Five (45%) received a mitigated dispositional departure, zero were sentenced to prison but received a mitigated durational departure, and six (55%%) received neither a mitigated dispositional nor durational departure.

In 2024, 28 cases were sentenced statewide for 1st Degree Controlled Substance Crime, § 152.021, subd. 3(c) Sale of 100+ g or 50+ Dosage Units. Three (11%) of these cases were subsequent offenses per § 152.021, subd. 3(b) and the other 25 (89%) were non-subsequent. Of non-subsequent offense cases, 14 (56%) received a mitigated dispositional departure, three (12%) were sentenced to prison but received a mitigated durational departure, and eight (32%) did not receive a mitigated dispositional or durational departure. Of subsequent offense cases, zero received a mitigated dispositional departure, one (33.3%) was sentenced to prison but received a mitigated durational departure, and two (66.6%) did not receive a mitigated dispositional or durational departure.

Two (4%) of these cases were subsequent offenses per § 152.021, subd. 3(b) while the other 47 (96%) were non-subsequent offenses. Of non-subsequent offense cases, 23 (49%) received a mitigated dispositional departure, seven (15%) were sentenced to prison but received a mitigated durational departure, and 17 (36%) did not receive a mitigated dispositional or durational departure. Of subsequent offense cases, zero received a mitigated dispositional departure, one (50%) was sentenced to prison but received a mitigated durational departure, and one (50%) did not receive a mitigated dispositional or durational departure.
