ORDER OF  
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") convened on November 18, 2011, to review the petition of Suzanne James, Ph.D., L.P. ("Licensee"), for removal of the conditions placed on her license. Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determined that Licensee complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the 2009 Order

1. Pursuant to paragraph 4a, 4b, 4c, Licensee complied with this provision of the Order by not accepting any new dissociative identity disorder ("DID") patients and only providing psychotherapy to her current "DID" patients. Licensed practice under the supervision of a licensed psychologist who was approved in advance by the Board's Complaint Resolution Committee (Committee). That supervising psychologist provided the required reports to the Committee.
2. Pursuant to paragraph 4d, Licensee complied with this provision of the Order under the care of a licensed psychologist who was pre-approved by the Committee. The treating psychologist provided the required reports to the Committee.
3. Pursuant to paragraph 4e, 4f, 4g; Licensee complied with this provision of the Order by enrolling in an individualized professional boundaries training course with an instructor who is a licensed psychologist and pre-approved by the Committee. Licensee submitted her report to the Committee which included all of the requirements listed in the paragraph 4f of the Order and Licensee caused the instructor to submit a report to the Committee which documented licensee's participation in the course and all of the requirements listed in paragraph 4g the Order
4. Pursuant to paragraph 4h, Licensee complied with this provision of the Order by successfully completing a course on current modalities for the treatment of DID patients. The course was pre-approved by the Committee.

Pursuant to paragraph 8 Licensee petitioned the Committee to remove the practice restrictions placed on her license by the 2009 Order. The committee received documentation verifying licensee's compliance with paragraphs 4a through 4h of the 2009 Order.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

## ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The 2009 Stipulation and Consent Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
