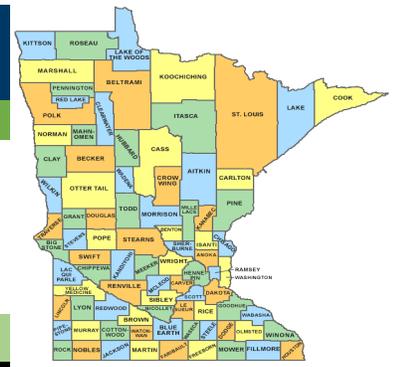


COUNTY PROFILE

Itasca Co.

Itasca Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 3, which is located in the Northeast Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS


Itasca Co.'s population has increased so far this decade, ranking as the 44th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2019. It is now the 22nd largest in the state. Itasca Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Itasca Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2010 to 2019, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Itasca Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).






POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Itasca Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Itasca Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.4%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Itasca Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2018





LABOR FORCE TRENDS


Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Itasca Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Itasca Co.'s labor force declined more slowly from 2004 to 2019, compared to a statewide growth rate of 8.0% (see Figure 6).

At 6%, Itasca Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2019. Itasca Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to 5.4% in 2018, and was lower than the 10.8% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Itasca Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Itasca Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Itasca Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Itasca Co. is a part of Region 3, which includes Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, and St. Louis County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 0.9 jobseekers per vacancy during the 4th quarter of 2019 (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Itasca Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Itasca Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 85.5% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.






INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Itasca Co. also had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.91 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.11 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).





OCCUPATIONS

At \$19.03 in 2020, wages were lower in Region 3 than the state. Overall, Region 3 had the 6th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$41.52) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$11.95) (see Table 11).


JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Itasca Co. is a part of Region 3, which includes Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, and St. Louis County. There were 8275 job vacancies posted by employers in the 4th Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).



ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After gaining jobs over the past year, Itasca Co. had the 26th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Itasca Co. was the 46th fastest growing in the past year and the 47th fastest growing since 2014. From 2014 to 2019, employers in Itasca Co. added jobs, but lagged the state's 6.3% growth rate.


Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2004-2019
