Training must be retaken no later than the day before the anniversary of the LH license effective date. On the years when not receiving in person training, training through video of no more than 1 hr. in length and developed or approved by the commissioner is allowed.	KCF VII.B
		<b>Abusive Head Trauma (AHT)</b> -before caring for infants and every 2 yrs. thereafter. Training must be retaken no later than the day before the anniversary of the LH license effective date. On the years when not receiving in person training, training through video of no more than 1 hr. in length and developed or approved by the commissioner is allowed.	KCF VII.B
		<b>Child Passenger Restraint Systems (C.A.R.S.)</b> -5 yrs. Before providing transportation for children under the age of 8, the person placing children in passenger restraints must have completed the training.	KCF VII.B
