

## State Opioid Response supplemental grant

In July 2019, the federal government has awarded Minnesota a State Opioid Response supplemental grant of \$4.26 million.

This includes \$775 thousand in additional funding for Naloxone and support for ongoing work in prevention, clinician training and public awareness. Plus, grants will be provided for culturally responsive American Indian, African American and African-born opioid use disorder treatment programming, as well as other new initiatives, and a request for proposals has been issued.

Grants run through Sept 29, 2020.
