ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology (“Board”) convened on June 18, 2010, to review the petition of Cynthia Haakana, Ph.D., LP (“Licensee”), for removal of the restriction and conditions placed on her license by a Stipulation and Consent Order adopted and implemented by the Board on June 16, 1995 (“June 1995 Order”). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee’s (“CRC”) recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the June 1995 Order, as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 5., Licensee was required to remove the competency of supervision from her competencies filed with the Board. Licensee complied with this requirement on June 12, 1995.
2. Pursuant to paragraph 6.a., Licensee was required to complete a supervision course which focused on management of supervisees. Licensee successfully completed the course on March 14, 2009 and submitted a report to the Committee addressing what she had learned from the course in compliance with paragraph 6.b.
3. Pursuant to paragraph 6.c., Licensee was required to complete an individualized professional boundaries training course. Licensee successfully completed a course on October 5, 1995. Licensee submitted a report to the Committee, in compliance with

paragraph 6.d., and the instructor's report was received on October 10, 1995, pursuant to paragraph 6.e., of the Order.

4. Pursuant to paragraph 6.f., Licensee could resume supervision of other practitioners after completion of the supervision and boundaries courses and only under the supervision of a licensed psychologist for at least one hour per week for a period of one year, with a minimum of 50 hours of supervision. In compliance with this provision of the Order, Licensee met with a supervisor weekly between April 10, 2009 and May 3, 2010. Reports were submitted by both the Licensee and her supervisor documenting the supervision.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The June 1995 Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
