



Anoka Co. is the 4th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 15th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2024. Anoka Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Anoka Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2024, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Anoka Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2023



POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Anoka Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.7%, Anoka Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2024. After the pandemic recession Anoka Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.1% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Anoka Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Anoka Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Anoka Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2024, job vacancies in Twin Cities returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).


LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

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

Figure 10. Time Leaving Home to go to Work, 2023



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Anoka Co. had a higher median household income than the state, and a lower percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Anoka Co. had the 7th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Anoka Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$19.33 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$24.61 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$28.48 in 2024, wages were higher in Region 11 than the state. Overall, Region 11 had the highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$63.62) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$16.93) (see Table 11).



Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2005-2024




Figure 17. Change in Jobs, 2023-2024 Number of Average Percent of Table 15. Anoka Co. Industry Employment Establish-Number of Annual -60.0% -40.0% -20.0% 0.0% Wage ments Jobs **Total Jobs** Statistics, 2024 **Total, All Industries** 8.841 133,140 100.0% \$65,222 Agriculture, Forestry, Fish & Hunt #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A Mining #N/A Construction 1.188 9.414 7.1% \$85.894 -0.5% Manufacturing 595 22,671 17.0% \$91,412 -1.9% 5 489 0.4% Utilities \$28,414 Wholesale Trade 453 7.065 5.3% \$102,493 -3.4% Retail Trade 883 16,003 12.0% \$37,226 -2.5% Transportation & Warehousing 300 5,487 4.1% \$15,417 Information 87 537 0.4% \$73,557 1.4% Finance & Insurance 334 1,831 \$90,305 -7.2% Real Estate & Rental & Leasing 364 1,352 1.0% \$52,648 -4.5% **Professional & Technical Services** 673 4,468 3.4% \$90,780 Management of Companies 42 670 0.5% \$83,816 -41.9% Admin. Support & Waste Mgmt. Svcs. 448 6,823 5.1% \$48,754 203 8.2% **Educational Services** 10,862 \$63,729 Health Care & Social Assistance 1,508 21,168 15.9% \$64,097 Arts, Entertainment, & Recreation 152 2,958 2.2% \$34,532 8.2% Accommodation & Food Services 558 10,907 \$24,255 947 4,389 3.3% \$44,629 Other Services -5.7% **Public Administration** 63 5,501 4.1% \$69,482
