


COUNTY PROFILE

Crow Wing Co.

Crow Wing Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 5, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS


Crow Wing Co.'s population has increased so far this decade, ranking as the 27th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2019. It is now the 15th largest in the state. Crow Wing Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Crow Wing Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2010 to 2019, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Crow Wing Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).






POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Crow Wing Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Crow Wing Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.4%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Crow Wing Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2018





LABOR FORCE TRENDS


Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Crow Wing Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Crow Wing Co.'s labor force expanded more slowly from 2004 to 2019, compared to a statewide growth rate of 8.0% (see Figure 6).

At 4.3%, Crow Wing Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2019. Crow Wing Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to 3.9% in 2018, and was lower than the 9.6% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Crow Wing Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Crow Wing Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Crow Wing Co. is expected to add workers from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Crow Wing Co. is a part of Region 5, which includes Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd, and Wadena County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 1.8 jobseekers per vacancy during the 4th quarter of 2019 (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Crow Wing Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Crow Wing Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 85.5% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.






INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Crow Wing Co. also had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.81 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.38 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).





OCCUPATIONS

At \$17.5 in 2020, wages were lower in Region 5 than the state. Overall, Region 5 had the lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$37.55) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$12.25) (see Table 11).


JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Crow Wing Co. is a part of Region 5, which includes Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd, and Wadena County. There were 2321 job vacancies posted by employers in the 4th Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After losing jobs over the past year, Crow Wing Co. had the 13th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Crow Wing Co. was the 49th fastest growing in the past year and the 28th fastest growing since 2014. From 2014 to 2019, employers in Crow Wing Co. added jobs, but lagged the state's 6.3% growth rate.




