T I M E L I N E



- (1) **Energy Audit:** Once an energy auditor has completed their report, the work that needs to be done to the house is identified. Confer with your energy auditor to know what work will be planned and how it may affect your house.
- (2) **Mechanical Phase (Measures):** A mechanical contractor is selected to perform the work to your home. This work spans a range of measures but is typically furnace repairs or replacement and fan installation.
- (3) **Mechanical Inspection:** This inspection is to ensure that all the improvements were performed to the high standard expected by the weatherization program.



- (4) **Insulation Phase (Measures):** An insulation contractor is selected to do the work to your home, typically adding insulation where needed, sealing air leaks into the home, and may include other measures as deemed necessary.
- (5) **Quality Control Inspection:** The Quality Control Inspection evaluates the safety and effectiveness of all improvements made to the home by contractors and weatherization staff.

What to Expect
