve M. Mihalchick, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ), approving the APA rule as to legality. He recommended a clarification in the language, suggesting that the Board add one word to the rule: "Acceptable evidence consists of documentation provided directly to the board by the American Psychological Association...." In accordance with delegated authority from the Board, P. Walker-Singleton accepted the ALJ's recommendation and the language was sent to the Office of the Revisor.

The Board is awaiting the Revisor's correction so that we can move to the next step.

b. Board Election in May.

Because of the passing of S. Terhune, the Board's Vice Chair, the Board will hold a special election for that office at the Board meeting on May 12, 2006.
