

CONTINUING EDUCATION FAQ

How did the pandemic and peacetime emergency affect continuing education (CE)?

Executive Order 20-23 authorized health licensing boards to defer continuing education completion and reporting until the first full reporting cycle following termination of the peacetime emergency.

Was CE waived?

No. Continuing education completion and reporting were deferred due to the constraints on the licensing and continuing education process. The deferral extends the length of time to complete and report the requirements, but the reporting requirements remain the same.

When do I need to report CE?

If any portion of your CE reporting cycle fell before July 1, 2021, you will need to report at the next full cycle.

Example: You were due to report 75 hours by December 31, 2021. You are now due to report 150 hours by December 31, 2024.

What if I want to report CE before that date?

You will have the option to report for one full reporting cycle on your next renewal when CE is due to be reported. In the alternative, you may wait and report two full reporting cycles on a future renewal, up to and including the renewal when your CE reporting is next due.

Example: You are due to report 75 hours by December 31, 2021 or 150 hours by December 31, 2024. You may report 75 hours on your 2021, 2022, or 2023 renewals or report 150 hours on your 2024 renewal.

What if I was due to report during the peacetime emergency, but I wasn't given the option to do so on my last online renewal?

You will have the option to report on your current renewal.
