General summary

Serenity House is an apartment building located in a small residential neighborhood a block away from “Eat Street” in Minneapolis, which has a population of over 422,000. There is a park, an art museum, a grocery store, a church, and many restaurants within a block of the setting. There are also local shops and small art studios also nearby. Serenity House serves 21 people and is co-located with three other apartment settings operated by Supported Living Solutions: Whittier Place (2405 1st Avenue South, Minneapolis, MN 55404), Harmony House (109 24th Street, Minneapolis, MN 55404), and Friendship House (2401 1st Avenue South, Minneapolis, MN 55404).

Customized living provider standards/qualifications

Licensure requirements and other state regulations for customized living services clearly distinguish these services/settings from institutional licensure or regulations.

Customized living services are provided in housing with services establishments with the service provider directly licensed as a comprehensive home care provider by the Minnesota Department of Health. Customized living services provide an individualized package of

regularly scheduled health-related and supportive services provided to a person who resides in a qualified, registered housing with services establishment.

Customized living service definitions that support the setting requirements

Customized living (CL) and 24-hour CL services include component services designed to meet the person's assessed needs and goals. Individualized CL services may include supervision, home care aide tasks (e.g., assistance with activities of daily living), home health aide task (e.g., delegated nursing tasks), home management tasks, meal preparation and service, socialization, assisting enrollees with arranging meetings and appointments, assisting with money management, assisting participants with scheduling medical and social services, and arranging for or providing transportation. If socialization is provided, it must be part of the service plan, related to established goals and outcomes and not diversional or recreational in nature.

People may independently choose to participate in the activities of their setting or with their neighbors in the collocated settings. Due to the historical structure of the collocated settings, there is one industrial kitchen. People are able to store food in their rooms. People can choose to eat meals in the dining area, other common areas, or their rooms.</p>

The administrator reported that “part time staff may rotate on different days” while most staff are full time and a few float staff. All float staff are cross trained</p> <p>The staff interviewed reported that staff are scheduled to work with people at co-located settings on the same shift on a weekly basis. Staff who work at multiple settings are cross-trained on each person’s person-centered service plan. Staff training is required prior to working at a collocated setting. Supportive Living Solutions cross training policy also requires staff to review observation notes and updates at the beginning of each shift.</p>

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Met <input type="checkbox"/> Unmet <input type="checkbox"/> Not applicable	<p>Participants in the setting in question do not have to rely primarily on transportation or other services provided by the other co-located setting (s), to the exclusion of other options</p> <p>The administrator and staff interviewed reported the setting has a van which is only used for group activities people choose to attend. Other transportation options include public transportation, taxi/Uber, community volunteer drivers, family transport, medical transport, and Metro Mobility. The administrator and staff reported the setting has never had an issue with limited transportation due to its geographic location. Staff are available to ride the bus with people if requested to assist people in learning and using transportation options. Staff will also assist people in determining the bus routes and schedules to participate in community activities.</p>

Community engagement opportunities and experiences

The administrator reported multiple strategies to identify and coordinate activities and community opportunities based upon people's preferences and interests. When a person first moves in, people are asked about their preferred activities and interest which are incorporated into future activity calendars and community plans. Thereafter, people share their ideas for community activities through a Resident Council Meeting, one-to-one conversations with staff, surveys, and participating in the "Let's Talk About It" activity. There is a community activity director who creates newsletters, fliers, and calendars of community events. The community activity director also tracks people's feedback, attendance, and reasons for cancelled events to improve the experience of activities and community outings coordinated for people.

Each collocated setting maintains separate activities and community calendars. People from any collocated setting are welcomed to participate in any activity of their choice. Calendars are posted in common areas and shared with each person. The calendars are updated on a routine basis with input from people. Activities options available to people are not limited to the posted calendar. Staff will assist people to make their ideas happen or find options based on individual interests, including assisting with transportation needs, facilitating reservations or pre-booking, and assisting with research. The administrator reported that people are encouraged to go on activities but that they can choose not to, and different activities can be provided if there is available staff. Staff reported that many people go out weekly on their own and that some people will go more often or daily

People are alerted of activities through emails, fliers, calendars, and direct interaction with staff. People can ask for specific activities and give feedback on planned activities. People interviewed like to go out in the community but report that they can stay at the setting if they choose not to go. One person reported going out two times a week, which is as much as they would like to go out. The other person interviewed reported going out three times a week. This person would like to go out more but their "finances dictate how much they can participate in community events." People can choose who they want in their groups for group activities.

Activities include guided meditation, walking group, art club, bingo Pumpkin carving contests, and movies. Community activities coordinated by Supportive Living Solutions or people have individually selected to attend include:

Supportive Living Solutions also offers an in-person meeting between prospective roommates and the opportunity for each person to give input on their choice of a roommate. A person may request to change roommates or rooms at any time. During this request, Supportive Living Solutions will work with the person to identify a plan to accommodate the request.</p>	Compliant

A person may request in advance to have meals when they are away during primary meal times. Staff will prep prepare a bag lunch for the person to take, or to save the meal for the person eat later.</p>	Compliant



The observer reported that common areas are always open to visitors. Late night visitors are requested to respect other residents, and when applicable, a person’s roommate. When a person has a roommate, people sharing a room can ask the other person’s guest to leave past a certain time.</p> <p>One person reported that they can have visitors at any time. Overnight visitors are allowed. When a person shares a room, roommates are requested to establish a shared agreement to respect each person’s privacy and preferences.</p>	Compliant

Staff interviewed reported that the setting helps provide a flexible schedule to accommodate a person’s work schedule which includes saving food for people to eat when they get home and pack people’s medications for the work day.</p> <p>The administrator reported that the setting helps the person get ready for work and provides a flexible schedule to accommodate a person’s work schedule, identify transportation options, and pre-packaging any medication needed. The administrator also reported staff help people job search and monthly explore employment related goals.</p>	Compliant


