
COUNTY PROFILE

Otter Tail Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 4, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.


POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS



Otter Tail Co. is the 17th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 34th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2024. Otter Tail Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Otter Tail Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2024, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Otter Tail Co. welcomed net international in-migration gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).




Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2023



POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Otter Tail Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (3.7%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Otter Tail Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Otter Tail Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.4%, Otter Tail Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2024. After the pandemic recession Otter Tail Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 4.4% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Otter Tail Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Otter Tail Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Otter Tail Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2024, job vacancies in Northwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Otter Tail Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Otter Tail Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 80.0% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



A larger percentage of workers in Otter Tail Co. worked in the same county in which they live compared to the state. Otter Tail Co. also had a shorter average commute time than the state.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Otter Tail Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Otter Tail Co. had the 51st highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Otter Tail Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.22 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$18.91 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

Otter Tail Co. had a lower median house value than the state, having the 27th highest value of the 87 counties in 2022. Otter Tail Co.'s housing stock was newer than the state's, with a higher percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$23.2 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 4 than the state. Overall, Region 4 had the 8th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$47.94) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.54) (see Table 11).




Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2005-2024 Source: DEED QCEW program Otter Tail Co. Minnesota 23.500 2,931,419 3,000,000 2.901.632 23,000 2,900,000 22.500 2,800,000 2,680,530 21,831 22,000 2,700,000 22.119 21,500 2,637,323 2,600,000 21,662 21,000 21,350 2,500,000 20,500 2,400,000 20,000 2,300,000
