



Kanabec Co. is the 52nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 14th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2024. Kanabec Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Kanabec Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2024, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Kanabec Co.did not see international in-migration (see Table 2).




Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2023

### POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Kanabec Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

# **EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**

Kanabec Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Kanabec Co. also has a lower percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

# LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 5.6%, Kanabec Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2024. After the pandemic recession Kanabec Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 6.6% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Kanabec Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Kanabec Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Kanabec Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2024, job vacancies in Central returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).




# **LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS**

Kanabec Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Kanabec Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.




Figure 10. Time Leaving Home to go to Work, 2023

# **INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING**

Kanabec Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Kanabec Co. had the 40th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Kanabec Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$16.35 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$21.96 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

# **OCCUPATIONS**

At \$23.51 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 7E than the state. Overall, Region 7E had the 5th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$49.04) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$16.3) (see Table 11).




Figure 17. Change in Jobs, 2023-2024 Number of Average Establish-Percent of Table 15. Kanabec Co. Industry Number of Annual -40.0% -20.0% 0.0% 20.0% ments Jobs **Total Jobs** Wage **Employment Statistics, 2024 Total, All Industries** 363 4.211 100.0% \$51,785 2.8% Agriculture, Forestry, Fish & Hunt #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A Mining #N/A Construction 53 348 8.3% \$85.002 7.1% Manufacturing 23 481 11.4% \$48,979 7.8% #N/A #N/A Utilities #N/A #N/A #N/A Wholesale Trade 9 48 1.1% \$54.633 14.3% Retail Trade 46 538 12.8% \$34,059 -2.2% Transportation & Warehousing #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A Information 5 38 0.9% \$37,464 2.7% 15 108 Finance & Insurance 2.6% \$75,371 -16.3% Real Estate & Rental & Leasing 8 10 0.2% \$43,778 -33.3% 14 48 **Professional & Technical Services** 1.1% \$21,857 -7.7% Management of Companies #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A #N/A Admin. Support & Waste Mgmt. Svcs. 16 79 1.9% \$47,106 -16.0% 406 9.6% **Educational Services** 4 \$48,356 -0.2% 58 Health Care & Social Assistance 1,130 26.8% \$63,652 10.8% Arts, Entertainment, & Recreation 7 1.4% \$18,305 10.9% 61 25 270 6.4% Accommodation & Food Services \$19,180 -8.5% Other Services 36 199 4.7% \$41,187 1.5% **Public Administration** 21 363 8.6% \$49,482 4.3%
