Professional Statement of Need draft

The professional statement of need must be completed by a qualified professional.

Qualified professionals include the following.

- (a) For ~~persons with~~ physical illness, injury, or incapacity, a "qualified professional" ~~is~~ means a licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse practitioner, physical therapist, occupational therapist, or licensed chiropractor, according to their scope of practice.
- (b) For ~~developmental disability, learning disability, and intelligence testing,~~ a "qualified professional" ~~means~~ means a licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, licensed independent clinical social worker, licensed psychologist, certified school psychologist, or certified psychometrist working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist For ~~persons with developmental disabilities~~ a "qualified professional" is a mental health professional, licensed school psychologist, a physician, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or certified psychometrist working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist.
- (c) For ~~persons with learning disabilities,~~ a "qualified professional" ~~means~~ means a licensed psychologist or school psychologist with ~~experience determining learning disabilities.~~
- (c) For ~~persons with~~ mental health ~~illness,~~ a "qualified professional" means a licensed physician, advanced practice registered nurse or a mental health professional, as defined in Attachments 3.1-A/B, item 6.d.A.
- (d) For persons with substance use disorder, a "qualified professional" ~~means~~ means a licensed physician, a qualified mental health professional, as defined in Attachments 3.1-A/B, item 6.d.A, or a alcohol and drug personnel as defined in Attachment 3.1-A/B, item 13.d ~~is the treatment director of a facility licensed to provide substance use disorder treatment A treatment director must have at least one year of work experience in direct service to an individual with substance use disorder, or one year of work experience in the management or administration of direct service to an individual with substance use disorder; and have a baccalaureate degree, or three years of work experience in administration or personnel supervision in human services.~~

Coordinated Entry Assessment
