High-risk service providers: Complete your revalidation application

What is the Minnesota Revalidate 2026 provider revalidation effort?

Minnesota Revalidate 2026 is an urgent statewide Medicaid provider revalidation effort designed to prevent the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid from withholding \$2 billion from Minnesota's Medicaid program by May 31, 2026. **It requires providers who deliver high-risk services to successfully complete revalidation.**

How was I notified?

- Notices were sent to registered **MN-ITS account in the PRVLTR folder** and via USPS for providers who have not registered a MN-ITS account. Most notices were sent by Jan. 26 and Feb. 26, followed by **calls**.
- Sixty (60) days after the notice date, we began sending **termination notices** and **disenrolling non-responsive providers on April 6**.

What do I need to do?

- You must submit your **completed revalidation application now**, to ensure no disruption to providing and billing services for Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) members.
- You must **respond to any notices requesting additional information about your application**. We cannot process your application until we have received all required information.
- **Complete your application and submit required documentation** using the Minnesota Provider Screening and Enrollment portal (MPSE).

What if I do not complete my revalidation application?

- You will be **terminated**. You have **60 days** from the date of the termination letter to **appeal**.
- You will **not be able to bill or receive payment once terminated**. A payment suspension will be removed once an appeal has been received and all required documentation has been submitted.
- You can continue to provide services through the appeal process. Disruptions in your service area may occur.
