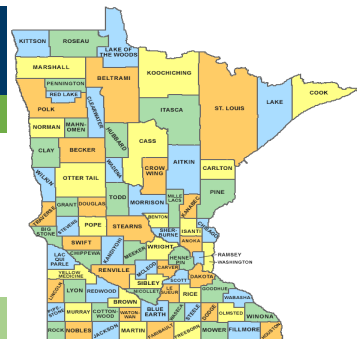


Hennepin Co.

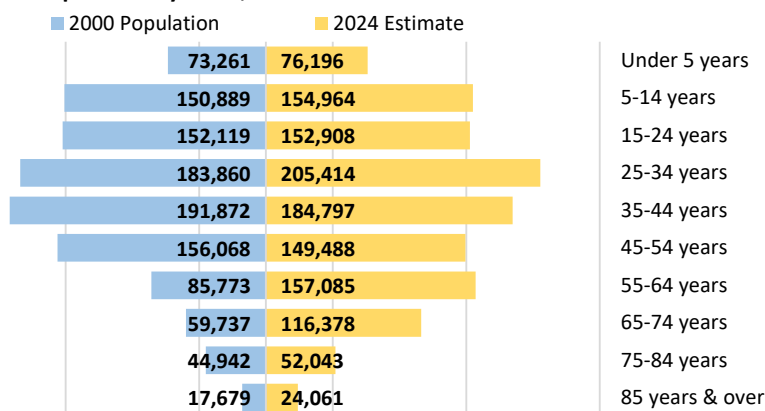
Hennepin Co. is the 1st largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 56th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2024. Hennepin Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Hennepin Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2024, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Hennepin Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

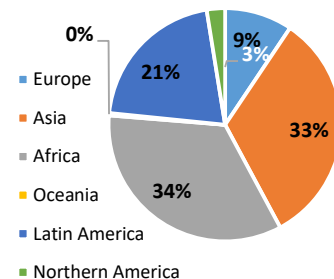

Figure 3. Population by Race, 2023

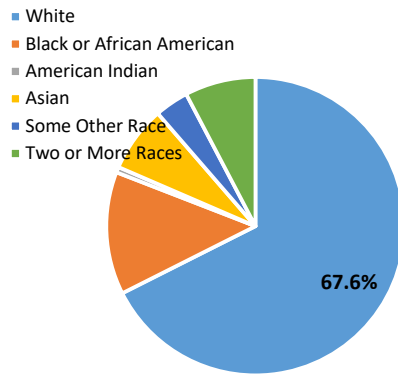

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

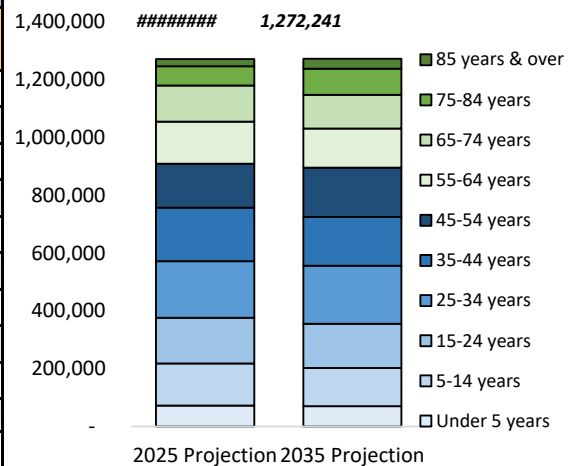
According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Hennepin Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Hennepin Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a higher percentage of people with at least some college experience. Hennepin Co. also has a lower percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a higher percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

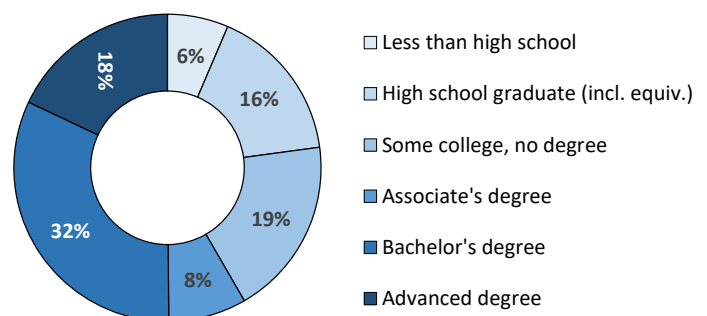

At 2.5%, Hennepin Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2024. After the pandemic recession Hennepin Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 2.8% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Hennepin Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2024, job vacancies in Twin Cities returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

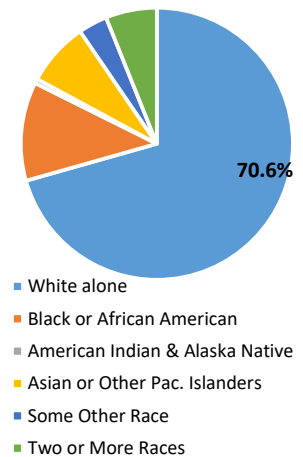
LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Hennepin Co. had a higher labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Hennepin Co. is more racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2023

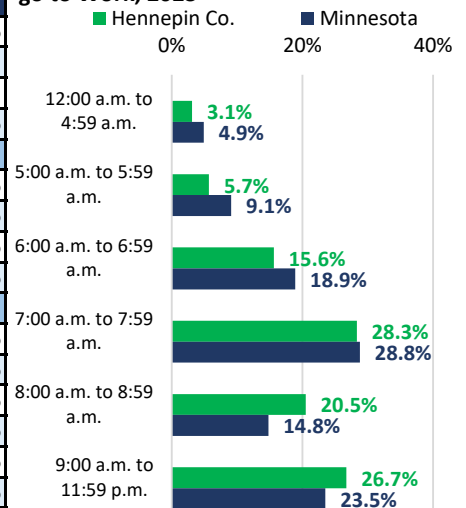

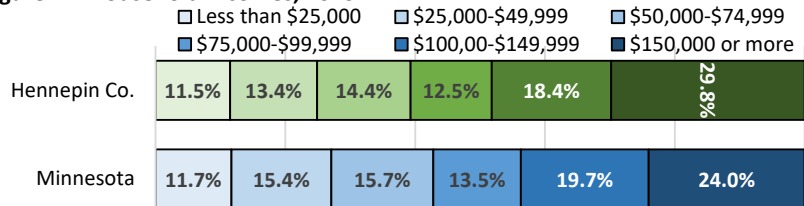
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Hennepin Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$19.11 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$24.23 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

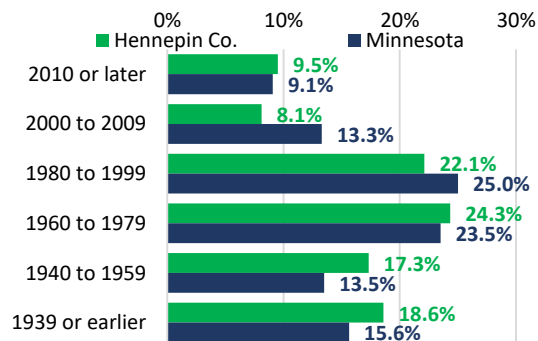

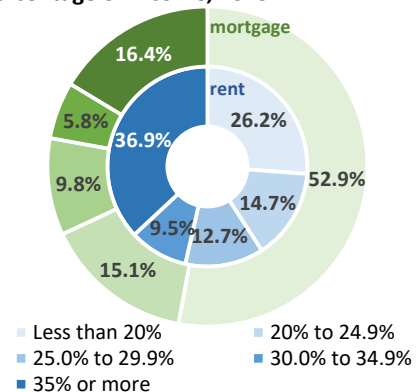
Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2023

OCCUPATIONS

At \$28.48 in 2024, wages were higher in Region 11 than the state. Overall, Region 11 had the highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$63.62) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$16.93) (see Table 11).

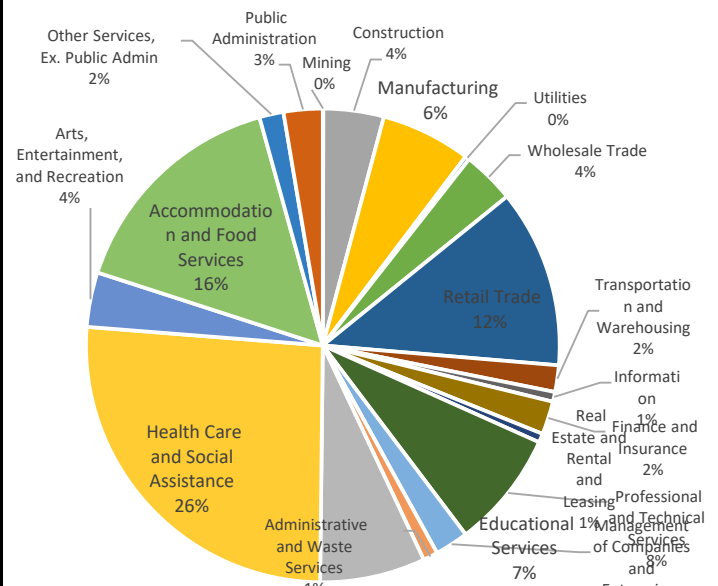
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

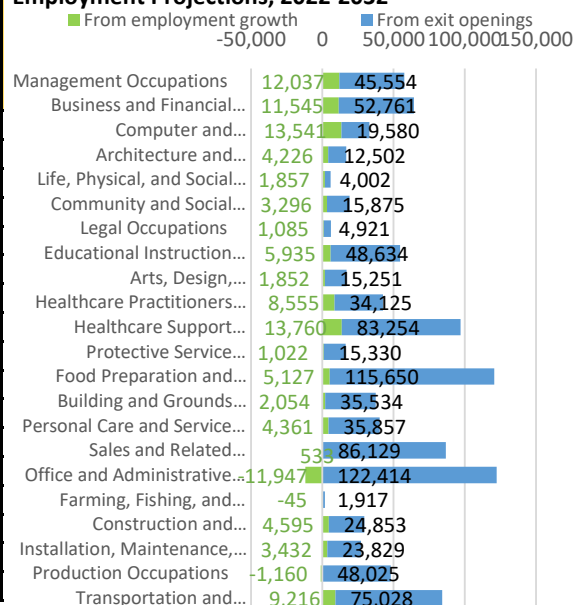

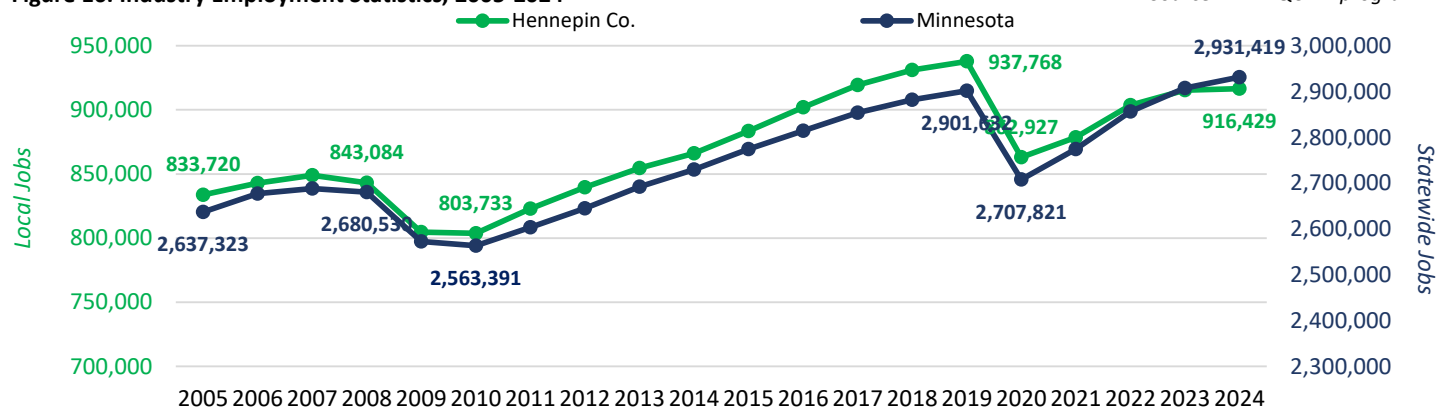
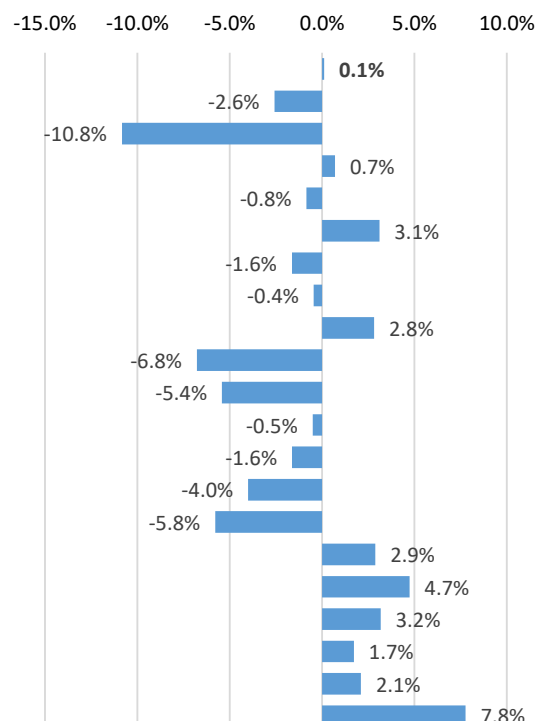
