



Mike Wong started his BEP business with 4 locations. “I started with BEP in 2018 and trained for four months at St. Paul College with Mary Armstrong,” says Mike. He later took over his own locations at the MN Department of Health, MN Department of Revenue, St. Paul City Hall, and the Federal Courthouse. Over the years, his business has grown. He currently has 11 locations.

It’s a fact . . .

Today, thousands of qualified, legally blind Americans are proof that this program works. Currently, over 1,300 self-employed men and women operate businesses under the Randolph-Sheppard program across the country. These businesses account for almost \$600 million in annual sales and provide entrepreneurs with an average income of \$84,000. Businesses also employ hundreds of individuals, many with a disability.

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The Minnesota Business Enterprises Program

Who we are

The Business Enterprises Program (BEP) provides profitable vending business opportunities for Minnesotans to broaden their economic opportunities.

The BEP provides the following to the self-employed business owners:

- Initial and ongoing training
- Management services
- Certification
- Technical support

The BEP licensed vendors operate vending businesses at:

- State properties and offices including the State Capitol
- Rest areas
- Minnesota State College and University campuses
- Department of Corrections facilities
- Federal sites, including U.S. Postal Service and General Services Administration locations

The BEP administers this program under the authority of the **federal Randolph-Sheppard Act**. The Act and **Minnesota Statute 248.07, Subdivision 7**.



How the program works

Individuals interested in the BEP work with an SSB vocational rehabilitation counselor. The operators must complete a comprehensive evaluation and extensive training to be certified to operate a BEP vending business. The individuals must complete a comprehensive evaluation and extensive training to become a licensed, certified BEP operators.

BEP operators are responsible for the day-to-day management of the vending business and meeting all financial and legal obligations associated with anyone who operates a small business.

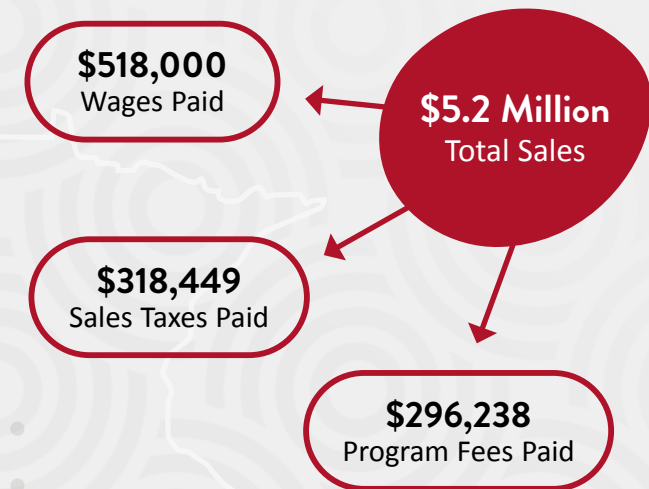


BEP By the Numbers - 2024
