



Notification of Custody Status and Release

Haven is a secure and confidential notification system that allows victims and community members to receive updates and share input about individuals who are incarcerated or under community supervision.

Registrant notifications include:

- Facility transfers
- Custody Reduction
- 60-day Notice of Release
- Final release
- Early Release Programs (MRRA, Work Release, Challenge Incarceration Program)
- Supervised Release Agent Assignment
- Supervision Custody Status Changes
- Expiration of Supervised Release
- Offender Escape & Apprehension

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Supervision Abatement

Minnesota Department of Corrections



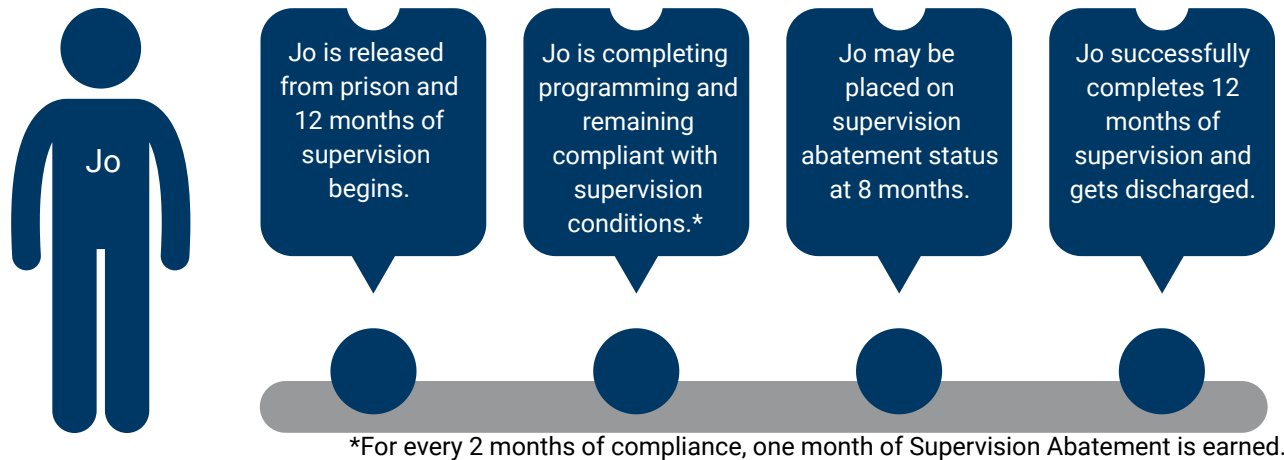
The Minnesota Rehabilitation and Reinvestment Act provides a pathway for individuals on community supervision to earn compliance credit toward supervision abatement status as they demonstrate progress and accountability. Supervision Abatement is an inactive form of supervision in which an individual remains under supervision with conditions of release, but is not required to report to a supervising agent.

To earn credits toward Supervision Abatement, individuals must be in compliance with their conditions and making progress on goals in their case plan. Upon release from prison, individuals must have at least one year to serve on supervision to be eligible to work toward Supervision Abatement. Time on active supervision may be reduced by one-third for those who earn all credits possible. Meaning they would serve two-thirds of their supervision term on active supervision and the remaining one-third on Supervision Abatement.

Prior to placing an individual on supervision abatement status, the supervising agent will conduct a comprehensive review of the individual's progress, taking into account overall performance during the supervision period and any factors related to public safety. In addition, the agent may solicit input from the victim(s) and other relevant stakeholders to consider those perspectives before a final decision is made.

An individual placed on supervision abatement status must continue to comply with conditions of release. If it is determined that the individual has violated the terms of supervision, the individual may be returned to active supervision or their supervision revoked.

Below is an example of the Supervision Abatement timeline.



12 Months Supervision Timeline

Jo was sentenced to serve his criminal sentence with the Minnesota Department of Corrections and has completed the incarceration portion of that sentence. Jo has 12 months remaining, which will be served on community supervision. If Jo remains compliant with supervision expectations and successfully completes required programming, Jo may become eligible for Supervision Abatement at eight months and remain in that status for the final four months, provided Jo continues to meet conditions of release.

MN Crime Victim Resources
