What Is Electronic Visit Verification (EVV)?

- EVV is an electronic system used to verify service delivery
- EVV confirms when and where services are provided
- EVV supports services delivered in homes and community settings
- EVV does not create a barrier to where services can be provided.
- Services can be provided:
 - At the person's home
 - In the community

Why EVV Is Required

- Required by the 21st Century Cures Act
- Federal requirement implemented by Minnesota
- Applies to certain personal care and home health services
- Supports accountability while allowing service flexibility
- Ensure people are receiving services as planned and authorized.
- Improve the accountability of caregiver services.

What Data Must EVV Verify

- Type of service performed
- Individual receiving the service
- Date of the service
- Location of service delivery
- Individual providing the service
- Time the service begins and ends

When EVV Applies

- EVV is required for certain:
 - Personal care services
 - Waiver services
 - Home health services
- Not all services in these categories require EVV.
- Providers are responsible for knowing whether EVV applies to the services they provide.

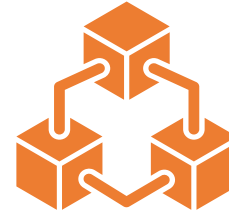
EVV in Minnesota: The Open Model

- Minnesota uses an open EVV model which means providers choose the EVV system that works for their organization
- DHS selected HHAeXchange as the EVV system and data aggregator
 - All EVV data flows through HHAeXchange to DHS
- EVV systems and devices must meet DHS requirements
- DHS EVV policy requirements apply regardless of system choice

EVV System Options



- The state-selected EVV system available at no cost.
- Providers may need to spend time and resources to implement EVV and to meet compliance.



Third-Party EVV Vendor

- Providers are responsible for the costs of third-party system.
- Providers can obtain or continue to use a third-party EVV system.
- Third-party system must connect to the state's HHAeXchange data aggregator and meets state requirements.

How EVV Is Verified

- EVV visits are verified using approved electronic methods.
- Verification may include:
 - Mobile devices
 - Telephony
 - Other DHS-approved methods
- Device and method requirements are defined in EVV policy

Live-In Caregivers Exception

- Live-in caregivers are not exempt from EVV but have an exception
- Real-time EVV verification is not required
- Enter the required EVV data at least once per day
- Providers may require real-time EVV use
- Additional details and live-in caregiver requirements review the EVV Live-in Caregiver policy

Safe at Home: Provider Awareness

- Safe at Home protects address confidentiality
- Participants in the program can be either a person receiving services, a caregiver, or both.
- Telephony is the only method allowed for verification
- The Safe at Home PO Box is used for EVV location data
- Providers must follow Safe at Home EVV requirements when applicable

For all services delivered, regardless of location, the Safe at Home PO Box will be used for the location.

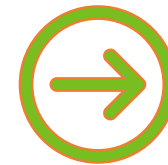
EVV Compliance

- DHS monitors EVV compliance regularly
- Providers receive a monthly compliance report from HHAX
- Compliance expectations apply after enrollment with DHS is complete
- Providers are expected to enroll with HHAeXchange, regardless of system and payer, after they receive their confirmed NPI or UMPI from DHS
- Compliance details are addressed through separate guidance and training

Next Steps After DHS Enrollment



Step 1:

Choose EVV system

HHAX portal setup,

Submit EVV data

Note: API means Application Programming Interface. HHAeXchange uses this term when working with third-party systems.

Provider Enrollment Form

Information You Need to Complete this Form:

- **Company information:** company name, address and phone number
- **Contact information:** administrator and technical person contact information (name, email address and phone number)
- **Agency identification:** tax ID and NPI(s) or UMPI(s)
- **Electronic visit verification (EVV) system:** Third-party EVV vendor name and vendor point of contact information
- **Census:** approximate number of members your agency services today
- **Caregivers:** number of caregivers employed by your agency
- **Office Staff:** number of office staff employed by your agency (non-caregiver staff)

Note:

- If your agency will be submitting EVV visits under more than one NPI or UMPI, ensure you are providing each NPI or UMPI on the Enrollment Form.
- If your agency has multiple tax IDs, complete a separate enrollment form for each with the associated NPI/UMPI(s).

EVV System Training

- HHAX system users will have access to the HHAX Learning Management System (LMS) and guides in their Provider Portal.
- Third-party system users will have access to HHAX LMS to assist with integration and to review the data being sent to the state
- Third-party system users need to work with their vendor to ensure they have proper training in their system.
- Providers are responsible to train caregivers and members to ensure they feel comfortable with the providers chosen EVV system.
