**ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL AND
UNRESTRICTED LICENSE**

The Complaint Resolution Committee (Committee) of the Minnesota Board of Psychology (Board) convened on May 9, 2014, to review the petition of Marna Reed, MA, LP (Licensee) for removal of the conditions and restrictions placed on her license by a Stipulation and Consent Order, adopted and implemented by the Board on May 18, 2012 (Order). The Committee determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all conditions set forth in the Order as follows:

1. Pursuant to page 3, paragraph 4.a., Licensee shall practice psychology only under the supervision of a supervising psychologist, meeting with the supervisor no less than two (2) hours every other week for a period of two (2) years.
2. Pursuant to page 4, paragraph 4.b., the supervising psychologist shall provide a report to the Committee every three (3) months and at the time Licensee petitions to have the supervision condition removed from her license.
3. Pursuant to page 5, paragraph 4.c., Licensee shall enroll in and complete an individualized professional boundaries course.
4. Pursuant to page 5, paragraph 4.d., Licensee shall submit a report on the boundaries course.
5. Pursuant to page 6, paragraph 4.e., Licensee shall cause to be submitted a report on the boundaries course from the instructor.

6. Pursuant to page 7, paragraph 4.f., Licensee shall not provide professional services to any client or individual with a diagnosis of borderline personality disorder.

The Committee received documentation verifying Licensee's compliance with the remedy listed in paragraphs 4.a. through 4.f. and all subsequent paragraphs of the Order.


Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an **UNCONDITIONAL AND UNRESTRICTED LICENSE** to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.
