**ORDER OF  
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE**

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") convened on March 30, 2001, to review the petition of Kevin Jones, M.A., LP ("Licensee"), for removal of the conditions placed on his license by a Stipulation and Consent Order, adopted and implemented by the Board on September 17, 1999 ("September 1999 Order"). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all conditions set forth in the September 1999 Order as follows:

Pursuant to paragraph 4., Licensee's license to practice psychology was suspended until his completion of a professional boundaries training course and the Professional Responsibility Examination.

1. Pursuant to paragraph 4.a., 4.b., and 4.c., licensee completed an individualized professional boundaries training course and submitted a report to the Committee regarding what he learned in the course. Licensee caused the instructor to submit a report documenting licensee's participation in the course, his assessment of licensee's knowledge obtained from course, and his opinion of licensee's ethical fitness to engage in the practice of psychology.

2. Pursuant to paragraph 4.d., Licensee completed the Professional Responsibility Examination and obtained a passing score.

The suspension of licensee's license was Stayed and his license was reinstated in a conditional status in February 2000. Licensee completed the following conditions:

3. Pursuant to paragraph 4.e., 4.f., and 4.g., Licensee has obtained therapy from a licensed psychologist who was pre-approved by the Committee. Licensee has submitted reports to the Committee and has caused his therapist to submit reports to the Committee regarding licensee's participation and progress in the therapy. The therapist's reports support the conclusion that Licensee has the ability to conduct himself in a fit, competent, and ethical manner in the practice of psychology.

4. Pursuant to paragraph 4.h., 4.i., and 4.j., upon reinstatement of licensee's license in February 2000, licensee has practiced under the supervision of a licensed psychologist for a minimum of one year. Licensee met with the supervisor twice per month for 1 hour each meeting. Licensee submitted reports regarding the supervision and caused the supervisor to submit reports which addressed the topics discussed, what licensee learned in the consultations, and the supervisor's opinion of licensee's ability to provide competent services.

5. Pursuant to paragraph 4.k., Licensee was prohibited from providing supervision to any students while his license was in a conditional status. No evidence has been received to suggest that Licensee has not abided by the prohibition.

6. Pursuant to paragraph 4.l., Licensee has remitted \$6,000 to the Board for payment of the civil penalty assessed.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

**ORDER**


Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The September 1999 Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
