**ORDER OF UNRESTRICTED AND  
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE**

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") convened on September 8, 2000, to review the petition of Leslie Ross Olson, M.S.Ed., L.P. ("Licensee"), for removal of the restrictions and conditions placed on her license by a Stipulation and Consent Order adopted and implemented by the Board on May 7, 1999 ("May 1999 Order"). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's ("CRC") recommendation that Licensee be granted an unrestricted and unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the May 1999 Order, as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 5, Licensee was restricted from providing letters or reports concerning her clients to any court until she successfully completed educational coursework on the subjects of custody evaluations, court testimony and psychological report writing. Licensee received pre-approval from the CRC and successfully completed 20 hours of continuing education on these subjects (see paragraph 2 below). Paragraph 5 further required that Licensee notify the CRC if she was subpoenaed to testify in court and explain the nature of her testimony and the date of the testimony. On April 3, 1999, Licensee notified the CRC in writing that a client's attorney subpoenaed her to testify, and she provided 20 minutes of testimony concerning the diagnosis of the client.

2. Pursuant to paragraph 6.a., Licensee successfully completed 20 hours of continuing education on the subjects of custody evaluations, court testimony and psychological report writing. Licensee received pre-approval from the CRC for the courses and successfully completed the coursework within two years of the date the May 1999 Order was adopted by the Board.

3. Pursuant to paragraph 6.b., Licensee paid a civil penalty to the Board in the amount of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars within sixty (60) days of the date the May 1999 Order was adopted by the Board.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER


Licensee shall be granted an UNRESTRICTED and UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The May 1999 Order is superseded by this Order of Unrestricted and Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
