


COUNTY PROFILE

Olmsted Co.

Olmsted Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 10, which is located in the Southeast Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

Olmsted Co.'s population has increased so far this decade, ranking as the 7th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2019. It is now the 8th largest in the state. Olmsted Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).



Olmsted Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2010 to 2019, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Olmsted Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



Figure 3. Population by Race, 2018



POPULATION PROJECTIONS


According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Olmsted Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Olmsted Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.4%), and a higher percentage of people with at least some college experience. Olmsted Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a higher percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.



Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2018





LABOR FORCE TRENDS


Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Olmsted Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Olmsted Co.'s labor force expanded more rapidly from 2004 to 2019, compared to a statewide growth rate of 8.0% (see Figure 6).

At 2.6%, Olmsted Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2019. Olmsted Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to 2.3% in 2018, and was lower than the 6.1% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Olmsted Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Olmsted Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Olmsted Co. is expected to add workers from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Olmsted Co. is a part of Region 10, which includes Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Houston, Mower, Olmsted, Rice, Steele, Wabasha, and Winona County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 0.7 jobseekers per vacancy during the 4th quarter of 2019 (see Figure 8).


LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Olmsted Co. had a higher labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Olmsted Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 85.5% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2018




INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Olmsted Co. also had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.05 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$17.78 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).





OCCUPATIONS

At \$19.89 in 2020, wages were lower in Region 10 than the state. Overall, Region 10 had the 3rd highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$43.33) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$12.1) (see Table 11).


JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Olmsted Co. is a part of Region 10, which includes Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Houston, Mower, Olmsted, Rice, Steele, Wabasha, and Winona County. There were 10599 job vacancies posted by employers in the 4th Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).



ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After gaining jobs over the past year, Olmsted Co. had the 5th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Olmsted Co. was the 22nd fastest growing in the past year and the 11th fastest growing since 2014. From 2014 to 2019, employers in Olmsted Co. added jobs, outpacing the state's 6.3% growth rate.


