DOC Family Supports Unit

The DOC's Family Supports Unit (FSU) is dedicated to reducing the impact of incarceration by strengthening family connections. We provide guidance, resources, and access to supportive services, and we collaborate with outside partners to bring parenting education into correctional facilities.

- The FSU can: **Child Support Navigation**: Our **Child Support Liaison** serves as a bridge between incarcerated people and county child support offices, helping to remove barriers during incarceration and to ensure a sustainable plan is put in place upon release.
- **Community Resource Navigation**: Our **Community Resources Navigator** bridges gaps between individuals and community-based providers to ensure people have the tools and connections they need for a stable and successful reentry. Examples of these services include access to spiritual and cultural resources, food and basic needs assistance, and transitional housing support.
- **Facility Navigation Services**: The **Facility Navigator** serves as a key point of contact for incarcerated individuals and their families, helping them understand and navigate policies, procedures, and concerns. This role ensures families stay informed and supported throughout the incarceration period.
- **Parenting and Childbirth**: Our Parenting Coordinator supports those who are pregnant in preparing for childbirth and helps mothers maintain their parental role while incarcerated. This includes assistance with child protection matters, connecting mothers to a variety of resources, and collaborating with community partners to provide parenting education. The coordinator is also co-facilitator of the Healthy Start Program, a conditional release program created by statute for eligible pregnant and postpartum incarcerated women.

Incarcerated individuals can contact facility navigators by using the DOC mailing.

The DOC **Family Support Unit** collaborates with DOC facility staff to host the Family and Friends of Incarcerated Group. help strengthen support systems for incarcerated individuals and their loved ones.

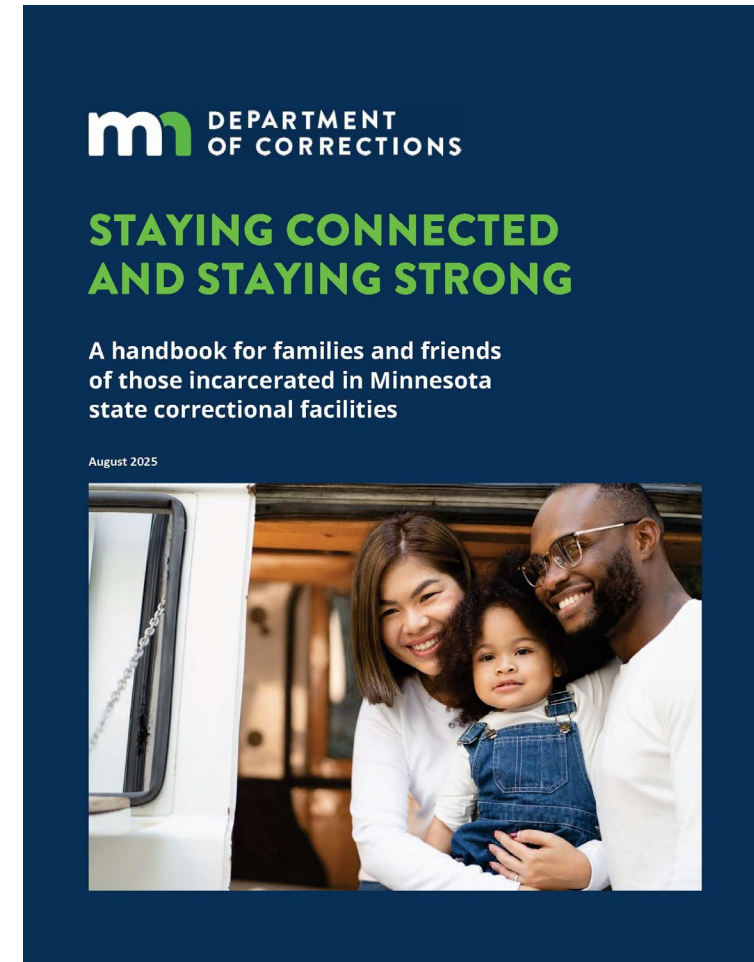

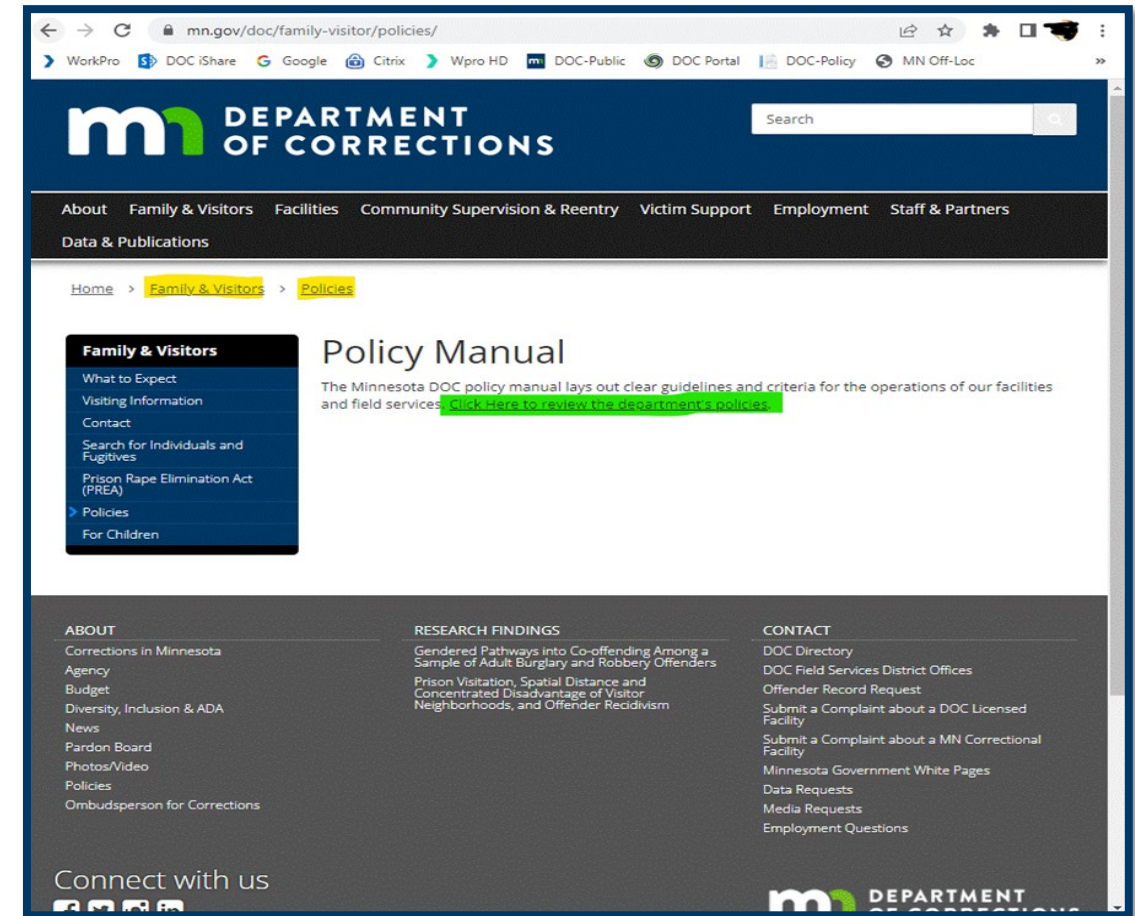

DOC Policies and Procedures

Resource for understanding:

- Rules and requirements of those incarcerated.
- What is expected of your loved one while incarcerated.
- Specific information for loved ones regarding every aspect of incarcerated life and DOC management of those incarcerated.



Visiting for Family and Friends

Important to know the rules and what to expect prior to your visit for the incarcerated person and for you as the visitor. <https://mn.gov/doc/family-visitor/visiting-information/>

- **Apply:** Must be approved on someone's visiting list.
 - A criminal history check will be completed (having a history does not automatically mean you're not approved).
 - All applications are completed online and processed at MCF-Rush City, regardless of where housed.
 - Your loved one will get a notice when you are approved. The incarcerated person will need to inform you when you're approved. Staff cannot confirm that over the phone.
- Visitation Policy: [320.010 Visiting](#)
- Important to be aware that different rules apply if someone is in restrictive housing.

Visiting Rules and Regulations

Items not allowed during visits

- Prohibited items lock in locker or your vehicle
- Cell phones/cameras/video cameras
- If staff suspect you are under the Influence of drugs/alcohol you will be asked to leave, and your visit will be denied.

Searches

- All visitors must submit to a security check such as a metal detector, hand-held wand, and/or pat search
- All clothing must pass metal detection to be admitted (includes under-wire bras)
- Clothing types, clothing length, clothing styles, etc., are limited for security purposes. Conservative dress that is not revealing is required. See [Statewide Visiting Guidelines](#)
- Failure to comply will result in denial of visit

Case Managers and Release of Information (ROI)

Case Managers - All incarcerated persons are appointed an onsite case manager who:

- Are a first line of contact for loved ones; however, cannot share private or confidential information. Find case manager at: <https://coms.doc.state.mn.us/PublicViewer/>
- Are the liaison between various departmental processes and the incarcerated person.

Release of Information (ROI):

- In appropriate situations, an ROI can be signed which allows the DOC to share some information with a family member regarding the incarcerated individual. This request must be initiated by the incarcerated individual.

Internal Processes

- **Chain of Command:** Every facility has a chain of command that incarcerated individuals must follow for any questions or needs that arise.
- **Grievances:** Each facility also has a grievance process whereby incarcerated individuals can file a grievance with the facility or the DOC if they do not agree with a decision that affects them (discipline, programming requirements, etc.)
- **Self-advocacy:** It is critical that incarcerated individuals be able to advocate for themselves when it comes to their needs. Encourage your loved ones to follow these internal processes, as opposed to your incarcerated loved one asking you to call the facility on their behalf. It's more effective and more efficient. Additionally, it is required if they later wish to pursue legal action.
