**ORDER TO CONTINUE  
TEMPORARY SUSPENSION**

The Minnesota Board of Dentistry (“Board”) is authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes sections 150A.01 to 150A.22, 214.10, and 214.103 to license and regulate dentists, to investigate complaints, and to take disciplinary action when appropriate. In addition, Minnesota Statutes section 150A.08, subdivision 8, authorizes the Board, through its designated Board members, to temporarily suspend a license without a hearing if the Board finds that the licensee has violated a statute or rule which the Board is empowered to enforce and continued practice by the licensee would create an imminent risk of harm to others. The Board’s designated Board members compose the Board’s Complaint Committee (“Committee”). Accordingly, the Committee has the authority to investigate complaints, initiate temporary suspension hearings, and file contested case proceedings. *See* Minn. Stat. §§ 150A.08, subd. 8, and 214.10, subd. 2.

On April 25, 2014, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 150A.08, subdivision 8, the Committee initiated the above-captioned matter by issuing an Order for Temporary Suspension of the License of Milos Tomaides, D.D.S. (“Respondent”), and scheduling a hearing before the Board on the sole issue of whether there was a reasonable basis to continue, modify, or lift the temporary suspension.

On May 2, 2014, the Board considered evidence and oral argument in the above-captioned matter. Assistant Attorneys General Jennifer C. Middleton and Sara P. Boeshans appeared on behalf of the Committee. Attorney William A. McNab of Winthrop & Weinstine appeared on behalf of Respondent. Bryan D. Huffman, Assistant Attorney General, was present

as legal advisor to the Board. Board members Joan Sheppard, D.D.S., David S. Gesko, D.D.S., Terese M. Youngdahl, L.D.A., and John M. Manahan, J.D., did not participate in deliberations and did not vote in the matter.

### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence and oral arguments presented, the Board concludes that there is a reasonable basis to continue the suspension of Respondent's license in accordance with Minnesota Statutes section 150A.08, subdivision 8. Accordingly, the Board issues the following:

### ORDER

1. The Board, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes section 150A.08, subdivision 8, hereby continues the **TEMPORARY SUSPENSION** of Respondent's license to practice dentistry in the State of Minnesota. Respondent may not provide dentistry services in any manner in the State of Minnesota during the period of suspension.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 150A.08, subdivision 8, Respondent is entitled to a disciplinary hearing to be held pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act. The Committee must schedule the hearing to be held within 45 days from the date of this Order unless Respondent and the Committee agree otherwise.

3. This Order will remain in effect until the Board considers the Administrative Law Judge's report and subsequently issues a final order in this matter.

4. This Order does not constitute disciplinary action.
