



Chapter 2955/2965 Advisory Committee 4-8-2024 Meeting Notes

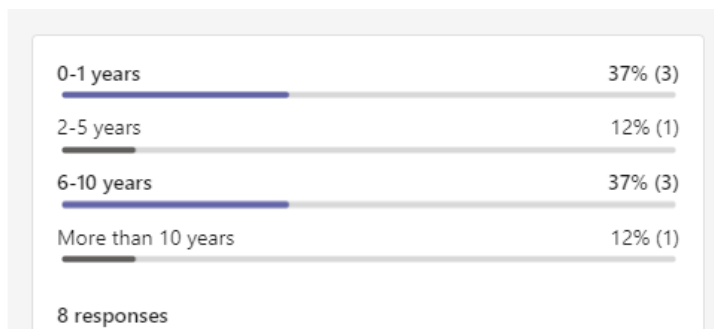
Meeting began around 9:00 a.m. central time

1. PowerPoint presentation (Ian Lewenstein).

- Poll conducted on committee experience with 2955 and 2965.

Question: How long have you worked with these rules?

Results:



- Expected conduct of advisory committee; rulemaking 101; current rule draft; number of DOC-licensed treatment programs.

2. Introductions.

- Inspection and Enforcement Unit
- Advisory Committee
- Other members of the public

3. Discussion.

- **Inspecting and licensing.** Whether to move the rule away from a clinical rule to a technical rule (current rule is more of a clinical assessment); auditing versus what needs to be in the rule.
- **Historical context behind rule.** Tried to draft the rule so that it wasn't subjective to auditors and it was clear what was expected. Best practices vs. minimum requirements—current rule is more of a clinical assessment instead of technical.



- **Combining rules.** Combine juvenile rule and adult rule?
 - Committee agreed with combining both rules and writing specific language for juveniles and adults; committee was comfortable with the draft and operating with one rule, but we must be mindful of juveniles and how they are different from adults.
 - Will continue with a combined draft but defer final decision.
- **SONAR.** Not started, but it is eventually needed for rulemaking process.
- **Comments on rule draft.** Don't need to start over on the draft; should review before finalizing:
 - Technical corrections to improve language; using first-person language; ensuring rule definitions are accurately defined and used in the rule; additional language concerns on using *sex offender*.
 - Examples of technical audit vs. clinical audit—discuss the intent and how to audit/measure areas; evaluate what has changed since rules were adopted; update obsolete language.
 - Example of dated information—psychophysiological section doesn't apply to juveniles anymore.
 - Clarify what entities that the rule applies to; it was intended for residential programs, not outpatient programs; there are also juveniles in out-of-state programs.
 - Updating or adding requirements on treatment dosage hours.

4. Next steps.

- Have the committee focus on 10-20 pages from the rule draft before the next meeting and then discuss possible revisions.
- DOC will internally discuss next steps and timeline for future meetings.
