**ORDER  
OF SUSPENSION**

1. The Minnesota Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board (“Board”) is authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §144E to register persons as first responders in the State of Minnesota, to review complaints against registered first responders, and to initiate appropriate disciplinary action.

2. Lucius Foster, IV (“Registrant”) has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board and is registered as a first responder in the State of Minnesota.

3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes §518.66, and Minnesota Statutes §214.101, subd. 1, the registration of a first responder must be suspended if the Registrant is not in compliance with a court order for child support and appropriate authority so notifies the Board.

4. On July 26, 2012, the Board received a Notice of License Revocation from the St. Louis County Public Health and Human Services, which advised the Board that the Registrant is not in compliance with a court order for child support, and under Minn. Stat. §214.101, subd. 1, the Board must suspend registration as a first responder in the State of Minnesota until the child support obligation has been satisfied and the clearance certificate has been issued.

5. At a public meeting on May 15, 2008, the Board passed a motion delegating to the Executive Director the authority to (1) sign orders suspending certificates or registrations pursuant to child support delinquency notices, and (2) sign orders reinstating certificates and registration upon compliance with all requirements set forth in the orders of suspension.

**ORDER**

1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Registrant's registration as a first responder in the State of Minnesota shall be **SUSPENDED** pursuant to Minn. Stat. §214.101, effective August 27, 2012. During the period of suspension, the Registrant shall not practice as a first responder in the State of Minnesota.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Registrant's registration shall be reinstated by the Board upon the Registrant's compliance with the following:

a. The Certificate Holder shall submit to the Board a child support clearance certificate from St. Louis County Health and Human Services indicating that the Registrant does not owe any back child support; and

b. The Registrant shall comply with the requirements of Minn. Stat. §144E.27, subd. 3, which also applies to expired registrations.
