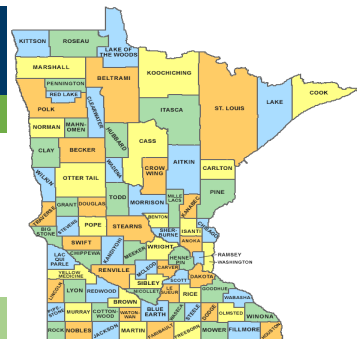


## Rice Co.

Rice Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 10, which is located in the Southeast Planning Region.

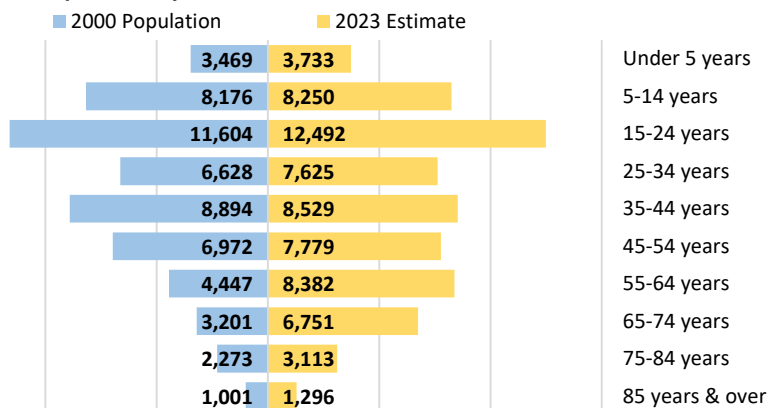
Rice Co. is the 15th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 28th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Rice Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Rice Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Rice Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

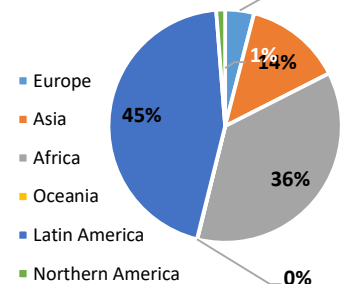

**Figure 3. Population by Race, 2023**

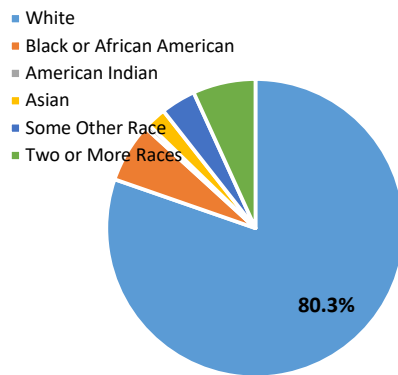

## POPULATION PROJECTIONS

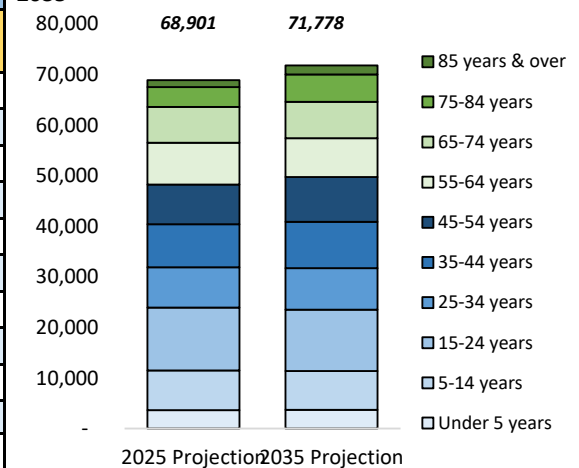
According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Rice Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

## EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Rice Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Rice Co. also has a lower percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

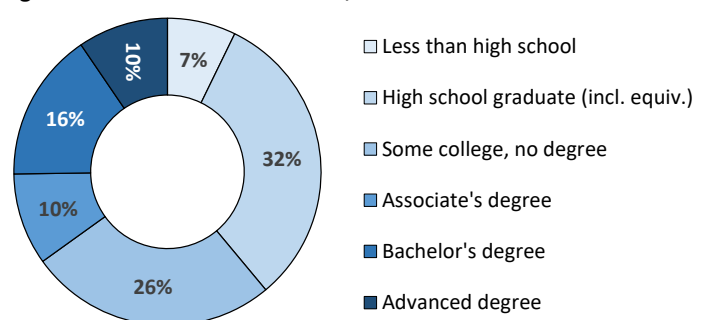

**Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2023**



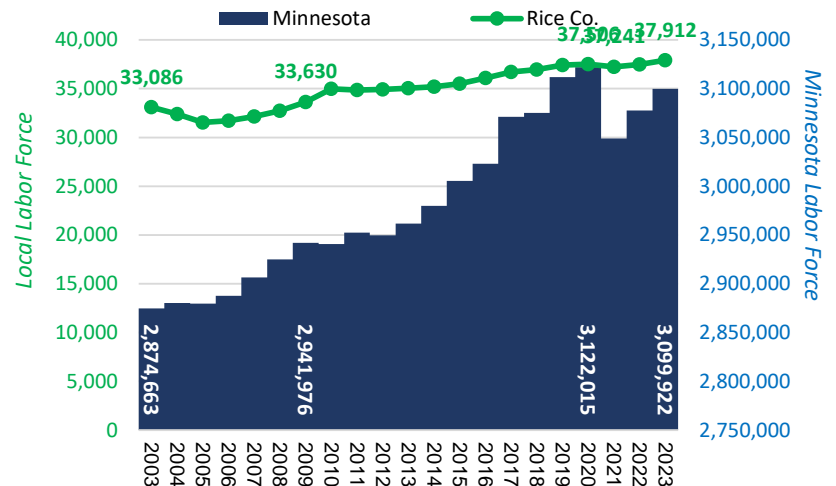

# LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.6%, Rice Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Rice Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.1% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Rice Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates



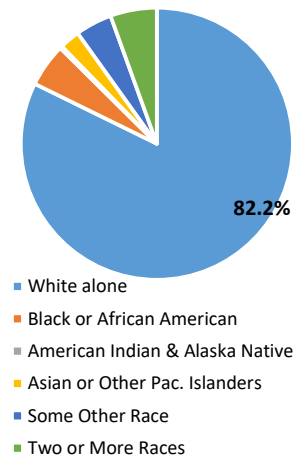
## LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Rice Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Rice Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2023

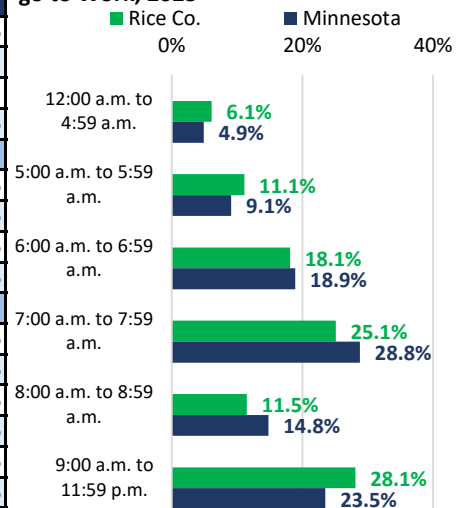

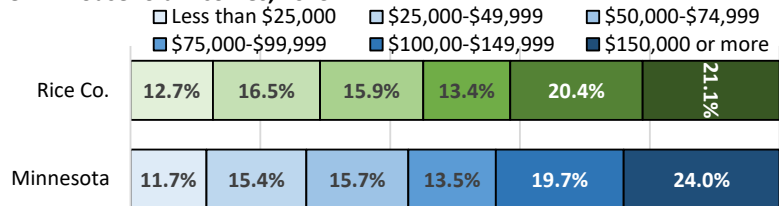
## INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Rice Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$15.37 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$20.59 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

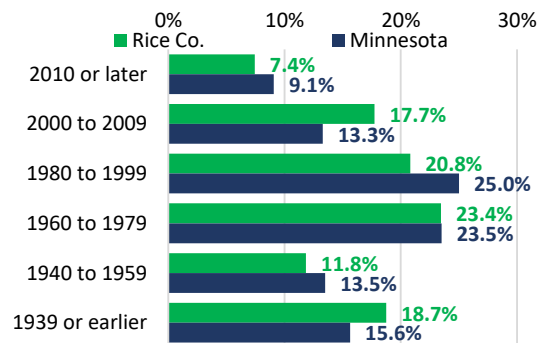

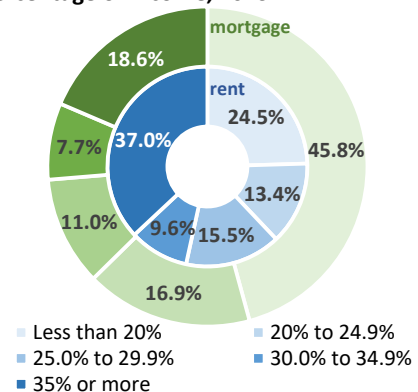
Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2023

OCCUPATIONS

At \$24.26 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 10 than the state. Overall, Region 10 had the 2nd highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$51.51) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.57) (see Table 11).

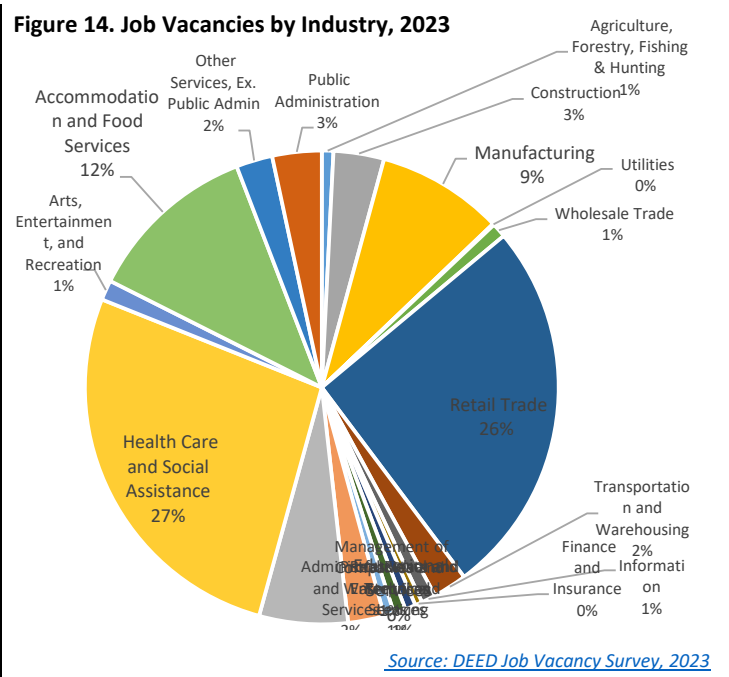

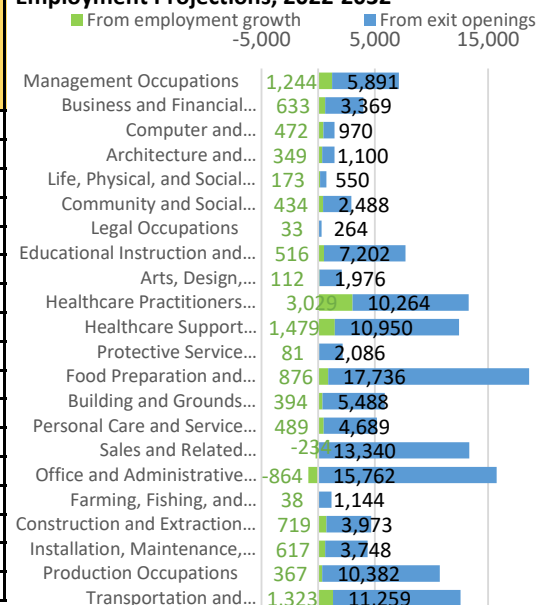

## ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Rice Co. had the 15th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Rice Co. was the 29th fastest growing in the past year and the 38th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Rice Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023

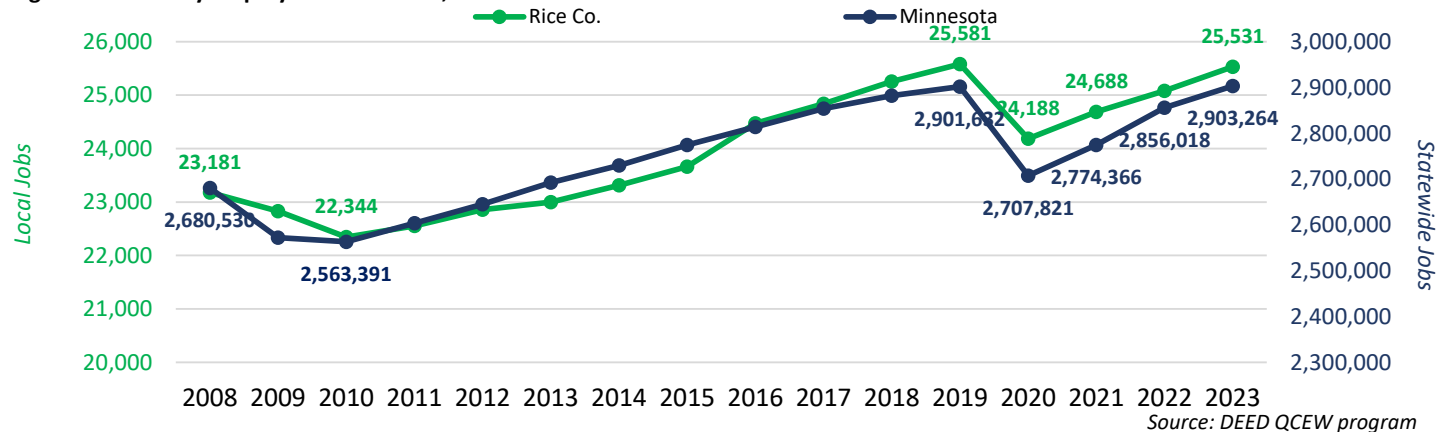
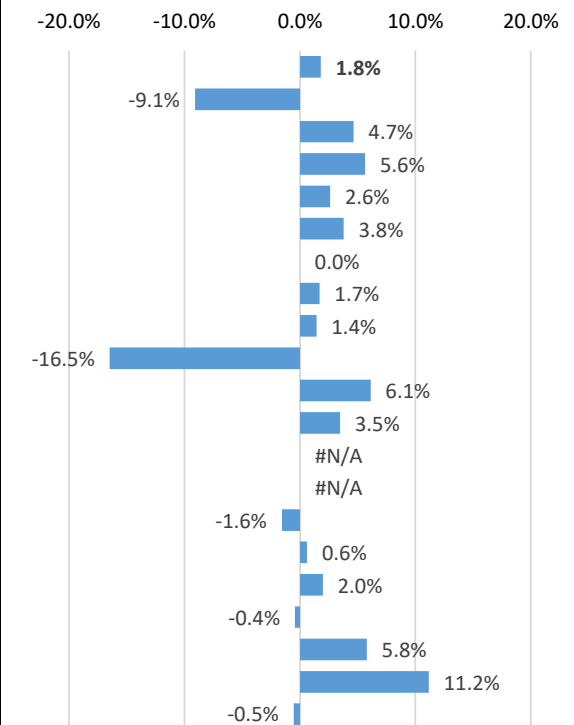
