ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL
LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology (“Board”) convened on August 3, 2012, to review the removal of the conditions placed on the license of Terry E. Zuehlke, Ph.D., L.P. (LP0326) by the Stipulation and Consent Order signed on May 14, 2010 (“May 2010 Order”). The May 2010 Order placed a suspension and practice restrictions on his license to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota. Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee’s (“Committee”) recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all requirements and conditions set forth in the May 2010 Order as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 4.a., within thirty (30) days of the signed May 2010 Order, Licensee must participate in a psychological evaluation performed by a Licensed Psychologist who is approved in advanced by the Committee.
2. Pursuant to paragraph 4.b., Licensee shall comply with all treatment recommendations and shall be responsible for the cost of the treatment.
3. Pursuant to paragraph 4.c., within thirty (30) days of the date of the May 2010 Order, Licensee shall arrange to enroll in an individualized professional boundaries training course.
4. Pursuant to paragraph 4.d., within 30 days of completing the professional boundaries course, Licensee shall submit a report to the Committee.
5. Pursuant to paragraph 4.e., within sixty (60) days of completing the professional boundaries course licensee shall cause the instructor of the professional boundaries course to submit a report to the Committee.
6. Pursuant to paragraph 4.f., Licensee shall pay a civil penalty to the Board, for two thousand, five hundred (\$2500) dollars.
7. Pursuant to paragraph 5., Licensee may, petition the Committee to have the suspension stayed, no sooner that nine months from the date of the signed May 2010 Order and after successful completion of requirements listed in paragraph 4.a. through 4.f.

8. Pursuant to paragraph 5.a., Licensee following the stay of suspension shall practice psychology only under the supervision of a supervising psychologist, approved in advance by the Committee.
9. Pursuant to paragraph 5.b., Licensee shall cause the supervising psychologist to provide a report to the Committee every three months and at the time the Licensee petitions to have the conditions removed from his license.

The Committee received documentation verifying Licensee's compliance with the remedies listed in paragraphs 4.a through 5.b and all subsequent paragraphs of the May 2010 Order.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:


ORDER

Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The May 2010 Order is superseded by this Order of unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
