- Pete Wyckoff gave an overview of Minnesota's climate policy framework and recent federal and state policy changes
- Brendon Slotterback gave an overview of green banks and their purpose
- Pete Wyckoff described the MNCIFA legislation and goals
- Representative Emma Greenman described the process to develop the MNCIFA statute and the goals that were important to legislators.

Update on Federal resources & other funding sources

Brendon Slotterback gave an update on EPA Process & Funding Opportunities

- O GHG Reduction Fund largest single grant programs from IRA/IIJA will include capitalization grants. Will know in Spring 2024
- CCIA and NCIF are aimed at speeding the deployment to priority project that fall into 3 categories
 - Distributed generation and storage
 - Net zero emission buildings
 - o Zero emissions transportation
- 100% of fund through SFA and CCA must be for LICAD

- o At least 40% of the fund from NCIF must directly benefit LICAD
- Example partnerships
 - Coalition for Green Capital- NCIF focused on creating a national vehicle for lending to clean energy projects
 - Climate United NCIF multifamily and single family produces, LMI solar, zerocarbon transportation
 - Justice Climate Fund NCIF & CCIA mostly CDFI-focused, focused on low-income communities
 - Power Forward Communities/Rewiring America NCIF electrify-everything focused. Focused on housing and consumer products
- MNCIFA can tap into DOE Loans as a SEFI. Staff has been meeting with DOE. IRA provisions increase DOE lending authority
- "Innovation" requirement for DOE lending is waived if a State Green Bank also contributes to a project
