ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology (“Board”) convened on January 24, 2003, to review the petition of David Andros, M.S., LP (“Licensee”), for removal of the restrictions and conditions placed on his license by a Stipulation and Consent Order adopted and implemented by the Board on November 3, 2000 (“November 2000 Order”). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee’s (“CRC”) recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the November 2000 Order, as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 4.b., Licensee was required to practice psychology only under the supervision of a licensed psychologist for a period of 24 months, with quarterly reports being submitted by both the Licensee and the supervisor. In compliance with this provision of the Order, Licensee met with a supervisor weekly between December 21, 2000 and December 19, 2002.

2. Pursuant to paragraph 4.e., Licensee was required to complete an individualized professional boundaries training course. Licensee successfully completed a course, taught by Janet Thomas, Psy.D., LP, on July 9, 2001.

3. Pursuant to paragraph 4.h., Licensee was required to complete a graduate-level course, equivalent to three semester credits, on the subject of diagnosis and treatment planning,

and submit a written analysis of how the course information will impact his practice. Licensee successfully completed a graduate course titled, "Psychopathology: Assessment and Treatment" from Capella University and submitted his written analysis on October 7, 2002..

4. Pursuant to paragraph 4.i., Licensee was required to take the Professional Responsibility Examination within 90 days of the effective date of the November 2000 Order and retake the examination, if necessary, until obtaining a passing score. Licensee complied with this provision of the Order, and obtained a passing score on May 23, 2001.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule

The November 2000 Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
