ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") convened on May 16, 2003, to review the petition of John Moorman, M.S., LP ("Licensee"), for removal of the conditions placed on his license by a Stipulation and Consent Order adopted and implemented by the Board on October 15, 1999 ("October 1999 Order"). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's ("CRC") recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the October 1999 Order, as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 5.a., Licensee was required to complete an individualized professional boundaries training course. Licensee successfully completed a course, taught by John Hung, Ph.D., LP, on October 15, 2002
2. Pursuant to paragraph 5.d., Licensee was required to take the Professional Responsibility Examination within 90 days of the effective date of the October 1999 Order and retake the examination, if necessary, until obtaining a passing score. Licensee complied with this provision of the Order, and obtained a passing score on January 25, 2000.
3. Pursuant to paragraph 5.e., Licensee was required to complete 18 continuing education units on confidentiality (6 CEU's) and maintaining professional boundaries (12 CEU's) within two years of the date of the October 1999 Order. Licensee had requested, and

was granted, an extension until April 2003 to complete the terms of the Order. Licensee complied with this provision of the Order and obtained all of the required CEU's.

4. Pursuant to paragraph 5.f., Licensee was required to develop and submit to the Committee for approval, a written protocol on the subjects of: written releases for confidential information; contents of mandated reports; discussion of client information with other professionals; and accurate representation of himself to the public. Licensee complied with this provision of the Order and submitted his written protocols on April 2, 2003.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule

The October 1999 Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
