**STIPULATION AND  
CONSENT ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by Mark J. Anderson (“Licensee”), and the Minnesota Board of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators (“Board”) as follows:

1. During all times herein, Licensee has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board from which he holds a license to practice licensed nursing home administration in the State of Minnesota.

**FACTS**

2. For the purpose of this stipulation, the Board may consider the following facts as true:

a. Licensee has been licensed by the Board as a nursing home administrator in the State of Minnesota since July 1, 1985.

b. On December 2, 2013, in Hennepin County District Court, Licensee was convicted of engaging in, hiring, or agreeing to hire minor to engage in prostitution, under Minn. Stat. 609.324 subd. 1(c)(2), a felony.

**REGULATIONS**

3. The Board views Licensee’s practices as described in paragraph 2 above to be in violation of statutes and rules enforced by the Board and constitutes a reasonable basis in law and fact to justify the disciplinary action provided for in this Stipulation and Consent Order. Licensee agrees that the conduct cited above constitutes the following violations:

a. Convicted of a felony or gross misdemeanor, including a finding or verdict of guilt, whether or not the adjudication of guilt has been withheld or not entered, an admission of guilt, or a no contest plea, when the felony or gross misdemeanor is reasonably related to the practice of nursing home administration, in violation of Minn. R. 6400.6900 subp. 1(A):

b. Convicted of a crime against a minor, including a finding or verdict of guilt, whether or not adjudication of guilt has been withheld or not entered, an admission of guilt, or a no contest plea, in violation of Minn. R. 6400.6900 subp. 1(B);

c. Violated a statute, rule, or order that the board issued or is empowered to enforce or that pertains to administration of a nursing facility or to the responsibilities of a nursing home administrator, in violation of Minn. R. 6400.6900 subp. 1(E);

d. Committed acts of misconduct substantially related to the qualifications, function, or duties of a nursing home administrator and evidenced unfitness to perform as a nursing home administrator in a manner consistent with protecting resident health, safety, and welfare, in violation of Minn. R. 6400.6900 subp. 1(G);

e. Engaged in unprofessional conduct or any other conduct with potential for causing harm to the public or facility residents including any departure from or failure to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable and prevailing practice, as specified in state and federal statutes and rules concerning administration of nursing home facilities, without actual injury having to be established, in violation of Minn. R. 6400.6900 subp. 1(I);

## **REMEDY**

4. Upon this stipulation and all the files, records, and proceedings herein, and without further notice or hearing, the Board enters an order as follows:

a. Licensee's license to practice nursing home administration in Minnesota is hereby **REVOKED**. All state licenses and certificates currently in your possession shall be returned to the Board within ten (10) days of service of this Order.

b. Effective immediately, Licensee shall not practice, attempt to practice, offer to practice, or advertise or hold himself out as authorized to practice nursing home administration in Minnesota and shall not use the credentials LNHA or titles of licensed nursing home administrator or any other designation which indicates licensure as a licensed nursing home administrator.

5. In the event the Board at its discretion does not approve this settlement, this stipulation is withdrawn and shall be of no evidentiary value and shall not be relied upon nor introduced by either party to this stipulation, except that Licensee agrees that should the Board reject this stipulation and this case proceeds to hearing, Licensee will assert no claim that the Board was prejudiced by its review and discussion of this stipulation or of any records relating to this matter.

6. Any appropriate court may, upon application of the Board, enter its decree enforcing the order of the Board.

7. Licensee has been advised by Board representatives that he may choose to be represented by legal counsel in this matter. Licensee waived his right to legal representation. The Complaint Panel is represented by Jennifer C. Middleton, Assistant Attorney General.

8. Licensee waives all formal hearings on this matter and all other procedures before the Board to which Licensee may be entitled under the Minnesota or United States constitutions, statutes, or rules and agrees that the order to be entered pursuant to the stipulation shall be the final order herein.

9. Licensee hereby knowingly and voluntarily waives any and all claims against the Board, the Minnesota Attorney General, the State of Minnesota and their agents, employees, and representatives which may otherwise be available to Licensee under the Americans With Disabilities Act or the Minnesota Human Rights Act relative to the action taken or authorized against Licensee's license to practice as a licensed nursing home administrator under this stipulation.

10. Licensee hereby acknowledges that he has read, understands, and agrees to this stipulation and has freely and voluntarily signed the stipulation without threat or promise by the Board or any of its members, employees, or agents. When signing the stipulation, Licensee acknowledges he is fully aware the stipulation is not binding unless and until it is approved by the Board.

11. This Stipulation and Consent Order constitutes a disciplinary action against Licensee.


12. This Stipulation and Consent Order is a public document and will be sent to all appropriate data banks and entities consistent with Board policy.

13. This stipulation contains the entire agreement between the parties there being no other agreement of any kind, verbal or otherwise, which varies this stipulation.


