- 1. We are a Chamber of Commerce and currently filing as 501(c)3. I wonder if our organization is qualified for Adult Career Pathways Programs (such as Drive for 5 Initiative Job Placement Services) as many require a 501(c)6 filing status.
 - a. Drive for 5 Job Placement Services applicants must be a Chamber of Commerce or Trade Association with 501(c)6 tax filing. Please refer to <u>DEED's Competitive Grants and</u> <u>Contracts webpage</u> to explore Adult Career Pathways grant opportunities for organizations with a 501(c)3 tax filing.
- 2. I'm reviewing the State Fiscal Years (SFY) 2026 and 2027 *Drive for 5 Job Placement Services Competitive Grant* and had a quick question. Is this an unrestricted cash award, and what types of budget items do typically funded organizations include (e.g., general operating expenses, staffing, program delivery)?
 - a. Drive for 5 Job Placement Services grants are not unrestricted cash awards. Grant payments will be made on a reimbursement basis, and requests for reimbursement must reflect actual expenses incurred. Administrative costs may not exceed 10% of total expenditures.
