



Point Source Implementation Grant Program FY 2017



The Point Source Implementation Grant (PSIG) program provides grants to governmental units to assist with the cost of water infrastructure projects necessary to meet wasteload reduction requirements under Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) implementation plans, to reduce the discharge of phosphorus, to meet other water quality-based effluent limits, and to meet a total nitrogen limit of one milligram per liter or less for a land based treatment system. The PSIG program provides grants for 50% of eligible costs up to a maximum of \$3,000,000. Projects must be listed on the MPCA's Project Priority List (PPL) and eligible as-bid costs must be certified by the MPCA prior to grant award.

PSIG applicants are listed below in priority order based on MPCA's 2017 PPL, starting first with projects that applied in FY 2016 followed by FY 2017 applications (received in July 2016). Shaded rows indicate FY 2017 grants awarded to date. To be eligible to receive a PSIG grant in FY 2017, applicants must submit as-bid construction costs and receive MPCA certification by June 30, 2017.

As of July 1, 2016, \$35.5 million was available from 2016 and prior appropriations for FY 2017 PSIG grant awards. This amount is sufficient to fund all 2016 certified projects but only some of the new FY 2017 applications. The dashed line indicates the fundable range if all 2017 applicants proceed with their projects and receive MPCA certification by June 30, 2017. If higher ranked projects do not proceed the fundable range will be adjusted and PSIG funds will be available to lower ranked projects in priority order.

In 2016 Governor Dayton proposed changes to the PSIG grant program and recommended additional funding appropriations through bonding. Those changes and additional funding have not been approved and are not reflected in the estimated grant amounts below.
