**ORDER FOR
TEMPORARY SUSPENSION
OF LICENSE**

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") is authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 148, 214.10, and 214.103 to license and regulate psychologists, to refer complaints against psychologists to the Attorney General for investigation, and to take disciplinary action when appropriate. In addition, the Board is authorized to temporarily suspend a license without a hearing pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 148.941, subd. 3, if the Board finds sufficient evidence to support a reasonable belief that Nicole Holman, M.A., L.P.P. ("Respondent"), has violated a statute or rule which the Board is empowered to enforce and that continued practice by the Respondent would create an imminent risk of harm to others.

On April 4, 2011, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 148.941, subd. 3, the Complaint Resolution Committee ("Committee") filed with the Board a Notice of Petition For Temporary Suspension and a Petition For Temporary Suspension of Respondent's license in the above-captioned matter.

On April 15, 2011, the above-entitled matter came on for consideration by the Board. Benjamin R. Garbe, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the Committee. Respondent did not appear. Daphne A. Lundstrom, Assistant Attorney General, was present as legal advisor to the Board. Board members Chris Bonnell, J.D., Jean Wolf, Ph.D., L.P., and Patricia Stankovitch, Psy.D., L.P., did not participate in deliberations and did not vote in the matter.

CONCLUSIONS

The Board finds there is probable cause Respondent has violated statutes which the Board is empowered to enforce and that Respondent's continued practice would create a serious risk of harm to others and that, consequently, a temporary suspension of Respondent's license is warranted pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 148.941, subd. 3. Accordingly, the Board issues the following:


ORDER

1. Respondent's license to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota is **TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED** pursuant to § 148.941, subd. 3. During the period of suspension, Respondent shall not in any manner practice psychology in the State of Minnesota.
2. This Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until such time as the Board issues a final decision in this matter.
3. The Committee is directed to schedule a contested case hearing within 30 days of the issuance of this Order, unless this time period is waived per agreement of the parties. The Board shall issue a final order within 30 days of receipt of the administrative law judge's recommendations subsequent to the contested case.
