



Notification of Custody Status and Release

Haven is a secure and confidential notification system that allows victims and community members to receive updates and share input about individuals who are incarcerated or under community supervision.

Registrant notifications include:

- Facility transfers
- Custody Reduction
- 60-day Notice of Release
- Final release
- Early Release Programs (MRRA, Work Release, Challenge Incarceration Program)
- Supervised Release Agent Assignment
- Supervision Custody Status Changes
- Expiration of Supervised Release
- Offender Escape & Apprehension

What is the Minnesota Rehabilitation & Reinvestment Act?

The Minnesota Rehabilitation & Reinvestment Act (MRRRA) provides individuals sentenced to the Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC) an opportunity to earn early release. To understand how this works, it's important to note that Minnesota is a determinate sentencing state, meaning individuals have a set sentence and automatically serve two-thirds of their sentence in prison and the remaining one-third on community supervision. MRRRA allows individuals to reduce their time in prison through meaningful involvement in programming, consistent engagement in activities that support their rehabilitation, and demonstration of growth and change. An individual could earn up to an additional 17% off of their in prison time.

Individuals serving a life sentence or indeterminate sentence are not eligible for MRRRA. Eligibility criteria are established by the MRRRA statute and the DOC.

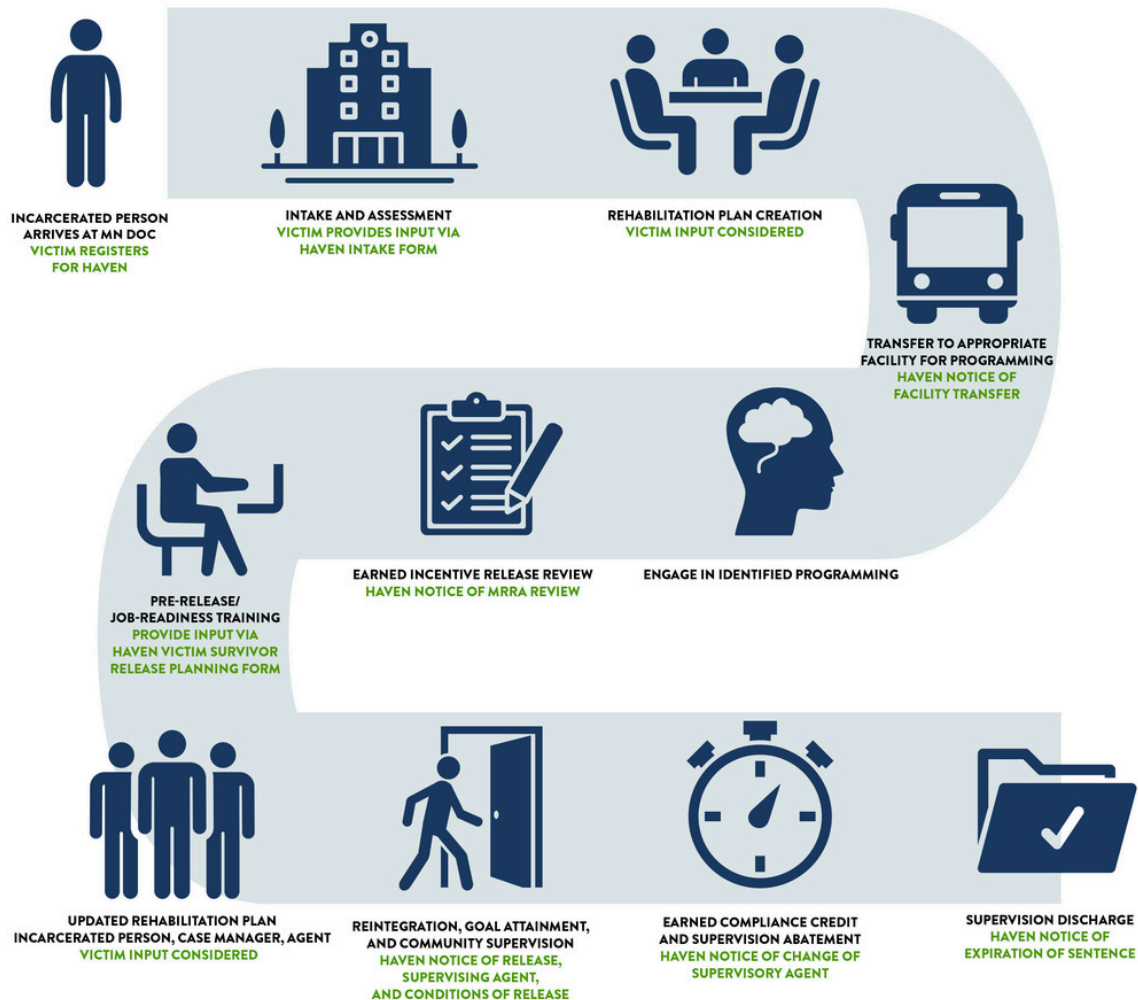


How are victims included in this process?

Victims have the right to provide input at multiple points throughout the process to ensure their voice remains an important part of decision-making. This input may include safety concerns, information about the ongoing impact of the crime, and any concerns related to release.

To stay informed and receive custody updates, victims are encouraged to register for Haven, the DOC's victim notification system. Registration may occur at any time during the incarcerated individual's incarceration, however, delaying registration may reduce opportunities to provide input.

MRRRA Road Map: Victim Engagement - The MRRRA process is designed to keep victims informed and involved at meaningful points throughout an individual's incarceration and transition back into the community. From the moment an individual enters the Minnesota Department of Corrections, victims registered with Haven are offered opportunities to stay informed, share what feels important to them for the individual's rehabilitation plan, and communicate what they believe the incarcerated person needs to focus on during supervision.
