


COUNTY PROFILE


Fillmore Co.

Fillmore Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 10, which is located in the Southeast Planning Region.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS




Fillmore Co. is the 47th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 25th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Fillmore Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).









Fillmore Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Fillmore Co. welcomed net international in-migration gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

Compared to the state, Fillmore Co. has a smaller percentage of foreign-born residents. From 2013 to 2023, Fillmore Co. saw an increase in the number of foreign-born residents, which was faster than the statewide increase.



According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Fillmore Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Fillmore Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Fillmore Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.8%, Fillmore Co. had a identical unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Fillmore Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.4% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Fillmore Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Fillmore Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Fillmore Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Southeast returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Fillmore Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Fillmore Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.





INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Fillmore Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Fillmore Co. had the 29th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Fillmore Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.01 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$19.27 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

Fillmore Co. had a lower median house value than the state, having the 51st highest value of the 87 counties in 2022. Fillmore Co.'s housing stock was older than the state's, with a lower percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$24.26 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 10 than the state. Overall, Region 10 had the 2nd highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$51.51) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.57) (see Table 11).




ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after losing jobs over the past year, Fillmore Co. had the 49th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Fillmore Co. was the 65th fastest growing in the past year and the 21st fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Fillmore Co. grew despite the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


