ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL
LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology (Board) convened on January 24, 2014, to review the petition of Rebecca R. Hinderscheid, PsyD, LP (Licensee) for removal of the conditions and restrictions placed on her license by a Findings of Fact, Conclusions, and Final Order, adopted and implemented by the Board on October 7, 2011 (October 2011 Order). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's (Committee) recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all conditions set forth in the October 2011 Order as follows:

1. Pursuant to page 5, paragraph 2., Licensee shall pay a **CIVIL PENALTY** in the amount of \$500.00.
2. Pursuant to page 6, paragraph 3.a., Licensee is **REPRIMANDED** for the conduct described in the Findings of Fact in the October 2011 Order.
3. Pursuant to page 6, paragraph 3.b., Licensee is prohibited from providing clinical supervision to others until she has completed, to the satisfaction of the Committee, the requirements of paragraphs 3.c. through 3.e.
4. Pursuant to page 6 paragraph 3.c., within forty-five (45) days of the date the October 2011 Order is adopted by the Board, Licensee must obtain a new supervising psychologist and meet with the supervising psychologist no less than two (2) hours per month. Licensee may petition for a reduction in supervision from two (2) hours to one (1) hour following completion of requirements set forth in paragraphs 3.d. through 3.e. Licensee shall

practice only under the supervision of a supervising psychologist approved in advance by the Committee.

5. Pursuant to page 7, paragraph 3.d., the supervising psychologist shall provide a report to the Committee every three (3) months and at the time Licensee petitions to have the supervision condition removed from her license.

6. Pursuant to page 8, paragraph 3.e., within one (1) year of the date the Order, Licensee shall enroll in and pass a three-quarter credit, or the equivalent in semester credits, graduate-level ethics course, approved in advance by the Committee.

The Committee received documentation verifying Licensee's compliance with the order to pay a civil penalty and the remedy listed in paragraphs 3.a. through 3.e. and all subsequent paragraphs of the October 2011 Order.


Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an **UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE** to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.
