2 8. 988 Lifeline System & Minnesota Crisis Centers

1. National Crisis System

988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline
 24/7 free and confidential support for people in distress; essential for all providers to know and promote.

2. Statewide Navigation & Support (Minnesota)

3. Minnesota's 988 Lifeline Centers
