RULE COMPLIANCE DETAILS

Chapter 2960 - Mandatory Rules Not In Compliance

1. 2960.0050 RESIDENT RIGHTS AND BASIC SERVICES. Subpart 3.A.. Basic rights information.

The license holder must meet the requirements of this subpart. The license holder must give the resident a written copy of the resident's basic rights information and explain to the resident in a language that the resident can understand, if the resident is incapable of understanding the written basic rights documents, information about the resident's rights related to the resident's care in the licensed facility within 24 hours of admission.

Inspection Findings:

The resident basic rights are not currently included in the resident handbook. The rights are not posted in the resident area or the staff work station.

Corrective Actions:

Update the resident handbook to include all of the resident basic rights. Post the basic resident rights in the resident day area, classroom and the staff work station.

2. 2960.0710 RESTRICTIVE PROCEDURES CERTIFICATION. Subpart 11. Review of patterns of use of restrictive procedures.

At least quarterly, the license holder must review the patterns of the use of restrictive procedures. The review must be done by the license holder or the facility's advisory committee. The review must consider: A. any patterns or problems indicated by similarities in the time of day, day of the week, duration of the use of a procedure, individuals involved, or other factors associated with the use of restrictive procedures; B. any injuries resulting from the use of restrictive procedures; C. actions needed to correct deficiencies in the program's implementation of restrictive procedures; D. an assessment of opportunities missed to avoid the use of restrictive procedures; and E. proposed actions to be taken to minimize the use of physical holding and seclusion.

Inspection Findings:

The quarterly reviews are not being created or reviewed as required by this rule part. This is a 6 bed facility with a low number of restrictive procedures used. However, this is a requirement of the restrictive procedure certification and must be adhered to.

Corrective Actions:

Create a tracking process for all restrictive procedures used at the facility (physical escort, mechanical restraints and disciplinary room time- DRT). Review the tracked information on a quarterly basis. Have quarterly reviews available for inspection by DOC.

INSPECTION COMMENTS

The Carver County Temporary Holdover Facility inspection was completed on October 21, 2021, using Minnesota Rules, Chapter 2960, governing juvenile residential facilities. Sections of 2960 that are applicable to your facility included: Administrative Standards, Secure, Corrections, Detention and Restrictive Procedures certifications. Inspection results are contained in this report.

This inspection visit consisted of a tour of the Temporary Holdover Facility, including the intake area, resident rooms, bathrooms, living area and classroom. It also included a walkthrough of the jail gym and kitchen area.

The inspection also included discussions/interviews with administration and staff members. There was a review of resident files, a review of camera footage and overnight well-being checks, a review of logs and other pertinent documentation. There was also a review of the facility policy and procedure manual and resident handbook.

The following comments and concerns are a result of the inspection. While these may not be specific rule violations, these are areas that provided constructive feedback to help address potential facility issues.

Comments:

1. The facility response to COVID-19 follows CDC guidelines and includes masks for residents and staff, and an area for all entering to sanitize hands prior to entry into the facility. The accommodations for quarantined youth (either positive or pending test results) are good.

2. Camera and log review of the well-being checks looked good.

The inspection went well. Maintaining normal operations during COVID-19 mitigation efforts have been challenging for all facilities and the Carver County Temporary Holdover Facility is commended on their efforts in this area. Positive discussions with staff provided a great deal of information.
