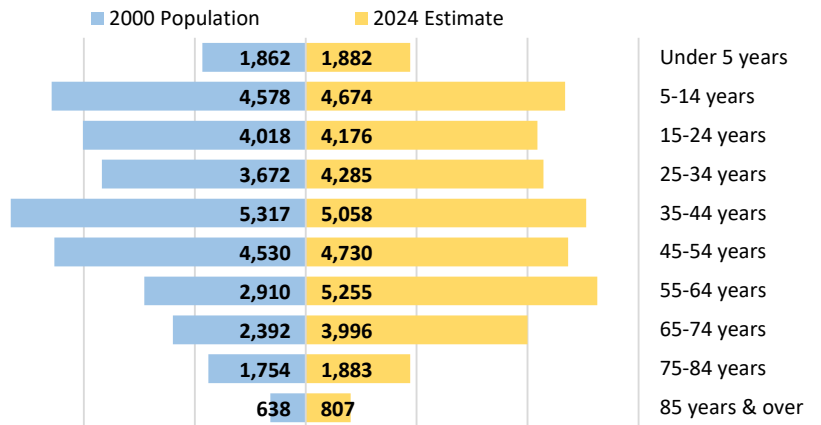
Carlton Co. is the 30th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 33rd fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2024. Carlton Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Carlton Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2024, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Carlton Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

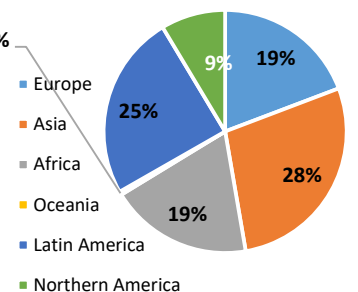

Figure 3. Population by Race, 2023

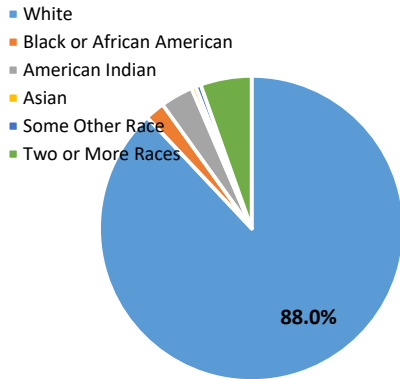

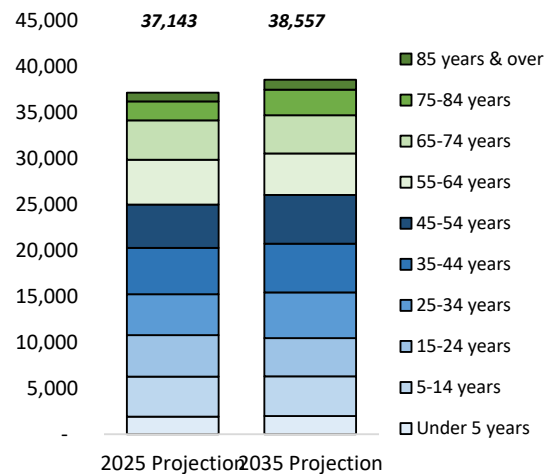
POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Carlton Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Figure 4. Projections by Age Group, 2025-2035

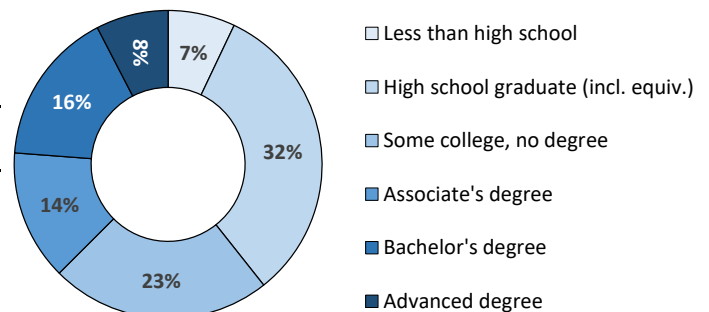


EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Carlton Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Carlton Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2023



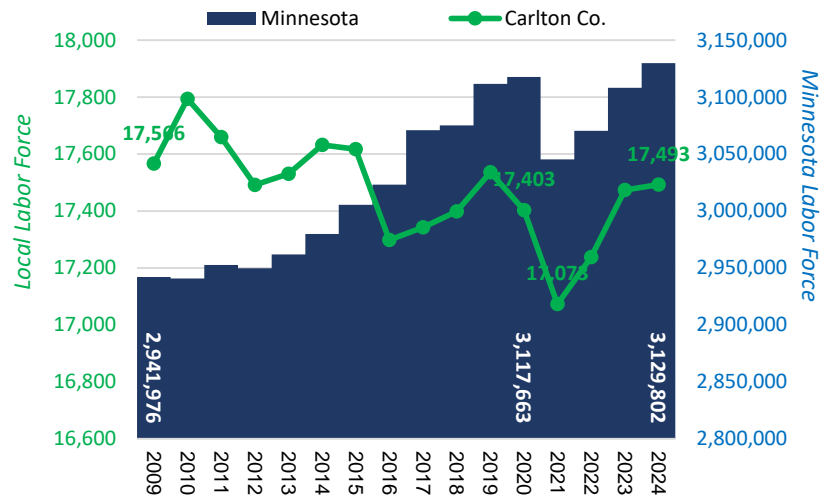

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.7%, Carlton Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2024. After the pandemic recession Carlton Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 4.6% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Carlton Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

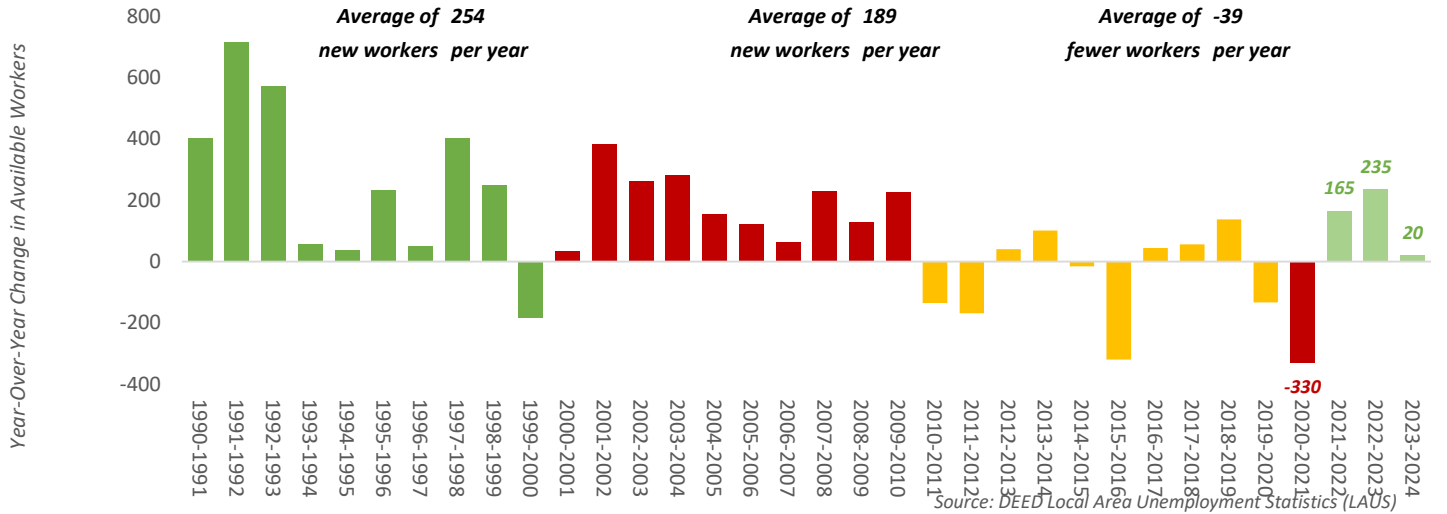
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Carlton Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Carlton Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

Figure 7. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2024



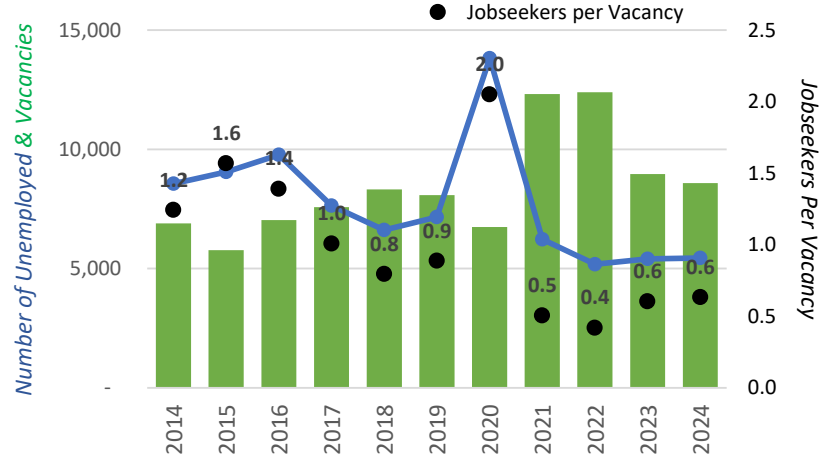

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2024, job vacancies in Northeast returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

Figure 8. Jobseekers Per Vacancy, 2014-2024



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Carlton Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Carlton Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

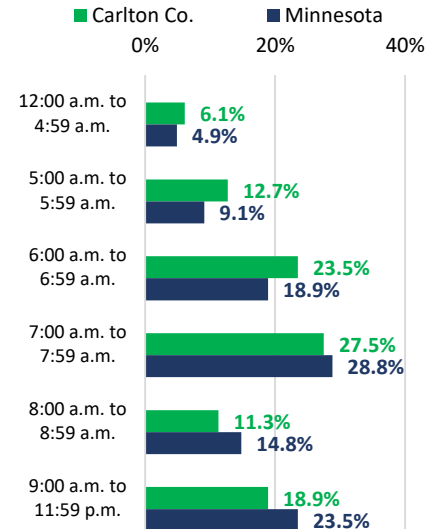

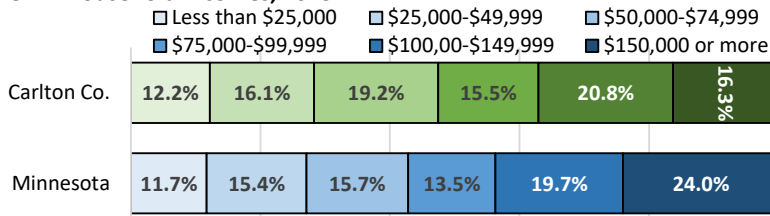
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Carlton Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$15.07 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$19.52 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

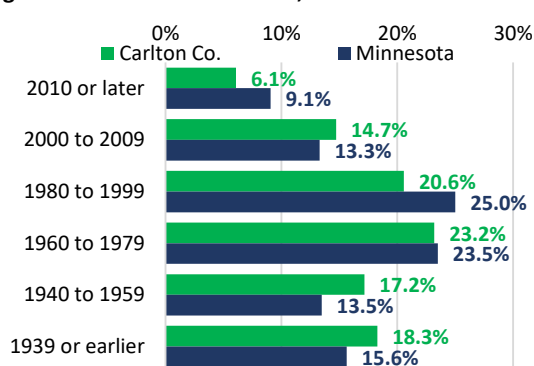

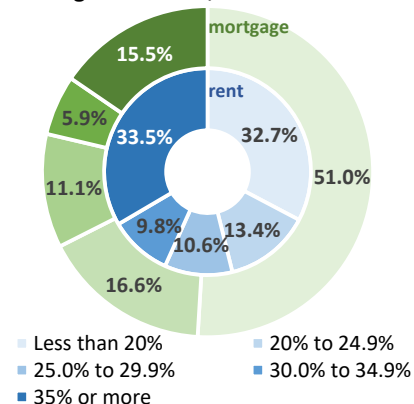

OCCUPATIONS

At \$23.47 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 3 than the state. Overall, Region 3 had the 7th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$46.38) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.56) (see Table 11).

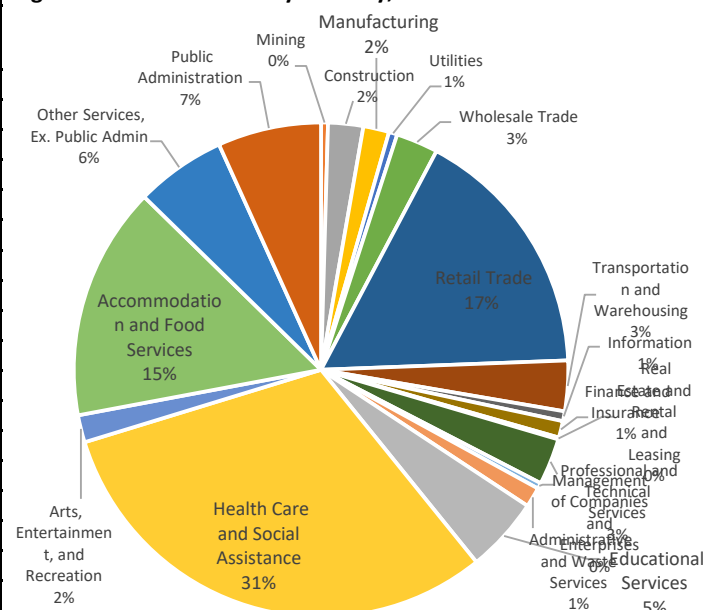
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

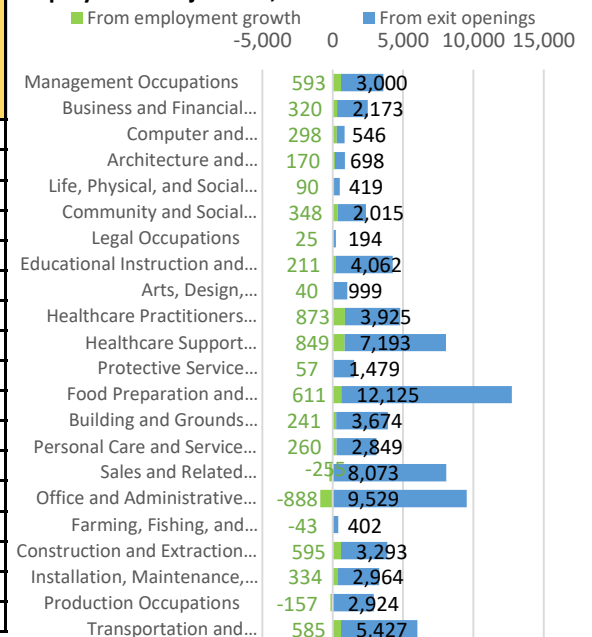

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Carlton Co. had the 32nd largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Carlton Co. was the 15th fastest growing in the past year and the 26th fastest growing since 2020. From 2020 to 2024, employment in Carlton Co. has grown since the pandemic recession.

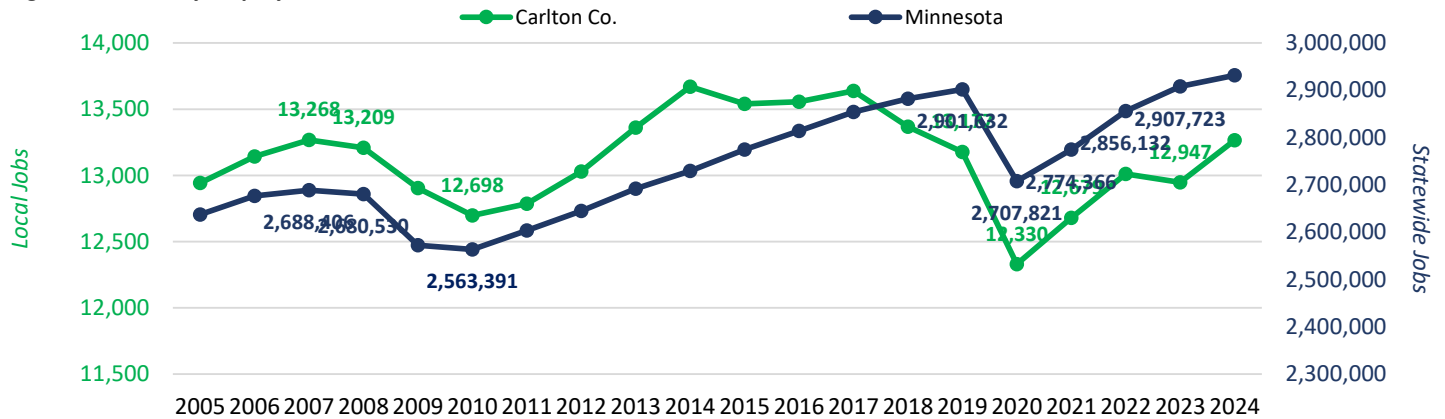

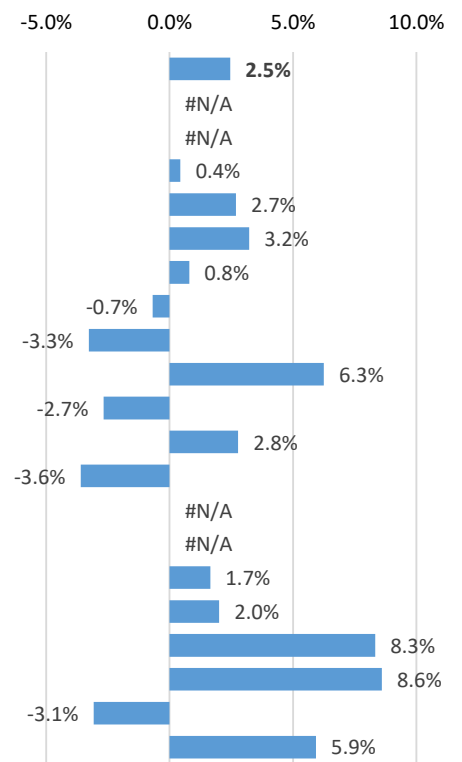
Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2005-2024
