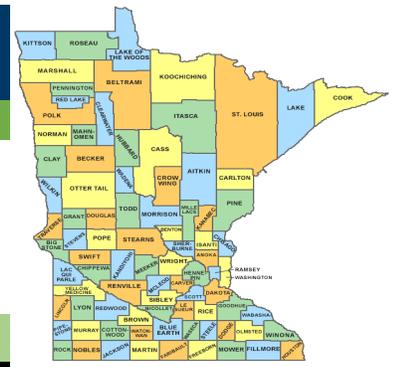


Clearwater Co.

Clearwater Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 2, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.




POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

Clearwater Co.'s population has increased so far this decade, ranking as the 33rd fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2019. It is now the 74th largest in the state. Clearwater Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Clearwater Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2010 to 2019, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Clearwater Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



- Two or More Races




POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Clearwater Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Clearwater Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.4%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Clearwater Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2018





LABOR FORCE TRENDS


Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Clearwater Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Clearwater Co.'s labor force expanded more rapidly from 2004 to 2019, compared to a statewide growth rate of 8.0% (see Figure 6).

At 8.4%, Clearwater Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2019. Clearwater Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to 8.1% in 2018, and was lower than the 14.7% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Clearwater Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Clearwater Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Clearwater Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Clearwater Co. is a part of Region 2, which includes Beltrami, Clearwater, Hubbard, Lake of the Woods, and Mahnommen County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 1.5 jobseekers per vacancy during the 4th quarter of 2019 (see Figure 8).


LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Clearwater Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Clearwater Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 85.5% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2018






INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Clearwater Co. also had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.89 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$15.85 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).





OCCUPATIONS

At \$18.57 in 2020, wages were lower in Region 2 than the state. Overall, Region 2 had the 2nd lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$41.14) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$12.03) (see Table 11).


JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Clearwater Co. is a part of Region 2, which includes Beltrami, Clearwater, Hubbard, Lake of the Woods, and Mahnommen County. There were 1392 job vacancies posted by employers in the 4th Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After losing jobs over the past year, Clearwater Co. had the 75th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Clearwater Co. was the 60th fastest growing in the past year and the 59th fastest growing since 2014. From 2014 to 2019, employers in Clearwater Co. added jobs, but lagged the state's 6.3% growth rate.




